

Gospel Reflection Matthew 2:13-15, 19-23

When I was ten, my dad gathered our family around the table in small-town Vermont and told us we were moving to the big desert city of Phoenix, Arizona. We were leaving behind family, friends, and everything familiar. None of us knew what to expect.



But something beautiful happened.

As we made the move together, our family grew closer. In retrospect, I'm amazed at my parents' courage to go on that adventure. Even as a kid I realized our family found, in that challenge, a deeper unity and mutual love.

In today's Gospel, Joseph is told: "Rise, take the child and his mother, and flee..." (Matthew 2:13, 20). First to Egypt, then later to Israel. The Holy Family is frequently challenged to move and change, to adapt to God's will for them, in order to find safety in the midst of threat. It's not just an idiosyncratic story about survival. It's a spiritual pattern for all of us. Every Christian family is called to be a kind of sanctuary, especially in a world full of noise, busyness, and fear.

May I make a practical application for us? The Lord's Day, Sunday, is perhaps the most practical way we imitate this dynamic we see in Joseph and his family. Sunday is not meant to be just like every other day, filled with errands and stress. It's meant to be a day set apart; a holy "escape" into rest, worship, joy, and peace. A day to rise, take your family, and flee, into God's presence.



Let's Stop Acting Like We Know

Is the end of the world coming? Are we in the "End Times"? Is Armageddon on the horizon? Who knows!?!? But, I do know *one* thing for certain: we're not supposed to *act* like we know.

What would the world look like, if we behaved as though the end of it were imminent? Well, I think we would probably stop caring about everything. Why care about the <u>environment</u>, if the end of the world is coming? Why care about



our <u>economy</u>, if the end of the world is coming? Why care about <u>other people</u> and <u>their needs</u>, if the end of the world is coming? Why care, period?!?! Well, as Christians, we're *supposed* to care. Always. We can never *stop* caring, not about the world, not about our community, and certainly not about doing the will of God. The Christian is called to try always to bring about healing, reconciliation, and new life. If we decide that nothing really matters, because everything is about to come to an end anyway, we won't keep working on building the Reign of God and the Peaceable Kingdom, here, on Earth. We'll just, sort of, "mail it in."

We simply do not know when the end of the world will take place, though we have to be always ready. Jesus Christ tells us, "But of that day or hour, no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. Be watchful! Be alert! You do not know when the time will come" (Mark 13:32-33). Elsewhere, Scripture tells us, "So too, you also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come" (Matthew 24:44). If we have decided that the end of the world is coming, we are, in fact, expecting it, which we are told is exactly NOT when it's going to happen. Listen to Christ, and trust Him. Do not trust yourselves and human thinking, alone.

We cannot just give up on everything and not care, because we believe in and await the Second Coming. We have to be reminded to be "watchful," "alert," and "prepared," exactly because we have to carry on living just as before, as though the end of the world is NOT about to happen. If we could stop caring and give up on everything and just wait for it all to end, we wouldn't have to make sure that we were being "watchful" and "alert." All of our focus would already be on the coming of the Lord. Christians deeply care about life, history and material existence, in addition to waiting for the Lord. So, carry on, and care.


