Discussion Items

BOY (Beginning of Year) Data – Trina

- Seeing a great increase in reading scores and comprehension.
- 2nd grade is focusing on accuracy; improvement is showing, maintaining state goal..
- Every grade is emphasizing accuracy.
- “Unofficial Accuracy Club” — reading names over the intercom.
- Celebrating student improvement.

Math BOY (Beginning of Year) Data- Trina

- Math scores have been maintained.
- Multiple curriculums are used to support each grade level appropriately.

BOY (Beginning of Year) RISE Test Results

- Scores were not as high as desired; the test is complex.
- Current performance: 63%–27% of students scored 3s & 4s.
- Teachers are collaborating to improve scores.
- Teachers are working closely with struggling readers and aides are working with advanced readers to help best where intervention is needed.
- Strong communication between teachers, and aides to support students in all reading levels.

Budget: \$82,000 allocated to Aides last year for the current school year. This allows the school to be able to do such intervention with students.

Safety & Emergency Preparedness

- Safety and emergency preparedness plans discussed.
- Website resources available with the website called "I love you guys". This is where we are getting most of our preparedness information on how to assess all emergency situations.
- Parents, teachers and aides need to assist with preparedness plans. To be able to handle a variety of situations on how reunification would work and how to handle anxious and worried parents.
- Anna mentioned some plans on the safety plan that the district is using may not apply directly to Morgan Elementary School. She is working with lots of local law enforcement, fire department supervisors, transportation departments, and other medical professionals to gather data to create the best plan for our students.
- First aid kits, snacks, and water are needed in every classroom to help in emergency situations if they were to ever happen.
- Mandates are in place but no funding provided by the state as of now.
- Working to piece together a plan to ensure smooth operations.

- Discussion on the depth of planning needed.
- Trina advised taking notes on all items of proposed safety plan to help prepare MES safely plan that will be approved by the district.

Practice Evacuation

- Evacuation practice will be at Trojan Center.
- Goal: keep information in one spot to help parents and students understand what to do, when to do it, and what they will get from it.
- Focus on reunification procedures with parents. List of emergency contacts and notifications on so that parents can actually receive information from the district through many forms of communication ie, text, email and calling.
