Meet Lily ...

Lily was diagnosed with Leukemia at Vanderbilt Children's Hospital on December 1, 2008, at the age of 7. Her doctor explained leukemia cells were like weeds that crowd out the good flowers in a garden.

For over two years, Lily received chemotherapy to kill "all the weeds" so that only healthy "flowers" would grow in "Lily's Garden". She completed treatment on February 20, 2011.

In September 2016, 5 years, 7 months and 6 days from her last chemo treatment, Lily relapsed with leukemia. She finished receiving an additional two years of intense chemotherapy and immunotherapy September 2018.

Lily set a goal initially to raise \$1 Million for childhood cancer research so no child will have to go through what she has gone through. Having met her initial goal, she now says she won't stop till there is a CURE!

Today, Lily is enrolled in the Physicians Assistant Program at Kansas State University where her dedication to finding a cure for childhood cancer continues.

As a leader in childhood cancer care, Vanderbilt relies on philanthropic contributions to aid in their discovery process and ensure that programs continue to enhance the care that patients and families receive.
