IS CHRISTMAS IN YOUR HEART?

"He who has not Christmas in his heart will never find it under a tree." ~ Roy L. Smit

It seems inconceivable to me that Christmas Eve is a week and a half away and, yet, that is the truth. Our work, these past couple of weeks, has been hastening us to that day, the day when we celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ, our Lord.

We have been preparing for the coming of Christmas in several ways. One of the first, and most common, of course, is our secular preparation for Christmas: buy and wrap presents, clean the house, bake cookies, address and send Christmas cards, and the like. Another way we have been preparing is spiritual: the use of an Advent wreath, a Jesse Tree, spiritual reading, reading the Bible, et cetera.

Still another way to prepare is in song. Last week at our parish, we heard the Munster Chorale present a seasonal concert. They gave us much to think about as they sang such beautiful tunes. Next Sunday, our Schola Cantorum will present Lessons & Carols, a scripture service interspersed with Advent and Christmas hymns.

We do the things that we do to prepare for Christmas so that we can engage our hearts in our pursuit of the celebration of the day. Unless our heart is in the day, Christmas might as well be another date in the calendar. Christmas is mystery. Christmas is love. Christmas is joy. Christmas is peace. Christmas is much more than a date and it needs to be treated as such.

Children understand Christmas. They know that the day itself will arrive and, with it, presents and food and drink and family and all the trappings that Christmas brings. But they know that Christmas Day is merely one day in the midst of several in which they get to do wonderful things. They get to serve others, they get to sing wondrous songs, they get to decorate the home.

In short, they know that Christmas Day is supposed to last for longer than a day.

We knew that at one point in our lives. Sadly, as we age, we begin to forget those things. We begin to see Christmas as a nuisance. We cannot wait for it to come and go so that we can take down the decorations and get back to our lives. My friends, Christmas IS our life. Let us live that today.

FAITH ACTION: In the midst of your preparations for the celebration of Christmas Day, reflect upon its true meaning and try to live that meaning to the fullest.



Gospel Reflection Matthew 11:2-11



When I was 11, I was riding my bike on a Friday night in Scottsdale, Arizona. I saw giant spotlights swirling in the sky. Something amazing had to be happening. I pedaled after them with excitement. Sweaty and tired, I arrived, only to find a used car lot. Bright lights, flapping banners, inflatable balloon men swaying wildly in the wind.

I stood there, heart sinking. All that spectacle, and all my effort ... for this?

As life proceeds, we learn what it is like to pursue promising but fruitless searches. This week we hear Jesus ask the crowds regarding John the Baptist: "What did you go out to the desert to see? A reed swayed by the wind?" (Matthew 11:7). He's not just describing the crowd's mis-aimed pursuit. He's naming our tendency to chase after what's flashy but flimsy.

What are our swaying reeds? For me, it is endless video reels on my phone, worldly pleasures, entertainment in sports, and the good opinion of others. Inflated distractions that bend whichever way the wind blows. But they can't satisfy my soul. What are your flimsy reeds?

John the Baptist wasn't a swaying reed. He was rooted, grounded, unafraid to speak the solid truth. The people went to see him because, deep down, they were starving for something real. This Advent, the Church asks us to reassess: What are we really looking for? Are we chasing the dazzling but hollow? Or are we seeking what is solid and lasting — that which points to Christ?

Your heart is broken. Did you know that?

Everybody hurts. Everybody. This fact is the essential teaching and root meaning of Original Sin. We *all* enter into this life messed up, and we *remain* messed up for the rest of it. To a certain extent, we're all "damaged goods." Even when we don't sin, we still have problems, for we all want and are tempted to sin. We are all proud and, to a certain extent, self-centered. The root of sin



is pride and self-centeredness. I tease my son and call him, "Mr. What-About-Me?!?!" (He knows it's a joke.) But, I can't give my daughter a compliment, without him needing one, too. I can't attend to someone else's needs, without him needing some attending-to, too. I'm happy to provide him with it, though.

So, what problems tempt *you* to sin? Because, like *all* of us, you've got problems, and you're tempted to sin. Don't deny it. That's the worst thing you could do with this fact. So, are you tempted by greed? Envy? Anger? Lust? Gluttony? Sloth? We all are tricked and think that sinning will soothe our broken hearts. It won't. It will just make matters worse. We think that sinning will help us handle our problems. We all feel (at times, at least, or we have felt, in the past) that no one *really* cares about us and that we, therefore, have to take care of ourselves, in order to find peace and happiness. Boy, is *that* false! You want to find peace and happiness? Take care of other people. You want to feel loved? Choose to believe that people love you. You won't even be able to feel the love of God, if you don't choose to believe that God actually loves you.

The only thing that can sooth your broken heart and help you with your problems is the love of God. And the only way to receive it is by giving God your time and attention, and that is done in *silence*.

But, we've got another problem. WE. HATE. SILENCE. We're afraid of silence, and here's why. We think that if we sit in silence, we will be overwhelmed by the thoughts of our problems. We're afraid that if we let ourselves think of our problems, we'll spiral downward and won't be able to get back up. We're afraid that we'll start crying and never stop. God will bring you back up. God will stop your tears. Trust in the Lord. Enter into silence and open yourself up to the Holy Spirit. Be not afraid. God "heals the broken hearted and binds up their wounds" (Psalm 147:3). Choose to believe it, for it is true.

Doors will be Open at 10:00 am for Volunteers to help Set Up.




