- About Camp**
- All campers must be members of the Boys & Girls Club of Binghamton. Membership is \$65/year, non-refundable
 - 5-year-olds must have completed kindergarten
 - A \$50 non-refundable per-session deposit is required for each child per session. The deposit will be applied to session fees.
 - All applications & payments should be mailed or brought to The Boys & Girls Club of Binghamton Main Office for processing. Applications and payments cannot be accepted at Camp Sertoma.
 - Session changes may be made at no charge 3 weeks prior to the start of the session, pending availability.
 - Lunch, snack, and limited transportation throughout Broome County are provided at no extra charge
 - Camp Sertoma Cinch Sack included; 1 per camper per summer

Family Nights

The last Friday of each general session (7/17, 7/31, and 8/14), families & friends are invited to visit camp beginning at 3:30pm, meet the staff, and enjoy the ceremonies & recognition program (weather permitting). Buses will be provided only for the morning trip on days of Family Night.

What to Bring ✓

- Face mask, water bottle, swimsuit, towel, and camp bag. Sweater or rain jacket (camp operates rain or shine). Camp/play clothes. Extra set of clothes, shoes, and socks on inclement days. Hats, insect repellent, and sunscreen. No sandals, please. Label all belongings.

What NOT to Bring ✗

- Leave all toys, dolls, video games, card games, radios, cell phones, and pets at home. Alcohol, firearms, drugs, knives, tobacco, obscene material, and any items dangerous or disruptive to camp are not allowed.
- Prior permission from the Camp Director must be obtained for items such as fishing poles, archery bows, knives, or axes. They cannot be transported on the bus for safety reasons.



REGISTRATION & FEES

The \$50 deposit and Membership fees are non-refundable. Refunds given only if requested 30 days prior to the start of the session. All refunds will be given at the end of the camp season. An absence of 3 or more consecutive days requires a written medical excuse to receive a refund.

General 2-week Session

Our general sessions provide children with a dynamic, well-rounded camp experience filled with fun, learning, and adventure. Campers rotate through all program areas, enjoying activities such as swimming lessons, horseback riding, archery, crafts, music and drama, nature study, athletics, boating, and more.

For campers ready to take the next step, our Wilderness Program offers an exciting challenge—building advanced skills, fostering leadership, and empowering campers to help shape their own camp experience.

Residence Camp (ages 9-12)

Our residential camp programs help campers build independence while fully embracing the outdoor camp lifestyle. Campers enjoy special evening activities and take part in preparing their own dinners and breakfasts, fostering responsibility and teamwork. Residential campers must be registered for general camp during the same session. Drop-off takes place on Sunday between 3:00 and 4:00 PM, and campers may ride the bus home or be picked up at camp at 4:00 PM on Wednesday.

C.I.T. Program (ages 13-15)

Phase I C.I.T. Training:

New C.I.T.s participate in a four-day training program designed to introduce Camp rules, build foundational leadership skills, and explore youth development strategies. Each day also includes hands-on time experiencing a variety of camp activities. Participants who successfully complete the training advance to Phase II C.I.T. status.

Phase II C.I.T. Training:

C.I.T.s who successfully complete Phase I training have the opportunity to put their skills into action by working directly with campers as assistants to counselors and instructors, gaining valuable hands-on leadership experience.

As part of their registration, every camper will receive a Camp Sertoma cinch sack—perfect for carrying daily camp essentials. One cinch sack is included per camper per summer.
