A Message From Pastor Rick



In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth... Genesis 1:1

For 6 days, God speaks life into being as he creates the world and everything in it. On the seventh day, he does nothing? He rested on the seventh? That is correct, after toiling for 6 days, God rests. Even more he blesses the day and makes it holy.

In the Jewish religion they have been celebrating sabbath since they were given the command to. For them their sabbath day begins at sundown on

Friday night and lasts until sundown on Saturday. They have certain meals they prepare in remembrance of who and whose they are. They go to synagogue or temple and worship God. There is to be no work on this day, only a day of rest, renewal and spiritual renewal with God.

In our church we celebrate sabbath on Sundays when we come together to worship God. Unfortunately, we may have lost the idea of rest and renewal as society, the secular world, has put other demands on us. While there used to be a respect for the sabbath day, we see less of this support from government, families and work places.

For pastors we are always serving on Sunday, the accepted sabbath day. In the ELCA we are encouraged to take at least one sabbath day a week. One day where we are to focus on our families, our own spiritualities, and on renewal. What that looks like can change from week to week. For me I will be taking Mondays as my sabbath day, this will begin on September 8th. On these days I attempt to not look at emails, text or other church related materials. I take time for rest and renewal. I try to do what a Jewish rabbi told me sabbath was, "doing nothing out of obligations." I do try and honor this. So, if on a Sunday evening or Monday, I do not get back to your email or text right away, I am not ignoring you, I am following what God commands.

I would encourage each of you to try and find time for sabbath, rest, renewal. You may have to start small and carve out 30-60 minutes of time. Time for you. Time for God. We are more effective leaders and people when we have rest. Come on you can do it, God did.


