LIVE AUTHENTICALLY

"The trouble with quotes on the internet is that it's difficult to determine whether or not they are genuine. ~ Abraham Lincoln"

Every time the quote above appears on Facebook or in other various places on the internet, I get the biggest laugh. We all know, of course, that Abraham Lincoln could not have made this quote as there was no such thing as the internet in his day and age. The reason I get such a laugh is because, when pointing this quote out to some people, you will invariably get a blank look on someone's face and the response, "What's wrong with that?" As long as it appears in print, it must be correct.

The phrase fake news has been rampant for several years. There have been many "news" stories printed on social media that are glaringly false. There have been many stories printed that have pointed the finger wrongly at others because facts were not checked before something went to print. But once the story is printed, it begins to spread as if it were, indeed, true. It then becomes difficult to determine whether or not something is genuine, something is real.

The same can be said for our faith lives. There are, sadly, ministers across all faiths who brand a certain kind of theology and preach it as if it were the truth handed down to them by God. Theologies of wealth and prosperity, theologies of entertainment, cults of personality, these, and many other false theologies cause confusion at best and grave harm at worst. All one has to do is study those who have died in cults because they gravitated around someone claiming to be God's own anointed.

We need to be genuine in our faith so that as people look at us and listen to our words, they may see and hear the truths of Christ. We cannot package convenient theologies that leave out what we do not like about the faith or include our own little peccadillos. Jesus has said on more than one occasion, woe to those who lead others astray.

In order to be genuine, we need to know our faith. That means learning it from competent places and not picking it up from people with chips on their shoulders or internet sites that are far from accurate. If anything is important to us, we need to go the extra mile to learn about it so that we can embrace it as totally and as honestly as possible.

The world needs genuine disciples of the Lord so that they can understand the rich, deep, and abiding love of God. We do not need God's teachings watered down. Instead, we need to see people living the faith authentically.

FAITH ACTION: Ask God to give you the grace and the courage that you need to live the faith authentically today so that you may inspire others to choose to follow Him as well.

RCIA

THIS COMING TUESDAY

Each year, our parish begins the RCIA process at the beginning of October. It culminates with the celebration of the Vigil Mass of Easter.

If you have considered becoming a Catholic (or if you were baptized Catholic but never finished your sacraments), the RCIA is meant for you.

This Tuesday, September 23, and next Tuesday, September 30, have been set aside for anyone who may want to come to the church and learn about the process. The meetings will be at 7:00 p.m. in the Parish Conference Room (come to the Parish Office). You only need to come to one of the two informational meetings in September.

RCIA begins in earnest the first Tuesday of October and will meet every Tuesday evening at 7:00 p.m.

Gospel Meditation Luke 16:10-13



Before I was a priest, I was a lazy worker for a retail Apple store. Hearing a rumor that my boss was going to fire me, I secretly sold iPhones for half-price, gave away dozens of free iPads, and donated several brand-new laptops to managers in other stores in the mall. After a week, my boss called me into

his office. He knew what I was up to. He said I had cost the store thousands of dollars. "Really great work, John," he said. "I am going to recommend you to be my assistant

manager and double your pay." I was amazed.

And so are you. Which is understandable because it never happened. How could it? My tall tale is a retelling of Jesus' brow-furrowing parable we hear this week. A lazy, dishonest steward defrauds his boss and then the "master commended the dishonest servant for acting prudently" (Luke 16:8). What is the Lord saying to us?

Most of us treat our spiritual lives like a lazy teenager at an Apple store. We really don't care. We go through the motions. Then, if we are lucky, something happens that shakes us to spiritual action; to employ whatever time, money, and resources we have to build around us a strong network of love. Every saint did that. Our Lord is so good he *wants* us to use his stuff to forgive debts and to bless others. He wants us to ensure our future. So do it!







Diocese of Gary Pastoral Planning Process

From August 2025 though December 2025 our parish, along with a number of others, will participate in a Diocesan facilitated process known as Pastoral Planning. This is an extremely important undertaking designed to help us meet the future sacramental and pastoral needs of our communities.

Each week, we will feature a topic from the Pastoral Planning Process up until the next General Session on October 28, 2025.

1. What is "pastoral planning"?

Pastoral planning is a prayerful, strategic process by which a group of parishes take inventory of the human and financial resources of their community and realign them to meet the future sacramental and pastoral needs.

Simply put, pastoral planning is the pathway that recognizes changes, challenges and constraints to revitalize the Church through a well-thought-out plan.
