

#### LONG LIVE THE KING!

"A teardrop on earth summons the King of heaven." ~ Charles R. Swindoll

In many cultures, when a king died and a new king was crowned, the crowd would cheer, "The king is dead. Long live the king!" In my eyes, this was always a not-so-subtle proof at how quickly humans change their allegiance. One person is a king. That person is gone. Another one steps in. We cheer the new person and forget the old.

It seems that we are always looking for a "king" in our lives. We are ruled by different things. Some are ruled by passions such as greed, envy, or lust. Others are ruled by intellect. Still others are ruled by humanitarian concerns. We allow the things that rule us to color our decisions. At times, we go through life quite blind to others.

Today, we celebrate the Solemnity of Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. There is no mistaking His kingship and His rule. He rules with ultimate love and ultimate justice. Jesus is the King who will never be replaced for He will never die.

Jesus' rule is, indeed, a rule of love. "A teardrop on earth summons the King of heaven." Jesus cared for His people with such a depth of love that He shouldered the cross and died on it so that we could live forever. His Kingship was proven in what He said and what He did.

Jesus, our King, asks us to follow in His footsteps. He asks us to love as He loves and to forgive as He forgives. He asks us to go the distance, taking up our own crosses, in following Him. If we are willing to do so, He will be with us every step of the way. He is not reluctant to walk with His subjects. He does so willingly and with a great amount of love for us.

We begin our annual Forty Hours celebration today. Can you find some time to spend with your Lord, your King?

Today is also the last Sunday in Ordinary Time. When we return to church next week, we begin the Season of Advent, a new year in the liturgical life of the Church. The season calls us to prepare for the coming of the King when He returns in all of His glory. This weekend, we are providing reflection books for you to use throughout the Advent and Christmas seasons. I hope you find that they help you to draw closer to the Lord.

Other Kings have come and gone and still others will come and go. Our King, Jesus Christ, is eternal and will ever be at our side. That is the reason we celebrate. That is what gives us our ultimate hope. Give glory to the King of kings who, even on the cross, promised the repentant thief that the thief would be with Jesus that day in paradise.

FAITH ACTION: Ask the Lord for the courage and grace that you need to embrace His will and to live for Him so you may live with Him in paradise.





#### Gospel Reflection Luke 23:35-43

Not long ago, I was called to a hospital to anoint a woman in her early 80s. She was dying, and visibly in pain. But what struck me most wasn't her suffering — it was the atmosphere in the room. She had eight children and 30 foster kids, and many of them were gathered around her. You'd expect sorrow, fear, maybe even despair. But the room was filled with something else entirely — a quiet strength, a kind of sweetness. It



was as if she was suffering not just with them, but for them. And they, in love, were suffering for her. The pain was real. But so was the peace. I didn't want to run. I felt as if I was in a little paradise, beeping machines and all.

I think of that moment when I hear today's Gospel. Jesus, hanging on the cross, doesn't look like a king. But one of the crucified, dying men beside him sees through the suffering and says, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom" (Luke 23:42). That word — remember — literally means to make someone a member again. He's asking to be joined to Christ, to become part of his Body. And Jesus says, "Today you will be with me in paradise."

He doesn't say, "I'll take your suffering away." He says, "You will be with me."

That's the strange power of Christ the King. He doesn't rule by avoiding suffering. He reigns by entering into it, and transforming it with love.

What are you suffering right now in your life? Likely you want it to stop. But if we are willing to suffer with him — paradise begins even today.

#### Rejecting Toxic Positivity - Embracing Hope

Let's just admit it; we walk in the valley of darkness. In this life, we encounter and struggle with and against evil. We do. Let's not pretend that this life is (as my daughter says) "all rainbows and sunshine." It's not. Sometimes it hurts. Sometimes it hurts so badly that we feel like giving up. Here, we encounter people who are against us or, at least, *seem* to be. Do people



actually want us to fail, or do they, maybe, just not care if we do? God only knows, but it sure seems like it. We appear to have enemies, foes. This is our real, human experience, and we don't need to try to deny it. For, we are called to love our enemies and pray for our persecutors. So, we must actually have them. And, guess what? Sometimes we even *are* them.

You are probably already aware, but there is this thing called "toxic positivity." The phrase implies that there is a kind of "positivity" that is actually a negative or bad thing. Well, what kind is that? It's the kind of positivity that refuses to look at and deal with the dark, difficult, and destructive aspects of life. It's the kind of positivity that refuses to mourn, refuses to cry, or refuses to see that people truly suffer, even those who have faith in God. If one cannot hurt, even though people suffer in poverty, thirst, hunger, loneliness, abandonment, rejection, addiction, war, homelessness, persecution, and even their own sins, such a person cannot possibly have any compassion – meaning to "suffer with" – as we should.

Yes, we have to hold on to hope. We believe that the Lord *can* provide us with what we truly want. We believe that God *can* – in this life – give us peace, even in "the storm." God *can* lead us to rest and *can* refresh our souls. God *can* guide us, remove our fears, and give us courage. We just have to have the faith to believe that God is at our side, always. Our cups *can* overflow. We *can* have life to the fullest, only if we turn to the Lord and trust in Him. Then, despite the pains and struggles and sufferings of this life, we can bravely and compassionately look into the darkness, look into bleakness, and remain hopeful and accurately – not falsely – positive.

We believe in the power of the Holy Spirit, working in, through, and out of us, for the sake of the world. And we believe that we are promised, after this life, an eternal life, with God, in paradise. Keep hope alive.




