#### THE MONTH OF THE ROSARY

"How much worse to have eyes and refuse to see." ~ Helen Keller

October is a dual month for observations. It is the month of the rosary, one of the two months each year dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary. It is also Respect Life month. I do not think it is a coincidence. I think the two go hand-in-hand.

Mary was a young maiden that prayed regularly for the deliverance of her people. They had been praying for hundreds of years for a promised Messiah. I imagine, for some, that the prayers must have become quite routine. After all, if one hopes for something for so long and it does not come about, the fervency of the prayer must wain until it becomes something that gets paid lip service.

Mary's prayer, however, was fervent and intense. When the Angel Gabriel came to her during prayer and asked her to become the mother of Jesus, she knew that she was being invited to enter a mystery that she would never be able to fathom. She said yes without reservation and brought Jesus into the world for us all. Her love of God gave us God Himself in the form of a tiny, helpless baby.

She and Joseph did everything that they could do to save their child from harm, even leaving their home and fleeing to Egypt when they were warned that Herod wanted to kill the child. I am sure that Mary's heart was hurt every time she heard about another plot against her Son's life. Ultimately, those plots would become a reality and she would stand at the foot of the cross upon which Jesus died.

She cherished the life that was entrusted to her just as all of us are called to do. All life is sacred and all life should be cherished and protected. That is the call of Respect Life Sunday. There are atrocities that take place against life each and every day.

Helen Keller's quote indicts many of us. We have eyes; but, we often refuse to see and that is a horrible tragedy. We refuse to see the poor and needy dying because they cannot receive the aid that they require in order to live. We see the sick dying because they cannot afford the medications they need to live. We see and consent to those put to death in capital punishment. We often concur with the right to die in euthanasia or doctor-assisted suicide. We stand by as atrocities against life are committed daily.

Mother Mary, ask your Son to give us the grace that we need so that we may cherish and protect all life, from the unborn to those who die a natural death.

FAITH ACTION: Gather as a family and pray the rosary together for all those people whose lives are in danger of being brought to an end.



# **Gospel Meditation**

A priest friend of mine received a call from a family whose elderly mother was dying. Within thirty minutes, he was at her bedside, offering the consolation of the sacraments, anointing her with the oil of the sick, and commending her soul to God. She passed not long after, and for months,



her family spoke of their deep gratitude for his presence. When I phoned him to commend his faithful ministry, he simply said, "I was just doing my job."

His words brought to mind Jesus' teaching this week in Luke 17:10: "So you also, when you have done everything you were told to do, should say, 'We are unworthy servants; we have only done our duty." In a world that often seeks recognition and applause, the Lord invites us into a different mindset — one of humble service. The priest did not see his response as extraordinary; he saw it as a grace to fulfill his vocation.

How tempting it is to seek affirmation for doing what I ought to do! Yet Jesus reminds us that true discipleship is not about grandstanding but about quiet faithfulness. It is enough to have served. It is enough to have loved. It is enough to be grateful that we were given the chance to do our duty in the first place. Whether in priesthood, parenthood, or any vocation, what peace -soaked freedom there is in simply doing what is asked of us. No more, no less. Jesus, that is how you quietly love us.

# **STEM Education at Work**

The importance of integrating STEM components into every day education becomes more and more important with each passing year.

At St. Thomas More School, a visit to our Makers Space STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering & Math) Lab as one our students' regular "specials" classes.

The joy, laughter and discovery that transpires each week is amazing, as students work in teams to problem solve, collaborate and innovate with astounding results.

Thanks to the creative ingenuity of STEM teacher, Brian Olmetti, students are encouraged to continually try new things, learn from their mistakes and celebrate their successes. A recent class assignment involved constructing a bridge, using cardboard and limited other classroom supplies. Students tested for bridge viability, strength and load bearing capabilities, all precursors to college level physics principals.

We are increasingly proud of our students' ability to think outside the box, decipher challenging problems, work in teams to support and test each others ideas, and use inventive tools to achieve a goal. And the best part is that they find tons of fun in this hands-on learning process.

Each year, thanks to donor support, we are able to add new equipment to our STEM lab, keeping our students scientifically current, learning and advancing.





# Stewardship Coordinator Part Time

# Diocese of Gary Pastoral Planning Process

We continue with our information on the Pastoral Planning Process for the Diocese of Gary. This week, we address a very real and sensitive question.

Is "pastoral planning" just a fancy way of saying that parishes are going to close?

While some parishes may close and merge with other nearby parishes, this is not the driving force behind pastoral planning. In order to maximize talents and resources, some church buildings may close or remain open as a worship site while the parish operations merge with another parish.

Other parishes may remain, grow in their operations or remain unchanged depending on the sacramental and pastoral needs of the local community.


