Smith-Summers Field Dedication

Lloyd Ray Smith served as head of the Orange Grove Recreation Department in 1968. Smith helped to build the programs of Orange Grove Center's Special Olympics and Area 4 Special Olympics. He later became the Area 4 Special Olympics Director, and is credited with overseeing the expansion of Special Olympics.

Jerry Summers, an experienced trial attorney has helped to fund the growth of Special Olympics locally; his support has led to the rapid growth of the Special Olympics Unified Sports program; which brings together athletes with and without intellectual differences to compete. Summers serves on the boards of Area 4 Special Olympics, and Orange Grove Center.
