• Fruits • Vegetables • Meats & Tuna • Peanut butter (large or small)


Dry goods: Beans • Rice • Pasta • Cereal & cereal bars

Legislative Action

Next Wednesday September 17, Bishop Brenda, Pastor Emily Ebert and Desta Goehner of Holy Trinity Thousand Oaks will join over 50 Lutherans on Capitol Hill to lobby our senators and congress members to preserve food programs like SNAP and Medicaid. Please join this legislative effort by calling or emailing our senators, **Senator Adam Schiff** and **Senator Alex Padilla** and ask them to vote to protect these vital programs. Tell them there are Lutherans on the hill lobbying for these programs on the 17th and you stand with them. If you call the office, you will likely get voicemail, which is fine. They will give you instructions on how to leave a message about an issue, including giving your city and name. Thanks for using your voice and joining the Lutheran action on the 17th.

Bishop's Statement on Supreme Court ICE ruling

Beloved in Christ,

As a person of faith serving in a public role, I want to be thoughtful about when and how to speak. I speak about law or politics with real caution, but I believe it is completely within my call to speak with moral outrage when people's rights are taken away.

I lament the **Supreme Court ruling** on Monday, September 8, 2025 to allow Immigration and Customs Enforcement officers to continue to sweep people off the street, based on how they look, where they congregate (such as a day laborer employment site) or what job they do (landscaping, carwash workers). This ruling is in response to a lawsuit filed against ICE in California, after ICE agents swept thousands of people in Los Angeles earlier this year. This is personal to me; these beloved children of God live in my hometown and are my siblings. It should be personal to all of us. The Body of Christ is injured and we need to work to heal it.

Call to Action in the Aftermath of the Charlie Kirk Murder:

Dear siblings in Christ, no matter what you thought of Charlie Kirk's methods and politics, a terrible murder has occurred and must never be celebrated. Mr. Kirk was a major figure in the lives of our young people – whether or not they identified as conservative. Please check in on our young people. Ask them what they think. Talk with them about violence, fear, hate, any and all of it. This may be a difficult conversation, but it is critical we let our young people know we see them. If your young people are LGBTQ, this is also very important, as Mr. Kirk spoke against LGBTQ rights and safety all the time. It is possible people are having conflicting feelings and need a space to process.





This was turned into a popular novel in 1931, then made into 3 movies--1931, 1936 and 1941, the latter being the most famous. Every version is different in slightly (and sometimes more than slightly!) different ways. Our adaptation opens **October 10**, and runs three weekends.
