


Calls and Referrals by Month

In 2024, calls to 211 generally followed seasonal patterns. Calls fluctuated in the Spring and rose in the Summer. There was an enormous spike in calls during October due to Hurricane Helene. **Calls were up 21%** compared to 2023. Call volume in 2024 was similar to 2023 until the large spike in October. Referrals increased significantly, partly because referrals were provided per service rather than per organization. This allows for a more accurate record of referred programs and services than the previous method.





Electric and Rent Assistance continued to be the top requested needs in 2024 and constituted 40% of all calls. Calls were similar to the previous year, with Rent Assistance seeing a small increase. Other housing related needs such as Shelters, Affordable Housing, Eviction Prevention, and Other Bills saw notable increases from 2023. Calls for Disaster needs were the third highest need for the Piedmont as a result of Hurricane Helene. Calls for food assistance often accompany requests for disaster needs, contributing to the over double number of calls from 2023.

Based on Calls, Jan-Dec 2024









United Way of the Piedmont Overdue Bill Amount Overview

Callers requesting Rent, Mortgage, Utility, or other forms of financial assistance may opt in to tell 211 the dollar amount they are overdue on payments. Average overdue bills fluctuated throughout the year. Overall bill averages were highest in Q2, though total calls were highest in Q1. Many financial assistance programs offer services once per year which may contribute to the amount of calls seen at the beginning of the year. The total overdue bill amount for 2024 was up by over a third of the total from 2023, though averages for most overdue bills decreased




United Way of the Piedmont 211 Website Statistics Overview




Total Website Visits


Total Website Hits by Month


