Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Among all the instruments made for divine worship, the organ is "accorded pride of place" because of its capacity to sustain the singing of a large, gathered assembly. For this reason, the dedicated people of the Pellegrino Music Center, Fr. Racco, Fr. Menkhaus, and myself have given much attention to the installation process of our organ so that it may be made most suitable to serve us in our worship space.

With great joy I inform you that we are entering the final stages of the installation process. We are currently hearing the organ speak from the central part of our church behind the sanctuary. Additionally, the organ will speak from two more new areas. A new chamber has been built, wired, and completed to the left of the sanctuary space and a new chamber is being completed above the choir to properly sustain their singing when they exercise their ministerial role in the liturgy.

Finally, the many different sounds the organ provides offers to give our emotions a voice. The organ is designed to properly give "resonance to the fullness of human sentiments: from joy to sadness, and from praise to lamentation." Likewise, the manifold possibilities of the organ in some ways reminds us of the immensity and the magnificence of God. For this reason, every single individual sound of this new instrument will undergo a tedious adjustment process known as "voicing" so that every individual sound will resonate to its fullest capacity and beauty in our space.

Upon the completion of our new digital John Cabala instrument, we will begin the process of the refurbishing and interfacing of the pipes. Pipes are still available to be sponsored and rededicated. Please prayerfully consider offering help to bring this process to completion through the pipe sponsorship opportunity.

Most importantly, thank you for remembering this installation process and all of those involved in your prayers. Praying this organ to completion will indeed assure us of God's presence in our community.

For more than two decades, the Ignatian Spirituality Institute at John Carroll University has formed and prepared men and women, lay and religious, to serve in ministry in the church in Cleveland, Northeast Ohio and beyond. If you have interest, consider joining us for our next cohort, which begins in August 2024. The two year program coincides with the John Carroll University academic calendar and provides a graduate certificate in spiritual direction in the Ignatian tradition. The first year of the program focuses upon learning the tradition of spiritual direction with a particular emphasis upon St. Ignatius of Loyola, as well as a study of various spiritual masters and mystics of Christian spirituality. The second year of the program is a practicum, in which students practice giving spiritual direction. Particularly rewarding is the community which forms as a given cohort (class) learns together.

While the focuses of the program is the art and science of the spiritual direction, the knowledge and skills gained in the two years of the program may be used in a variety of ministries. The program provides both professional development at a high level as well as spiritual and personal growth for participants. More than 200 ISI graduates have been trained to serve as spiritual directors, accompanying others in their own faith journey. The skills from the program are useful in college and high school campus ministry, parish programs such as Bible study, prayer groups, RCIA groups, confirmation preparation classes, etc. Program participants become adept in spiritual conversation and have the opportunity to develop skills in retreat facilitation.

Earlier applications are preferred. Tuition for the program is \$3,000 per year, but scholarships are available, so cost should not be a barrier to participation.


