

#### THE NECESSITY OF HUMILITY

"Perfection is impossible without humility. Why should I strive for perfection, if I am already good enough?" ~ Leo Tolstoy

The readings at this weekend's Masses speak to us about the virtue and importance of humility. Humility is probably one of the least desired virtues among people. We do not want to be humble. We want to be seen, to be noticed, and to be highly influential. To recommend that someone be humble will garner us a really quick stare-down by another.

But, as Tolstoy reminds us, humility is a very basic part of the package called perfection. We cannot possibly become perfect if we think we are already there. If we think we're the best that there is, then there is no motivation to become any better. Let's face it, we can all be better.

In the first reading, the Book of Sirach tells us that if we conduct our affairs with humility we will be loved more than a giver of gifts. If we humble ourselves, especially if we are considered as great, God will be pleased with us. That is because, when we are truly humble, we see ourselves as God sees us, as they say, warts and all.

There are many people who abhor the thought of a lack of perfection. Plastic surgeons do a thriving business on those kinds of people. Nips and tucks, tweaks and massive reworking are all done in the name of physical perfection. If only we could see our souls the same way that we see ourselves in the mirrors. We would be much more motivated to do something about perfecting them.

We can all do with a spiritual tummy-tuck or facelift. But, the only way that we can see our spiritual imperfections is to have the grace of humility. Being humble, we will see what is lacking within us and we would then be more motivated to change.

Jesus spoke about those who try to promote themselves and who think that they are the most important. A rude awakening awaits them when they find that they are not recognized that way by others. Jesus told his disciples that through the story of the wedding guest who took a place of honor at table thinking that he was deserving only to be told to sit at a much lower place.

The day that we realize that we are not deserving will give us the humility to ask the question, "What must we do in order to do and be better?" That question will lead to answers that require just as much humility in order for us to do what we need to do. Perfection is a difficult task and being perfected by God is most humbling. However, it is worth all the personal cost that it entails since it brings with it an eternal reward.

FAITH ACTION: Ask God for the gift of humility and then be prepared to act upon the changes that God requests of you.

#### Gospel Meditation Luke 14:1, 7-14

Once I was invited to a group meeting with Pope Francis. Entering the room, I paused, eyeing the seats next to the Pope's fancy chair. Someone saw my paralysis and invited me to sit in the seat farthest from what I wanted. Hiding my disappointment, I sat. We waited. To our surprise, an aid pointed out that those seats were still empty



and invited me and another to have them. We calmly but gleefully strode across the room and sat. Pope Francis entered, and we enjoyed two hours of amazingly uplifting conversation.

Jesus says this week to us: "When you are invited, go and take the lowest place so that when the host comes to you he may say, 'My friend, move up to a higher position.' Then you will enjoy the esteem of your companions at the table" (Luke 14:10). This is not about how to score free seat upgrades. Rather, it is a wise pattern for the whole of life. It is how to live free from the anxiety of constantly grasping for status and recognition.

Jesus perfectly embodies his seat-taking advice. He eschews his glorious throne for the lowest: death on a cross, that lonely chair we all deserve. In his resurrection, he calls us up higher to his marvelous banquet seats. This week, perhaps we should look for opportunities to choose the lowest seat. We'll be pleasantly surprised when we do.



# Stewardship REFLECTION

#### 22<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Rather, when you hold a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; blessed indeed will you be because of their inability to repay you." LUKE 14:13-14

One of the main principles of living a stewardship lifestyle is to give without expecting anything in return. This is difficult for some to comprehend in our "consumerist" culture that we live in. This is even difficult for many parish communities that have become heavily dependent on parish fundraising events to support the mission and ministry of their local parish. Generally speaking, at a parish fundraiser, you pay money and receive something in return, it's just a financial transaction. This is opposed to our parish offertory at Holy Mass, where you unite your sacrifice with Jesus', renewing our covenant relationship with Him.







### A Message from Our Pastor



As you are well aware, we are in the midst of our church renovation project. When it is complete, we will have a **new roof**, **new lighting**, an improved sound system, and repaired ceilings.

In order to make this possible, we really do need your help. We dedicated the

rebate from last year's and this year's CSA to go toward the project and we need whatever you can afford to donate.

In addition to the CSA rebates from last year and this year, we determined that we would **dip into our parish savings** so that we would not have to have a capital campaign. If you remember, I told you last year at our annual finance report that I was counting on you and trusting that you would help as you have done in the past.

If you look at it, we really have done a lot these past years with your help. We replaced a parking lot, windows in our school building, roofs on our school building, and our heating and air conditioning system, just to name a few. These have all been big budget items that were achieved all because of you.

#### I can't stress that enough. All because of you!

We are all in this together. We work together, we pray together, and we celebrate together. That is what a parish family is all about. I couldn't be prouder of the parish family here at St. Thomas More.

I am happy to report that our parish financial status is still very sound. We try to be as judicious as possible with the funds that you entrust to us and we do our best to get as much bang for the buck as we can.

Enrollment is up in our school, which recently was awarded Blue Ribbon status. Congratulations to our administration, faculty, staff, and students! Parish ministries are doing their best to grow. Have you considered volunteering for a ministry? We are in the midst of a diocesan planning process where we have been asked various questions about the perception of our faith. A synopsis of the process thus far is on the back of this report. We have also engaged the help of a national organization to look at how we do things in our parish and at worship in order to provide parishioners a good experience. See a summary of the Rebuilt process inside.

In short, as we have always done, we strive to improve each and every day. When you look at it, we are never really finished. Anything that we do, we can always do better whether that be at school, at work, at home, or at our parish. Refusing to change and grow leads to stagnation and who wants that?

I'm mindful of the fact that this is the last annual finance report that I will give to you as I will be retiring next summer. I **thank you** for the many years that you have helped support my ministry to our parish and **thank you** for the trust that you have shown in the generous manner in which you have contributed not only to weekly collections but also to special collections, special projects, and large capital campaigns.

Coming full circle, I hope that you will give whatever you can to help make our church improvement project a success. If you have not contributed yet, kindly consider doing so. Our original roof has lasted for years. Hopefully, our new roof will last just as long. God bless you all for your constant support.



#### **Notes**

Our finances are reviewed quarterly by the Parish Finance Council and annually by the Parish Pastoral Council. Reports are sent annually to the Diocese. All reports are on a modified cash basis.

While total parish revenues exceeded the annual budget by \$40,000, our Sunday and Holy Day collections were slightly below projections, with weekly contributions down 3.8% and the average gift per envelope moving from \$34 to \$33. This small change reminds us how much every contribution matters. If each household were able to prayerfully consider even a modest increase in weekly giving, together we could provide greater support for our ministries, expand our outreach, and ensure the vitality of our parish for years to come.

We continue to follow up on CSA pledges for this year's campaign, and we invite all parishioners who have not yet done so to prayerfully consider making a commitment. Our parish goal is \$139,162, and thanks to your generosity, the much-needed roof project is now underway. Every gift given beyond our goal will directly support this vital work.


Salaries slightly exceeded our budget in the current year as we added a Communication Director to the Ministry Team. Capital expenses were \$167,000 under budget as spending on the roof project began a month later than originally planned.

Our major capital expenses this year focused on essential improvements to both our worship and learning environments. Significant work was begun on the church roof and lighting, while the school gym received bright new lighting to enhance activities and events. In addition, we replaced the well-worn, carpeting in the 6th grade classrooms with fresh, durable tile. It was time to lay a new foundation—both literally and symbolically—for the next generation of learning and growth in the former school library space.

The school student body remains strong and consistent, with 555 students enrolled for the 2025–2026 school year. We are especially proud to begin this year as a nationally recognized Blue Ribbon School of Excellence—a true blessing and testament to the dedication of our students, staff, and families. 2025–2026 promises to be a joyful and faith-filled year for all of us at Saint Thomas More!

As we review this past year, we are reminded of our many blessings at St. Thomas More Parish. Because you give your time, talents and treasure, our parish is able to impact the lives of many.

#### Rebuilding Our Parish Growing Disciples at St. Thomas More

During Covid, many ministries at STM slowed or stopped. In 2024, a diverse group of parishioners began working through *Rebuilt*, a book and workbook designed to help parishes grow disciples by focusing on evangelization and mission. In early 2025, consultants from *Rebuilt* evaluated our Sunday experience. Both processes identified challenges, clarified priorities, and created steps for renewal.

#### Why We Took the Survey

This diocesan-wide survey invited parishioners to reflect on four key areas of faith: **Doctrine** – Personal beliefs **Habits** – Prayer and spiritual practices

Outreach – Evangelization and discipleship Growth – The Catholic journey

The goal: help our parish thrive spiritually and communally. This year's results serve as a **benchmark** for future planning.

#### **Participation Snapshot**

- 684 surveys completed 1,484 average Sunday attendance 3,986 registered adult parishioners
- 46% participation rate based on average Sunday attendance and 17.2% of registered adult parishioners
- Opportunity to improve survey participation from Latino parishioners and younger families in the future

#### **Key Strengths**

These areas positively impact parishioners' spiritual growth and connection:

- **89%** feel we share a common belief and vision
- 91% attend Mass weekly or more
- \* 87% pray at least weekly (65% pray daily)
- 93% say parish information is easy to find
- **78%** say our parish is welcoming
- **75%** would recommend Fr. Mike

#### **Opportunities for Growth**

- Empower parishioners to share their faith and live as followers of Christ






