OUR BAPTISM HAS CRITICAL IMPLICATIONS

"As we were baptized, so we profess our belief. As we profess our belief, so also we offer praise. As then baptism has been given us by the Savior, in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost, so, in accordance with our baptism, we make the confession of the creed, and our doxology in accordance with our creed." ~ Saint Basil

St. Basil does not pull any punches. Neither does the Church. We are baptized for a critical reason. It is not to join an elite club. It is not to garner prizes. It is not for any kind of human recognition. It is so that we could become a son or daughter of God, immerse ourselves in the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, and live the profession of our faith to its fullest.

When Jesus submitted Himself to baptism by John the Baptist in the Jordan River, He desired to fulfill the prophecies regarding Him. John the Baptist knew that Jesus did not need to be baptized, that Jesus was, indeed, the giver of baptism. However, John acquiesced to Jesus' instructions and baptized Him. Thus began Jesus' public ministry.

Our public life in the Church began at our own baptisms. At that moment, the stain of original sin was washed clean of our souls so that we would have the opportunity one day to return to God after our mortal death here on earth. Our baptism also gave us great responsibility. We are charged with proclaiming the Good News of the Lord so that we can win over as many as possible in our day.

The waters of baptism are given freely for all people. Not all people want them, however. Nor do all people know about them. That is why we have to become just as public in our faith as Jesus was in His. We need to make sure that all people have, at least, the chance to hear about Jesus' life-saving love so that they can have the choice to turn their lives over to Him.

We were baptized in the faith. Our parents and godparents accepted the responsibility of raising us in the faith. Most of us took the initiative to embrace the demands of the faith on our own when we were confirmed. Now, we need to do more than talk about it. We need to live it.

The profession of the creed is more than words. It is a reminder of how we are to live our lives each day.

FAITH ACTION: Reflect upon the words of the Creed today and accept the responsibility to live life to its fullest in the name of Jesus Christ.

Gospel Reflection Matthew 3:13-17

Apple ran a commercial not long ago called "Behind the Mac – Greatness." It shows artists and creators, such as Kendrick Lamar, Billie Eilish, and Lady Gaga, working behind their MacBooks. The narration says, "There's a certain kind of person who doesn't wait for greatness. They make it." It's a compelling message. There's beauty in using our gifts with passion and purpose. But there lies a hidden weight in that idea: If you are what you make, what happens when you can't anymore? When the project fails, the passion fades, or the spotlight moves on, where is greatness then?



Today's Gospel offers a differing vision of greatness. Jesus steps into the Jordan River. He hasn't preached, healed, or performed a single miracle. Then the heavens open, and the Father speaks: **"You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."** It's not a reward for success. It's not earned. Before he does anything "great," Jesus receives the greatness of his identity from the Father.

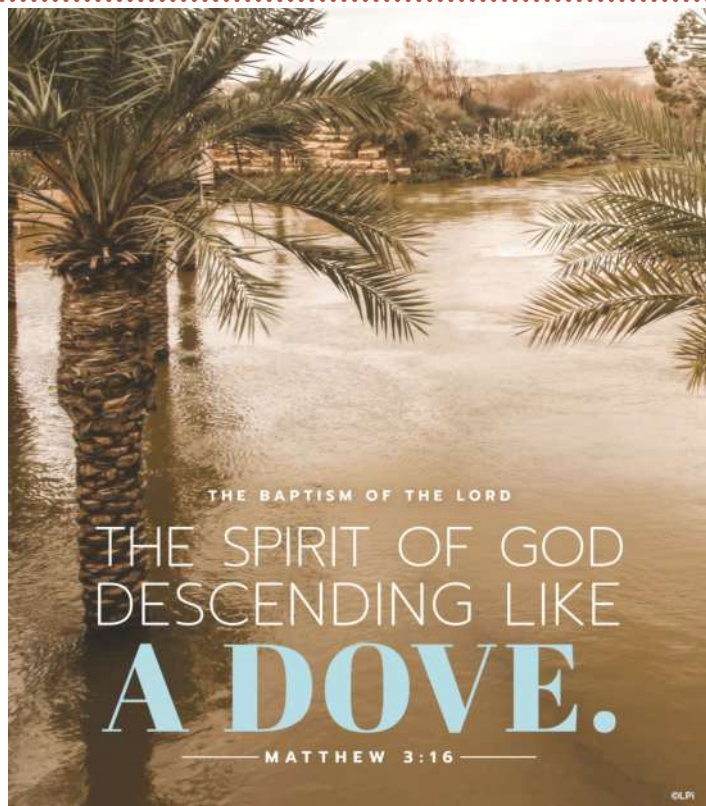
And so do you. At your baptism, God said the same thing over you: "You are my beloved." That is your true identity, not constructed or earned but received. When we see ourselves and others this way, everything changes for the better. We discover a greatness that can never be taken away.

This week, reflect on your baptism: look up the date, thank God for it, pray for those baptized with you, or visit the church where it happened. Let your identity be rooted there.

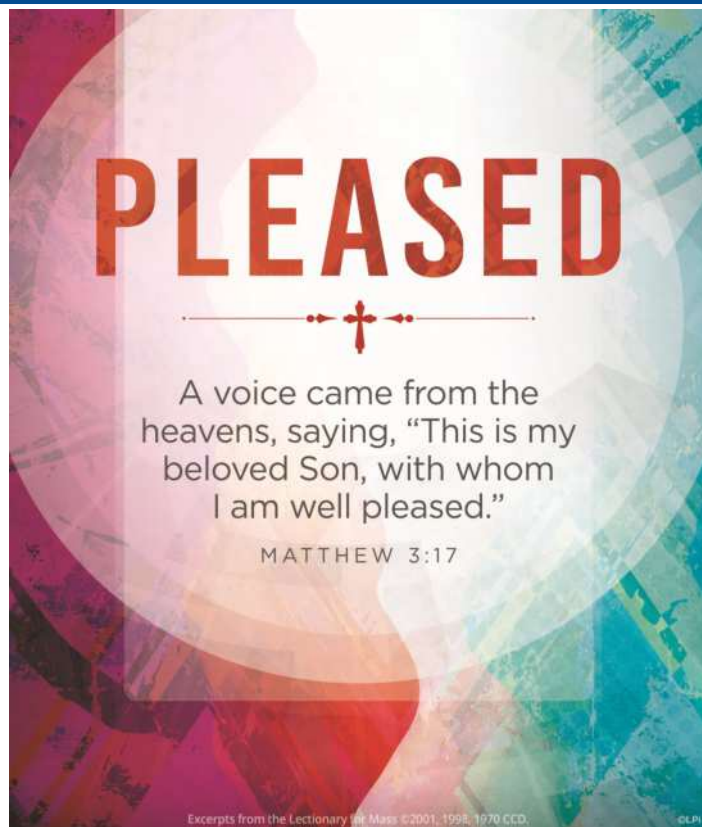

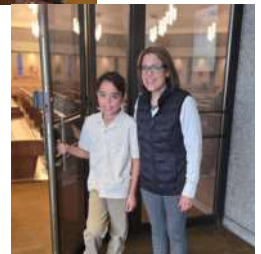

"John tried to prevent him, saying, "I need to be baptized by you, yet you are coming to me?" MATTHEW 3:14

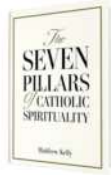

Shhhhh! Wait. What?

A person is always welcome to pray,
personally, in a church. However, since a
church is fundamentally a communal place,
it doesn't make much sense to expect
people to be silent, there, so that a person
can pray privately. Yes, people are expected
to be *reverent* in church. But, reverence
does not require silence.

Reverence is *respect* for holy things and places. We can
communicate with others and still be respectful of a holy space.
How one speaks is what matters.

Jesus tells us how to pray: "go to your inner room, close the
door, and pray to your Father in secret. And your Father who
sees in secret will repay you" (Matthew 6:6).

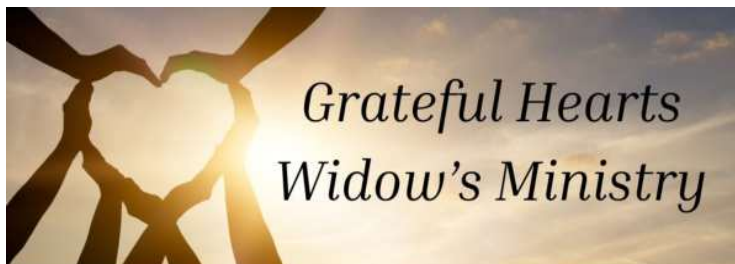
But, perhaps one wants to pray in the presence of Jesus Christ in
the Blessed Sacrament. OK. That's totally understandable.
Therefore, maybe the small, Eucharistic chapel is the best place
for one to pray privately and personally in the presence of the
Eucharist.

However, despite our belief in the enduring and True Presence
of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist, we still have to remember two
very important Christian tenets. One, Catholics believe in God's
immanence. Well, what does that mean? It means that we
believe that, though God is transcendent (beyond and "above"
all of His creation), God is present in all of His works – here
and now. He's everywhere, especially in **YOU**, wherever you
go. Therefore, you need not be in a sanctuary, in order to have
God with you.

Secondly, Jesus Christ, in the Blessed Sacrament, is not lying
like a dead corpse, at a funeral. We do not have to be somber
and stoic, when in the presence of the Eucharist. We can be
joyfully expressive and communicative.

In Christianity, we are expected to love both God and neighbor.
Therefore, we do not come to church solely to show our love
and thanks for God. We also come to church to show our love
and thanks for one another.

Whenever we give a "dirty" look (and we *all* do it), even at
someone who's behavior is wrong, we're never in the right. It's
unkind. It's impatient. It's judgmental. It's divisive. And it
should be avoided. The best thing to do, when we believe that
someone is behaving inappropriately in church, is to approach
them calmly, with a genuine smile, and say something like,
"Would you mind not doing that? I'm finding it disruptive. I'm
sorry to have to ask you this, but I'd really appreciate it." We
can expect certain behavior from one another, but we always
have to be kind, whenever we are trying to correct it and request
different actions. So, let's not make people feel bad, for
communicating in church.

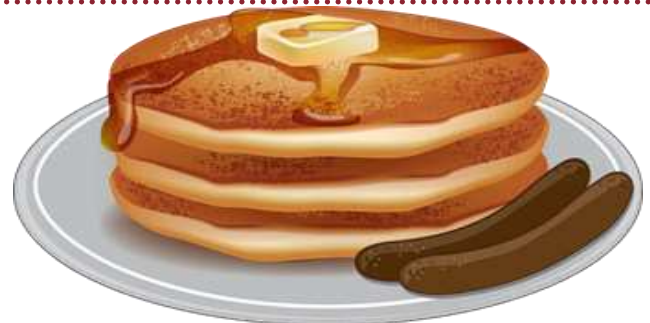

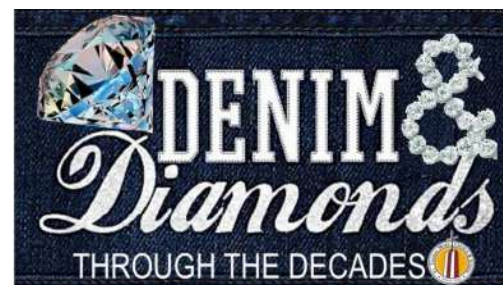
December Eagle Awards
