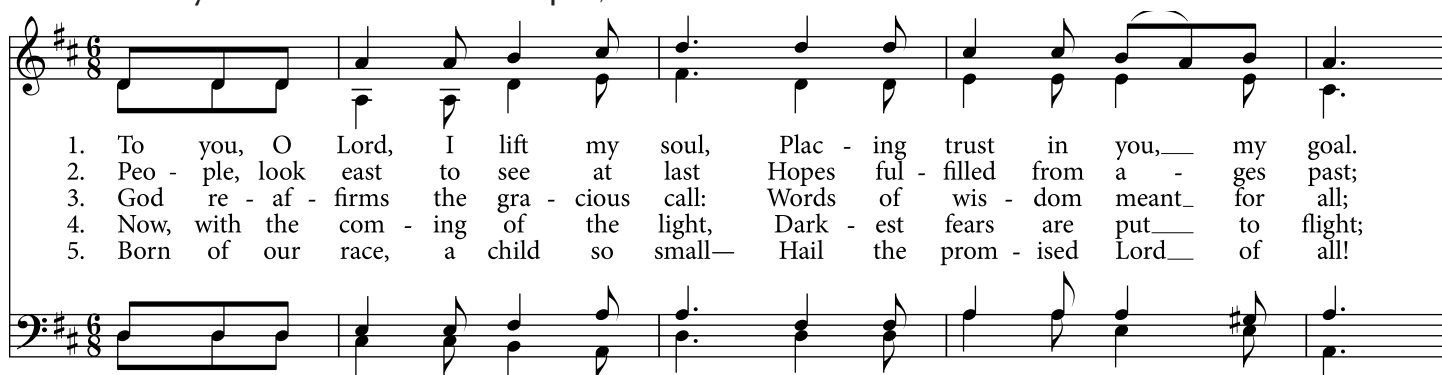

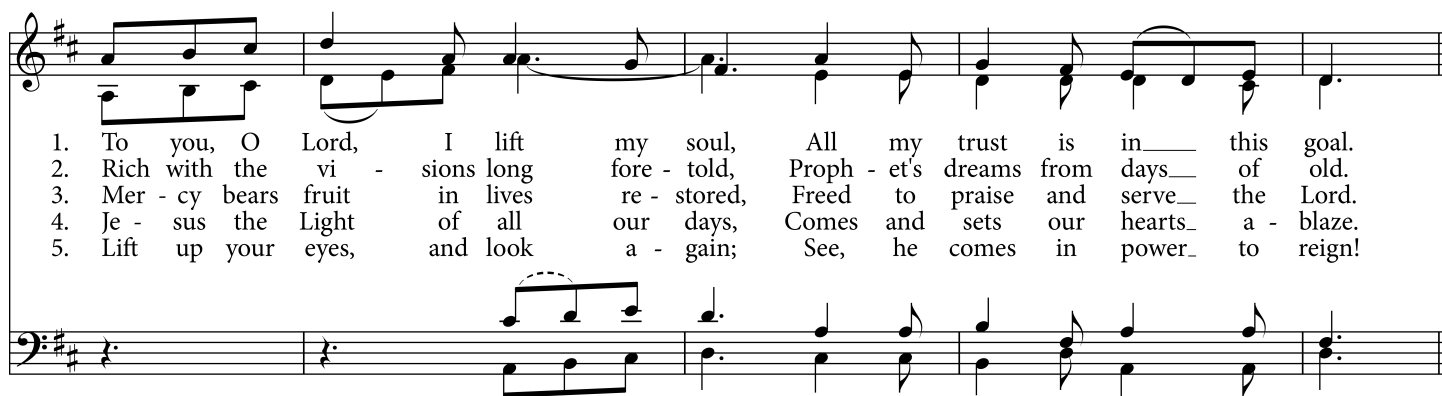
People, Look East

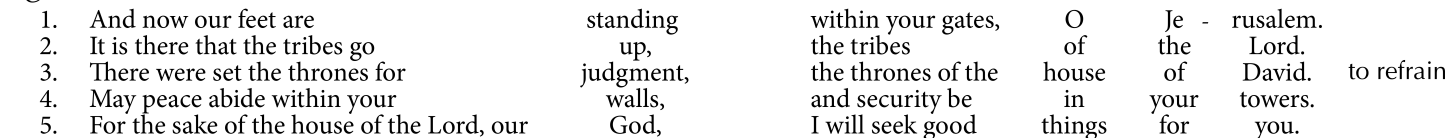
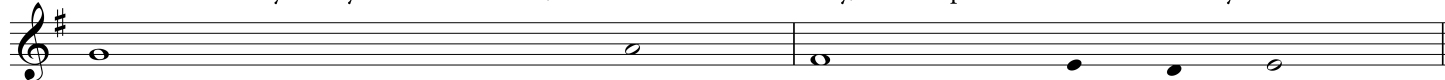
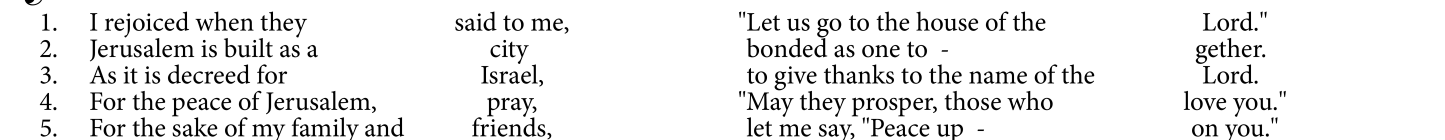
