#### WHAT DOES YOUR FUTURE HOLD?

"There is no saint without a past, no sinner without a future." ~ Augustine of Hippo

There are times in the lives of all Christians where we feel as if there is no hope for us. We look to the great saints and say, "Look at all the good they did. Look at how patient they were in their struggles. Look at their virtuous lives. I could never be like them."

What we often fail to remember — or maybe do not know at all — is that the great saints all had histories. Some were not quite as virtuous as we may have thought in the beginning. Some might have dealt poorly with others. Some might have been relatively unforgiving at first. In short, they struggled just as we do.

We need to remember that we are called to a glorious future and that we can all make it there if we attend to what we need to do in the present. Our future is not decided. It greatly depends upon what we choose to do in the present moment.

Being a follower of Jesus Christ is not the easiest thing in the world. Being His follower means that we have to deny the call of the world. Even more, we have to do all that we can to set an example for those who have been caught up in the empty promises of the world so that they might think about their decisions, turn their lives around, and come back to the Lord.

That is what all the great saints have done for us. By looking at their example, we have been given the encouragement that we might have needed to reject the many temptations that come our way and cling more closely to the Lord.

If we live our lives correctly while here on earth, some day, someone might say the same thing about us that we say about some of our great saints.

Wouldn't it be nice to know that we set an example that gave someone hope in their own personal struggles. Wouldn't it be great to hear God say to us at the end of our days, "Well done, good and faithful servant." Learn from the past and live for the future.

# Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults

Each year, our parish begins the RCIA process at the beginning of October. It culminates with the celebration of the Vigil Mass of Easter.

If you have considered becoming a Catholic (or if you were baptized Catholic but never finished your sacraments), the RCIA is meant for you.

The last two Tuesdays of September are set aside for anyone who may want to come to the church and learn about the process. The meetings will be at 7:00 p.m. in the Parish Conference Room (come to the Parish Office). You only need to come to one of the two informational meetings in September.

RCIA begins in earnest the first Tuesday of October and will meet every Tuesday evening at 7:00 p.m.

## Gospel Meditation Luke 14:25-33



One hot Arizona summer afternoon my car ran out of gas. I phoned the parish office and begged for help. My secretary came and helped me fill the gas tank. She chided me, "If you can't manage getting your car from A to B, how can we expect you to guide the parish where it needs to go?" Point

taken, Julie. I vowed to always make sure I have plenty of gas in my car.

The Lord Jesus chides us in this week's Gospel, too. He uses the two images of a man building a tower and a king marching soldiers into war to make this single point: acquire what is needed to follow him or look ridiculous. We rightly mock the builder who lacks money for his tower and the king with a short-handed army. But our mocking boomerangs back on us. How do we expect to follow Jesus to the end with insufficient detachment from our possessions and divided hearts?

The good news is, there is still time. Jesus is building a great tower to heaven—his own body. So we renounce all and give ourselves to him as his precious stones. Jesus is waging a battle against our enemy. So we forsake all and swear allegiance and march under his banner. In this way, we will finish what has begun in our discipleship. Or better put, our Lord will have the stones and soldiers required to see his great work through.







A solemn vigil will be held at this site to commemorate the over 65 million children who lost their lives to legal abortion since 1973, and to remind our society of the humanity of the unborn child.

The service at St. Mary's Cemetery takes place at the gravesite of 500 babies who were discovered and retrieved from the garbage dumpsters of several downtown Chicago abortion facilities in early 1987. It is one of the earliest gravesites across the United States.
