BEWARE OF TURNING TABLES

"Never forget: This very moment, we can change our lives. There never was a moment, and never will be, when we are without the power to alter our destiny. This second, we can turn the tables on Resistance. This second, we can sit down and do our work." ~ Steven Pressfield

Today's Gospel story was one that always fascinated me as I was growing up: the rich man and Lazarus. The story sets itself up immediately. There was a rich man who wanted for nothing, nothing at all. He had the best of everything. He did not have a care in the world.

There was a poor man, Lazarus, who had nothing, nothing at all. His whole life was a burden. He was starving the majority of the time. He longed to eat the scraps that fell from the rich man's table, though he never received any of them.

Inevitably, what has always happened and what will happen to us some day, happened to the rich man and Lazarus. They both died. The rich man found himself someplace where none of us wants to go and deprived of everything. Lazarus, on the other hand, found himself in heaven, provided all the things that he never had on earth.

The tables were now turned, and turned eternally.

The rich man became the beggar. "Father Abraham, have pity on me. Send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue, for I am suffering torment in these flames." But that was not to be.

We are quite blessed in our own lives. We have so much even if we often deny it because we are too busy looking for more. In the process, we often fail to see the needs of others and do not provide for their needs.

The Gospel story of the Rich Man and Lazarus is a potent reminder to us that we can become enamored by the wrong things. Money, fame, power and the like will not guarantee entry into the Kingdom of God.

The poor are around us every day. Some are poor materially. They need food, shelter, and clothing just to survive. Others are poor spiritually. They need care, support, and prayers to survive. Some are poor emotionally. They need love and encouragement to survive.

Many will never get what they need because we may not be there to aid them. We might be too busy looking after our own selfish desires.

But, Jeremiah reminds us in our first reading today that God will reward everyone according to his ways, according to the merit of his deeds.

FAITH ACTION: Look to the poor and the needy. Attempt to provide for their need this day.


ON THE LIGHTER SIDE

Gospel Meditation Luke 16:19-31

I am embarrassed to admit that I frequently find myself dining and socializing with people who have millions and sometimes billions of dollars. I've eaten more caviar, lobster and wagyu steak than most people on the planet. I justify it by saying it's part of my job. But I have seven pairs of nice jeans and expensive shoes.



So it is rather uncomfortable to hear Our Lord say: "My child, remember that you received what was good in your lifetime, while Lazarus likewise received what was bad; but now he is comforted here, whereas you are tormented" (Luke 16:25). Fellow rich people (and if you're American, you're rich), do we not vehemently though quietly object to this parable's karma-esque reward system? Why bless the rich man just to curse him later? And curse Lazarus just to bless him later? So Americans go to hell, while Burundians and Afghans go to heaven? What is going on?

One clue is that the condemned rich man doesn't complain of injustice. Rather, he simply begs to help his brothers to repent. Of what? We don't know exactly. Perhaps another clue is that the rich man now seems more like the downtrodden Lazarus. He knows what it is to be hungry and thirsty, to be wounded in the gutter; that he deserved that, not fancy meals and clothes. Maybe the rich man finally understands how to receive true blessings, but it is too late for him. But not for me. Not for us.






Stewardship Coordinator Part Time

2. Who makes the decisions in this process?

Bishop McClory is the ultimate decision maker as the shepherd of the Diocese of Gary. To reach his decision, Bishop McClory is seeking a recommendation from the parishes within each planning area. The bishop has appointed Fr. Christopher Stanish, Vicar General; Fr. Jeff Burton, Northlake Dean; and Dean Brad Hendrickson to facilitate the pastoral planning process. Additionally, each pastor has appointed three Key Parish Leaders to serve as advisors to explore the current ministry landscape, review future strategies for an effective Catholic presence in the area, and formulate recommendations for Bishop McClory's consideration.






