HAVE YOU BEEN SWAYED BY THE WORLD?

"One of the main reasons people fall short of their potential is they care more about looking good than getting better." ~ Adam Grant

Our human nature can be a very fickle thing and it can get us into a lot of trouble. We know that we are called by God to be a certain kind of people, to speak a certain kind of way, and to act counter to the values of the world. However, we often fall short because we allow the world to sway us.

Some people are afraid of living the Christian life to the full because they are concerned about what others may think or say of them. They can be easily influenced by others and often end up abandoning what they know to be the right thing to do.

Others are afraid of living the Christian life to the full for fear that their speech or their actions might get them into serious trouble, perhaps even arrested or killed. Remember, not all parts of the world are as amenable to people living the faith. Martyrs are not a thing of the past. They are still a modern day reality.

The followers of Christ had the same issues. They were talked about because they were counter-cultural. They also worried that they would be arrested and brought before the authorities to be tried and, possibly, convicted and put to death.

Jesus told them then what He still tells us now, "When they lead you away and hand you over, do not worry beforehand about what you are to say. But say whatever will be given to you at that hour. For it will not be you who are speaking but the holy Spirit." (Mk 13:11)

If we are confident in our relationship with the Lord, we will be in a better position to speak His words and live His love. We will not worry about what others have to say about us because we will know that we are doing the Lord's bidding. It is practically guaranteed that, if we live our lives according to the laws of God, we are going to receive trouble from the world.

The world is not interested in what we have to say because the world has drifted far from God. However, it is precisely because of that fact that we are called to proclaim the Good News. The world needs to hear about Jesus now more than ever.

It is never too late to speak up. Do not allow yourself to be swayed by the world. Hold fast to the promises of God and be His witnesses in the world today.

FAITH ACTION: Ask God for His courage in order to be His witness in the world.

Gospel Meditation Luke 17:11-19



Dorothy Day, the great Catholic activist, doubted God's existence. At least in her early adult years. But something changed when after giving birth to her daughter, she experienced an overwhelming gratitude. She later described how, as she held her daughter, the only appropriate response was a kind of unlimited gratitude. She had done nothing to deserve such a

gift — this tiny, miraculous life — but there she was, flooded with gratitude, completely undone by the love of such a Giver.

Something similar occurs in Luke 17:19 when Jesus tells a healed leper, "Stand up and go; your faith has saved you." This man had already received physical healing through his faith. But the moment of an even deeper transformation came when he turned back, fell at Jesus' feet, and gave thanks. Like Dorothy, this man's gratitude led him to encounter the Giver.

Isn't that what we want, too? Gratitude to God has the power to break our chains of sadness, bitterness, and disenchantment. It empowers us to step out of the prison of self-pity and into the reality of God's abundant love. It shifts our focus from what we lack to what we have received, from what wounds us to what heals us.

Where do we learn this? The Mass. The priest prays: "It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks." Always. Everywhere. Not just when life is easy. Not just when prayers are answered as we expect. Gratitude is not a passive feeling; it is an act of faith. In the eucharist, we remember that Christ himself has given everything for us. And in this act of gratitude, we are healed.







Diocese of Gary Pastoral Planning Process

We continue with our information on the Pastoral Planning Process for the Diocese of Gary.

Have other parishes within the Diocese of Gary participated in the Pastoral Planning process?

In 2021, five parishes located in the Merrillville area went through pastoral planning. In 2023, four Michigan City parishes participated in the process. And in 2024, the process of exploring alternative models began for fourteen parishes in East Chicago, Hammond and Whiting.

There are 41 parishes participating in the Diocese of Gary Pastoral Planning process during the Fall of 2025. These parishes are located in four planning areas: LaPorte-Starke, North Lake, Porter and South Lake.


