LIKE THE MAGI, SEEK THE NEWBORN KING

**"The star was so beautiful, large and clear,
That all the other stars of the sky
Became a white mist in the atmosphere,
And by this they knew that the coming was near
Of the Prince foretold in the prophecy."**

~ Henry Wadsworth Longfellow, The Three Kings

Since the time I was very young, I have always looked forward to the Feast of the Epiphany. The reason? Quite simply, one of my favorite hymns is "We Three Kings". I love singing the verses and reflecting upon those Magi of old who traveled from afar in order to give their gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh to Jesus, the newborn King.

Quite often, that is the emphasis of the Feast of the Epiphany. We often reflect upon the Wise Men who met King Herod and disturbed him with their announcement of the birth of a rival. We think about their journey and about their presentation to Jesus, Mary, and Joseph.

But "epiphany" is not about the kings. The very definition of the word epiphany is much more. According to the dictionary, epiphany means an appearance or manifestation, especially of a deity. Hence, today is not about the Magi. It is not about Herod. It is not about Mary or Joseph.

Today is about the Lord Jesus Christ manifesting Himself to the world through representatives of the world: the Magi. The new King was born into the world and has been revealed to all.

Jesus' manifestation would rock the world of His time. King Herod would do all in his power to assure himself that his rival was killed. He ordered the slaughter of the innocents just so that he could assure himself that the new king would die as well. He failed in his mission.

Throughout His life, Jesus would rock the world. Many would set themselves up in opposition against Him and some would even appear victorious as they were able to do what no one else had been able to accomplish: kill Him.

Yet, even death could not hold Christ the King. Three days after His death on the cross, Christ would destroy death and restore life to all by His resurrection.

Jesus manifests Himself to us in the lives of all those around us. Look for Him today. Thank Him for His great love. And do all that you can to be a loyal subject.

FAITH ACTION: Ask God to bless the journey of your life that you, like the Magi, may find Him.

Gospel Reflection Matthew 2:1-12



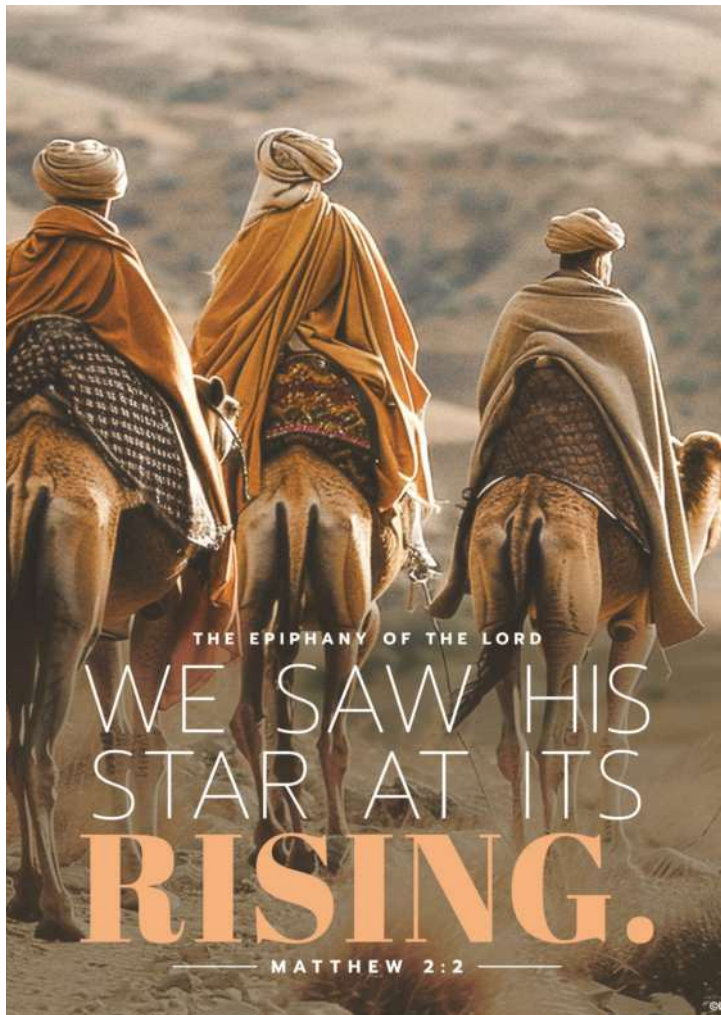
When I was 22, I went on a pilgrimage to Rome for the Jubilee Year of 2000. I was traveling light with just a backpack, one blue shirt and black pants, little money, and no Italian. I had a few close friends and one goal: to reach the Eternal City. Despite the challenges and deprivations, I felt alive in a way I had never known before.

When do you feel most alive? I'd wager it's not when you're most comfortable or surrounded by stuff. Rather, it's when your life is aimed at something great; when you're on a meaningful and challenging journey with good friends.

That's the image the Magi give us in today's Gospel. They set out from the East not with certainty, but with hope. They study the signs, discipline their attention, and journey together, offering the best they have when they find the newborn King.

The Church gives us their story at the start of the year to reawaken something in us. We are not meant to drift. We're meant to journey as pilgrims. The Jubilee Year of 2025 may have ended, but our pilgrimage has not. Like the magi, the closer we get to Christ, the more alive we become.

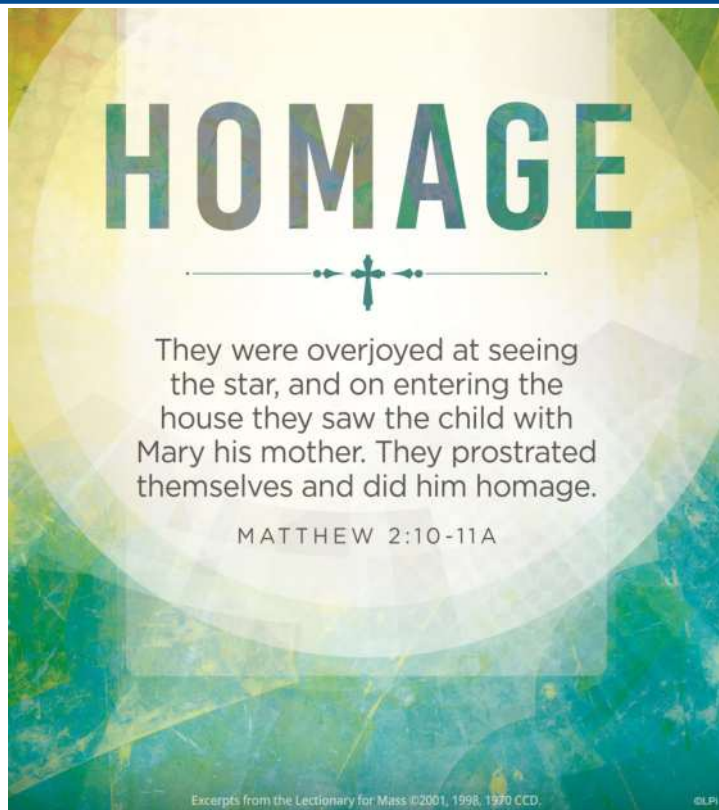

"Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh." MATTHEW 2:11

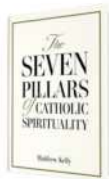

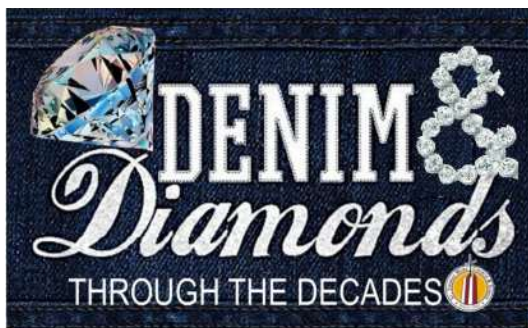

Reading the Bible... in one year?

Now that it's time for making New Year's resolutions, some of you intend to read the entire Bible in one year. *I don't recommend setting out to do that, though I certainly do recommend reading the Bible.* However, I suggest **you read through Salvation History or its narrative**, as found in the Bible, not the entire thing, just for the sake of getting through all of it.

It doesn't make much sense to try to read the entire Bible, and it certainly doesn't make much sense to read it like one, big novel, from the front to the back. The books are not put in chronological order, and that's a lot of reading to do, every single day. It's too



much to process and retain, actually. It will be rushed. It can begin to feel like a marathon that we're just trying to get through and finish. That's not the purpose of the Bible. Plus, we can get very proud of ourselves for having read the entire Bible, but we have to reject pride. It is much better to read a little of the Bible and be truly guided by the Holy Spirit, through it, than read a ton of it and not get much spiritual growth out of it. It is a book of faith, not a science or history book. It's not a bunch of information to know and memorize. It is a way for you to allow God—the One who loves you—to speak to you.

Rather than reading all 73 books in one year, I think it will be much more doable and fruitful to read these 17 books, in this order:

1. **Matthew** (Jan.)
2. **Mark** (Jan.-Feb.)
3. **John** (Feb.)
4. **Genesis** (Mar.-Apr.)
5. **Exodus** (Apr.-May)
6. **Numbers** (May-June)
7. **Joshua** (June-July)
8. **Judges** (July)
9. **1 Samuel** (July-Aug.)
10. **2 Samuel** (Aug.-Sept.)
11. **1 Kings** (Sept.)
12. **2 Kings** (Sept.-Oct.)
13. **Ezra** (Oct.-Nov.)
14. **Nehemiah** (Nov.)
15. **1 Maccabees** (Nov.)
16. **Luke** (Nov.-Dec.)
17. **Acts** (Dec.)



Take your time with it. Make it prayerful. Do what you can do, each day, and not make it burdensome and like a job that you have to do. Pray with the Bible, and open yourself to be led by the Holy Spirit, through it.
