OUR RADIANT GOD

"Hope begins in the dark, the stubborn hope that if you just show up and try to do the right thing, the dawn will come. You wait and watch and work: you don't give up." ~ Anne Lamott

Hope can be a fickle thing. As humans, we put a lot of stock in hope. We hope for good grades, we hope for good friends, we hope for good jobs, we hope for good futures. We do a lot of hoping.

That is one of the things about being human. The other thing about being human is that, many times, our hopes are dashed. We find that what we have put our hope in has disappointed us. There comes a point in everyone's life where it becomes incredibly difficult to hope.

That was definitely the position of the Israelites circa the time of Isaiah. They had been a people who hoped for the coming of the Messiah. They hoped for deliverance from their enemies. They hoped for a land that they could call their own. They hoped for a future filled with peace and prosperity. And they were coming close to the end of their hope. They had had enough.

Isaiah spoke about many reasons to hope. Today, we consider one of the "O Antiphons" — "O Radiant Dawn".

How many times have poets used the image of the coming dawn? Dawn gives us the impression that the night is coming to an end, that light will defeat the dark. In the light, we will be able to see all things clearly. There will be no reason to be confused. We will be bathed in the light.

There's a reason we call Jesus the Light of the World. We long for that Light. We wait for that Dawn. We await the glory of God. Do your best to hold firm this day and to nourish your hope. Let not despair defeat you. Wait for the coming Dawn, the Light who is coming into the world!

FAITH ACTION: Pray for all those who, for one reason or another, have given up hope, that they may find it again in the Lord.



Gospel Reflection Matthew 1:18-24

A priest friend recently told me a remarkable story. One of his cousins reported having a vivid dream in which an angel told him the family needed to exhume their grandmother's body from a cemetery in New York and return it to her birthplace in Romania. She had been dead nearly 10 years. As you might expect, the family thought it was, well, crazy. But astonishingly they exhumed her body. It was incorrupt, show-



ing no signs of decomposition. That experience sparked healing, faith, and reconciliation throughout the family.

In this Sunday's Gospel, Joseph also receives a dream. He's confused, afraid. But in the quiet of sleep, God speaks: "Do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home" (Matthew 1:20). When he wakes, Joseph acts. He doesn't overanalyze or dismiss the message. He trusts, and acts.

God still speaks — not necessarily through literal dreams but through those deeper intuitions of the heart. St. Ignatius of Loyola taught that God's voice draws us into peace, courage, and love. But we have to listen to it. Advent is a time for stillness. As we prepare for Christ's coming, we're invited to enter that quiet space where God's voice can be heard.

When and how do you become most receptive to God? Is it in silence? In prayer? In nature? At Mass? This week, go there. Be still. Listen. And like Joseph, have the courage to act on what God shows you.



1. Arrive early

Holiness is not perfection.

Are we, Christians, expected to be perfect? If you just read the words of Scripture, baldly, without much recognition of style, historical context, literary genre, or traditional interpretation, it can seem like it, yes. For, in fact, Jesus says, "So be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect" (Matthew 5:48). However, in Luke's parallel passage (Luke 6:36), the word used is "merciful," not "perfect." Yet, elsewhere, Jesus says that we aren't




even good! He says, "Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone" (Mark 10:18). If we're not even *good*, how on earth can we possibly be *holy*? Well, it's through the power and grace of God alone.

"Holy" means "set apart," "different," and "outstanding" — meaning to stand out to people, because of the love that we share. We are not better than other people, and we're not supposed to think that we are, but we are supposed to be different. People are supposed to be able to recognize us as Christians by how different we are from the average person. Can they? Are we? People are supposed to be able to see our kindness, patience, and generosity. For example, they're supposed to say, about us, such things as, "Boy, he'd give you the shirt off his back, if you needed it." Or, "Wow. I've never heard her say a mean word about anyone." Or, "Even when people are insulting to her, she never loses her cool or returns their anger in kind. She's so peaceful and humble."

The Christian way of life amounts to this: trying to be loving, though you know you'll fail. Just try, anyway. There is a paradox in regard to sin. Here it is: we can avoid each and every individual sin, but we won't, in this life, be able to avoid sinning, altogether. Huh? What kind of sense does that make? For the Christian, holiness is *trying* always to be loving, though we know we can't. It's never giving up on love, on forgiveness, on reconciliation, on a renewed respect, on hope. Love is patient. Love is kind. Whenever we're not patient or kind, we're wrong. Holiness is admitting it, sincerely apologizing for it, and starting over, trying to live a life of love, yet again.

Only God is good, and when we're living a holy life, it's really the goodness of God shining through us – certainly not our own goodness. We can't make ourselves good, perfect, or holy; only God can. What we have to do is *ask* God to make us holy and *believe* that He will. This faith and trust in God are the perfection to which we are called: holiness.
