This coming Tuesday is the death anniversary of the first bishop of the Diocese of Gary, Bishop Andrew G. Grutka. When he passed away, the first part of our diocesan history was over. Many people took his loss to mean that all was over. But any loss is a new beginning.

When Bishop Grutka retired, the diocese was not finished, it continued with the assignment of Bishop Gaughan. When he retired, Bishop Melczek came to our diocese. When Bishop Melczek retired, Bishop Hying was assigned to us. After Bishop Hying was assigned to Madison, Wisconsin, we greeted our fifth shepherd, Bishop Robert McClory.

Endings are never final and are not really bad. Endings herald that something new is going to come about. Those new beginnings give us new promise and new hope. Each time we have been assigned a new bishop, we have looked to the future to see what we could accomplish together. Each time a bishop leaves, we will receive yet another opportunity to look ahead for the arrival of another.

The cycles of comings and goings, of looking back and looking ahead, are continuous. When we look back, we can learn from our history and change our future in positive ways. When we look to the future, we can find new hope and dream new dreams.

In the month of November, we look to the past, present, and future in an all-inclusive way as we consider our own mortality. November is the month where, more than ever, we remember the faithful departed. For non-believers, death is the ultimate thing that happens to us and, when we die, there is nothing more.

For the believer, on the other hand, we know that death is merely the entrance to eternal life. Even when we speak about our loved ones as dead, we really mean that they are removed from us on this earthly plane but we know that they are waiting for us at the end of our days.

We miss people who have gone before us but we know that we will all be reunited one day. That is the promise won for us by the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Gospel Reflection John 2:13-22



When I was 22, I entered St. Peter's Basilica for the first time. It floored me. I could hardly take it in, its grandeur, majestic arches, vibrant colors, and the light that danced through its high windows. Somehow, amidst such splendor, I felt an overwhelming sense of

belonging, as if I had finally come home.

Jesus reorients how we Catholics see sacred buildings. In today's Gospel he says, "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up" (John 2:13-22). His riddle implies, shockingly, that his own body is now the fundamental dwelling place of God and humanity. The temple in Jerusalem has been superseded.

In our churches today — whether they mirror the basilica's grandeur or embrace humble simplicity — we experience architectural symbols of Christ's risen body. It is no accident we call them "churches": they make visible in brick -and-mortar Christ's body which is made up of the living stones we call Christians. Each church building, like St. John Lateran in Rome, or St. Peter's, or any other, is meant to be a vibrant sign of Christ's resurrected body. We should cherish and protect our churches as places where heaven touches earth, where we, as a community, are raised to the fullness of life in Christ.

The Self-inflicted Pain of a Disciple

The most painful thing that disciples of Christ experience is realizing that we will inevitably sin again, despite our desire not to. Even after true repentance, contrition, Confession, sincere apologies, and the firm intention to do better and behave differently, we know that we will, in fact, hurt those we love, again. We know that we will be back – full of tears – asking Christ and others to forgive us. And we know that Christ



and those who love us will forgive us, and it will feel too easy, like we're taking advantage of them. For this, we will feel terrible guilt and, hopefully not, intense shame.

But God doesn't want us to hate ourselves, only our sinful thoughts, words, and actions. God wants us to love ourselves. And we have to believe that, because we believe God.

However, the Enemy, the Prince of Lies, wants us to take one of two courses of action, in response to our personal sins. He wants us either to believe that, since we cannot stop sinning, we are not true Christians and, therefore, should give up on trying to live the Christian life – stop being Christians, because we feel like liars and hypocrites. However, Christians who *acknowledge* their sins, and *admit* how we've not lived up to our God-given identities, are NOT hypocrites. We are sinners who persevere, trying daily to resist sin and "fight the good fight." If the first temptation doesn't work, The Accuser, our adversary, will want us, then, to give up on ourselves and, ultimately, like Judas, either become spiritually dead on the inside or actually kill ourselves – commit suicide.

When we do this, we don't allow Christ to "wash us clean" and give us hope, like He wants to and we need Him to.

When we approach Jesus Christ, we have to lead with our sins. He came to take



and conquer our sins, because we can't do it ourselves. Cry out, each and every time, "Help me, Lord! I can't stop sinning. Have mercy on me, Jesus, for I am a sinner." When we humble ourselves to the Lord, trust Him, and rely on his redemption and atonement for us, He will wash us clean and make us holy. Yet, despite being made anew, we know we, living in the flesh, will sin again, and, therefore, we see, down the road, the pain of our own cross coming again, and we shudder in fear and trembling. But we can never give up on God and His mercy, nor on ourselves and the goodness in which God made us. Friends, hang in there!

Red Ribbon Week, an annual nation-wide campaign to bring awareness to the harms of




alcohol, tobacco & drug use and a focus on violence prevention, helps students make healthy and wise choices throughout their lives.


