#### LIVE THE DREAM OF CHRIST

"I dream my painting and I paint my dream." ~ Vincent Willem van Gogh

Dying in 1890, Vincent Willem van Gogh was a Dutch postimpressionist painter. He is considered one of the most famous and influential figures in the history of Western art. In just over a decade he created about 2,100 artworks, including around 860 oil paintings, most of which date from the last two years of his life.

He had a troubled life as well. He suffered from psychotic episodes and did not take care of himself very often. His illness and his eccentricities showed forth in his passion for his art. He truly did dream his paintings and then brought his dreams into reality.

We are called to do just the same. Would that Jesus Christ would be a dream in all of our minds and hearts. If that were the case, we could bring our dreams to reality and the world would become a much better place.

There are some who have paved the way for us. We call them saints. Many of the great saints dreamed of a world that was just and charitable. They went a step further, though, and made their dreams real. They created great institutions to care for the poor and the needy. They built schools and orphanages. They built up great centers of learning. They did all of this in order to bring Christ into the world.

We talk about the Lord from time to time. We talk to the Lord from time to time as well when we go to Him in prayer. But how often do we really live our faith as brilliantly as it could be lived? How often do we go the extra mile for a person in need? How often are we willing to help someone who comes to us? How often are we willing to forgive the one who has hurt us or harmed us? These are all hallmarks of the person who is living the dream.

Jesus had a dream. He dreamed that we would live as one people united in the love of the Father. He dreamed that we would care for one another and not let division destroy us. He dreamed that all would be treated with dignity, respect, and love.

He did His part to live out the dream, going so far as to die on the cross and rise from the dead. When He ascended to the Father, He left His dream to us. He invites each and every one of us to step into His dream, make it our own, and bring it to reality in our world.

Van Gogh dared to put his dreams on canvas and brought us a richness in art that, in many ways, cannot be duplicated. Jesus dared to share His dream with us. Let us not disappoint Him.



## Gospel Reflection



When I was a kid growing up in New England, I'd occasionally go on a whale watch. Once we went out with calm waters and clear skies. But on the way back in, the sea got rough. I was just a kid, and I remember thinking we should turn left or right toward the shoreline I could see. But the pilot of the boat kept going straight — right into the waves — focused on a small, discouragingly distant lighthouse. Even

when it flickered in and out of sight, he stayed the course. He knew where he was going.

That image comes to mind when I hear Jesus' words in today's Gospel regarding false messiahs: "Do not follow them" (Luke 21:8). In times of chaos or uncertainty, there are always voices offering easier routes, promising false safety, claiming to speak for God. But Jesus isn't found in the loudest voice or the nearest shoreline. He is steady, like a lighthouse in the storm.



The tribulation of which Jesus speaks — it's real. It happened to the Temple, it happened to him, it happens in the Church, and it will come to each of us. But the command is not to panic. It's to endure. To keep steering toward him. Faith isn't about having all the answers or dodging every wave. It's about knowing where the lighthouse is — and trusting it enough to keep going, especially when false safety beckons us to stop.

#### What Do You Want?

Did you know that *love*, *joy*, *peace*, and *patience* – that which we need most in life – come only from God, through the workings of the Holy Spirit, within us? They are four of the "Fruits of the Holy Spirit" – the spiritual and attitudinal characteristics that we can "produce" (enjoy and share) only by relying upon, submitting ourselves to, and following Jesus Christ. We



live in Christ, when we open ourselves to the power and guidance of the Holy Spirit (God within us).

So often we are tricked, by the Prince of Lies, that these realities – *love*, *joy*, *peace*, and *patience* – which we desperately need, really come from the things and corporeal experiences of the world: social power, professional success, money, attention, physical pleasure, recreation, possessions, and commodities (purchases). That, my friends, is a lie. One can achieve all of these things and yet be miserable: filled with disgust, gloominess, unrest, and contrariness. Let us not be fooled; trust in the Lord and in His Holy Word.

Did you know that, according to our Lord, the "Ruler of this World" is Satan (John 12:31)? We are also taught by Sacred Scripture (the Holy Bible) that "the whole world is under the power of the evil one" (1 John 5:19). Therefore, when we want and give so much of our efforts to seeking the things of this world (identified above), we actually want and seek the things of the devil, not that which is of God. When we pursue worldly success and evaluate ourselves and our achievements according to earthly standards, we place ourselves under the authority of the Adversary. Of course, God is more powerful than the devil and has conquered his dominance. But, God has also given us free will, and the choice is ours: set your sights on earthly things or heavenly ones. And though we are certainly free, God loves us and, therefore, offers us guidance, to avoid suffering: "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth... but store up treasures in heaven... For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be" (Matthew 6:19-21).

Let the Lord give your heart the *love*, *joy*, *peace*, and *patience* that He alone can provide. That's what we really want, in this life.

Therefore, our ideals, opinions, goals, and views have to be submitted to the Lord and His teachings, in obedience, and not founded solely upon the philosophies, education, and commerce of this world (though our Catholic faith is certainly not against history, science, and human wisdom). For, when we take on the mind of Christ, we find the life that we really want.


