LENT BEGINS WEDNESDAY. GET READY.

"Lent is a time for discipline, for confession, for honesty, not because God is mean or fault-finding or finger-pointing but because he wants us to know the joy of being cleaned out, ready for all the good things he now has in store."

The not-so-favorite time of the year for many people is just around the corner. Lent begins this coming Wednesday. The reason, I believe, that Lent is so often looked down upon is because people view it from a negative lens.

Negative? Well, yes. After all, don't you have to give up your favorite things during Lent? That's negative, isn't it?

It could be. But negatives can be positives if viewed properly. We don't give things up to be miserable people and long for those things that much more. No, we give things up because we want our sacrifices to be meaningful to the Lord.

The Lord doesn't want us to be burdened, He doesn't want us to view Lent through a negative lens. He wants us to use the discipline of Lent in order to draw closer to Him.

Oops, I did it again, didn't I. First, I said negative. Now I've ramped up the negativity by using the word discipline. For many of us, discipline means unpleasantness. It means hurt. It means doing things that we don't want to do.

But discipline — when speaking about Lent — is not a negative. Discipline is very positive. After all, if a person wants to excel in sports, that person has to take on the discipline of practice and fitness. Without embracing that discipline, there is no opportunity for sports greatness.

We are called to holiness. If we wish to become more holy, we need to embrace the discipline of the Lord. We need to turn away from the things that we know keep us from Him. We need to renew ourselves daily in prayer, another discipline that many do not practice. We need to reach out to others by performing the corporal and spiritual works of mercy.

In short, we have been handed a road map to the Kingdom. Jesus let us know what we needed to do in order to arrive at that glorious destination. It is up to us to take that map and follow where it leads.

On this Sunday before Ash Wednesday, I encourage you to examine your lives (just as we often do toward the end of the year before making New Years resolutions) and see what needs to change within you so that you may be prepared to embrace the discipline of Lent with renewed focus and hope.

FAITH ACTION: Do not be afraid to look deep within in order to determine what can remain, what needs to change, and what might need to be removed in order to become more holy this Lent.

THE JOURNEY WITHIN ... The Experience Of Lent

NOT A HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION BUT A WONDERFUL DAY OF OPPORTUNITY

This coming Wednesday, February 18 is Ash Wednesday. It is not a Holy Day of Obligation. It is, however, a day that many choose to attend Mass. To that end, Masses on Wednesday are at 6:30 and 8:30 a.m. as well as 5:00 and 7:00 p.m.

Don't forget, Ash Wednesday begins the Season of Lent. **Ash Wednesday is a Day of Fast and Abstinence. The Fridays of Lent are Days of Abstinence. Good Friday is a Day of Fast and Abstinence.**

Fast: Allows for only one full meal to be taken during the day. Two smaller meals are permitted, if necessary, to maintain strength according to one's needs. Eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. **Fasting is to be observed by all Catholics who are 18 years of age through to those who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday.** [Medical conditions may make it impossible to fast. The Church has never held its people to the impossible. If you have a condition that prohibits you from fasting, you are not obliged to do so.]

Abstinence: The practice of refraining from meat and meat products. **Abstinence is to be practiced by all who are 14 years of age and older.**

ON THE LIGHTER SIDE

- It's the start of Lent. If you made a New Year's resolution, and failed to keep it, Lent is a great opportunity to fail at it again.
- I gave up online shopping for Lent. Monday I got an email letting me know a purse I had been looking at is on sale. Couldn't they have done that a week earlier?

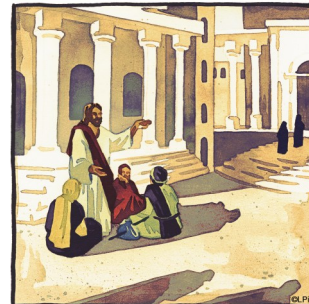

Gospel Reflection Matthew 5:17-37

A few years into my priesthood, I hit a wall. I had taken on too many commitments: Masses, meetings, ministries, projects. I couldn't keep up. I was double-booking, forgetting things, running late, and letting people down. My boss at the time, a wise priest, and our shared secretary, noticed. For my birthday, the two gave me a stack of 100 flashcards, each with one word printed in a different language: "NO." It was funny, but also painfully true. If I couldn't say no, my yes was in danger.



In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus says, **"Let your 'Yes' mean 'Yes,' and your 'No' mean 'No.' Anything more is from the Evil One" (Matthew 5:37).** He's not just giving advice about polite speech. He's showing us something about the freedom of Christian discipleship. The follower of Christ is called to speak clearly, simply, and honestly. There is joy in that kind of freedom.

The Church Fathers often linked this kind of straightforward truthfulness with spiritual maturity. The devil is the father of lies, but Jesus is the Word made flesh. When we hedge, flatter, exaggerate, or avoid, we open space for the shadows to creep in. That little stack of flashcards reminded me that God does not want us enslaved to the expectations of others or to the fear of disappointing them. He wants us to enjoy the peace of saying yes and meaning it, and saying no, and meaning it, too.

Lenten Challenge: Practice one moment of honest, peaceful speech this week. Maybe it's a sincere "yes" to something important, or a humble "no" to something you cannot do. Let it be a quiet step into the freedom Jesus offers.

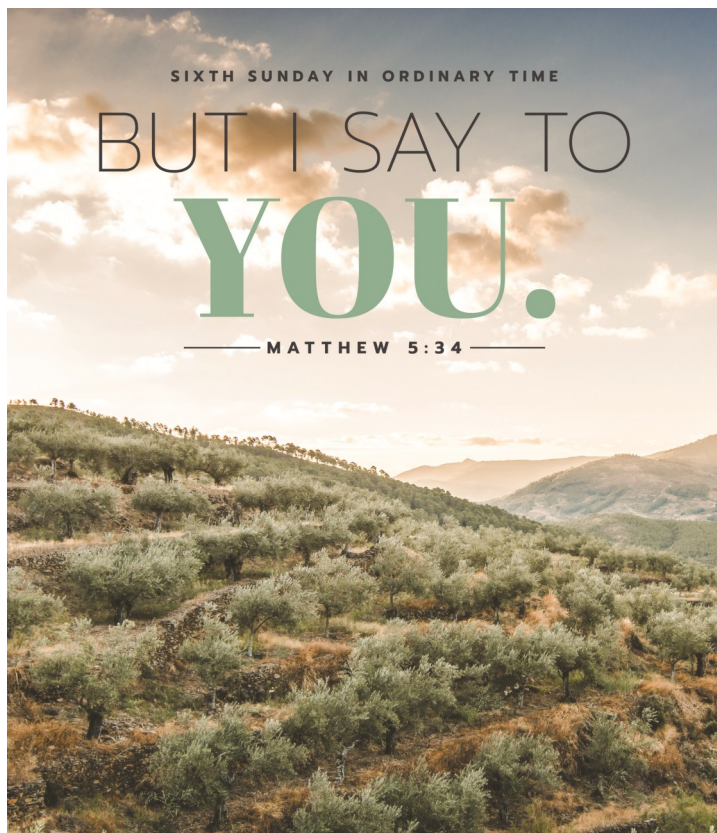

What is Study & Share Group and why should I participate?

Daniel Maul, Director of Discipleship

Surprisingly, for a left-brained, artistic person, I'm a pretty traditional kind of student. I learn best when I can sit quietly in class, pay close attention to the teacher, and take notes on the lecture. Therefore, I always *hated* being put into small groups or being forced to do work with a group, outside of class. That is, until I realized and accepted the good that small-group work did for me, both intellectually and personally.



Because of my learning style, I always felt like being put into small groups was a detriment to my education. I didn't need to orally process my thinking with other students, in order to learn. And, because of my irritation at being put into a small group, my bad attitude got in the way of me contributing very much to the group.

However, I have always struggled with a deep sense of loneliness and disconnection, even though I love *people*. I could always do my solitary academic work, but doing so would exacerbate my feeling of being all alone. My work style, too, is private and individualistic and, thus, isolating. In college, I realized that, though they didn't help me with the class material, *per se*, small-group work was good for me and my education. Small groups always lifted my spirits. As an extrovert, the energy that I would take in, from the groups, would propel me to be able to do my solitary work with joy. Small groups combated my sense of isolation and loneliness, both in my educational pursuits and in my personal life. When I realized what I did receive from small groups, I was, then, able to contribute the educational assistance from which other students could and, ultimately, *did* benefit. This contribution, too, was good for my self-esteem and emotional state.

Like the small groups in school, our Lenten Study and Share Series (though not a class) serves two purposes: (1) to study how to develop our personal spiritualities, so as to draw closer to the Lord and (2) to be a community that journeys together – in faith and relationship – unto the Heavenly Kingdom. We *need* each other. We are social “animals.” We’re a community. Christ established a Church, which is a faith community of the People of God. He didn't just establish personal relationships with separated individuals. Yes, He died for each *one* of us, personally and individually, and He wants to have an intimate relationship with each *one* of us. But He came that we “may all be one” (John 17:21). Therefore, let's work at being “one,” by gathering together to study and share our faith.

Please *consider* joining us for our Lenten Study and Share Series, to be Church, together, and grow in relationship and trust, as children of God and friends in the Lord.

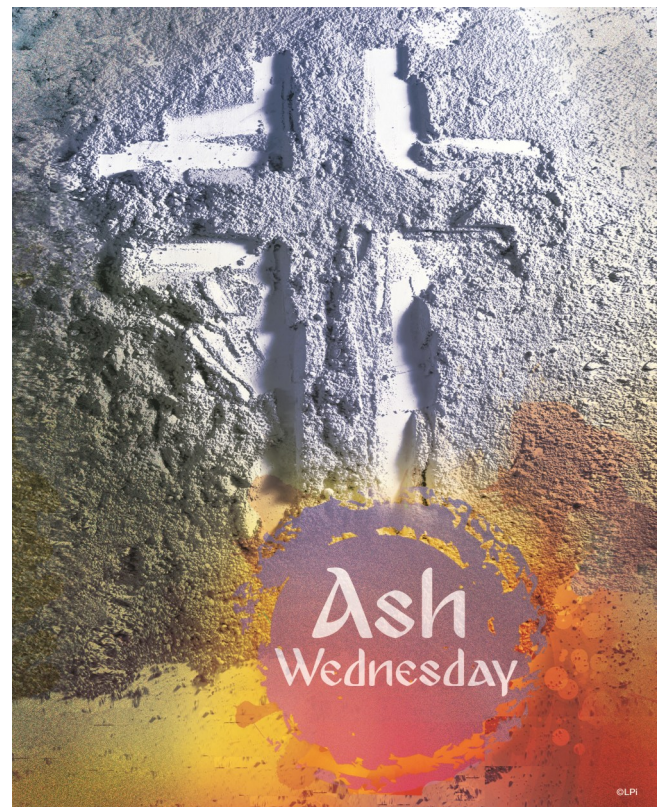

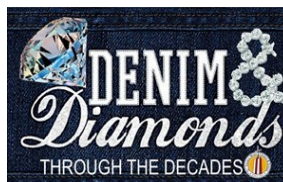

CSA 2024-2025 UPDATE Congratulations ~ We Did It!

Final numbers are in! In 2025, we raised \$570,134 with contributions from 596 families, beating our \$500,000 goal. After the Diocesan Goal, this left us with \$430,972 to put towards the roofing project. *Thank you to everyone that donated or prayed for the success of our campaign.*

Over the two years, we were able to raise \$677,623 over the Diocesan Goal to help defray the cost of the roofing, lighting, and sound system projects. The final costs of the project exceeded just over \$2,000,000.
