I have always loved *The Sound of Music*. Not only because of the time of the world in which it took place but also because of the relationship with a governess who wanted to become a nun, a widower who had lost control over his children and who was stepping into a wrong relationship with another woman, and the children who so desperately needed continuity. They needed parents who cared for them, shaped them, supported them, and loved them.

Isn't it that way with all of us?

I view my life these past forty-three years as a priest very much like a person who has tried to provide for so many people in so many circumstances. Sometimes, the past has dragged me down. Sometimes, I didn't have what was needed. Sometimes, I was the one in need.

Life is difficult. Even the best intentioned can fall flat on their faces.

I came here twenty-three years ago, never thinking that I would be here this long. By the time I arrived here as the new pastor, I had already "cut my teeth" on other pastorates that challenged me. From pastoring an inner city parish with a school that was failing, to a maximum security prison community, to a parish that had never had a pastor except their founding pastor, and to a parish where they had a pastor for twenty-seven years, those challenges prepared me to come here.

There were challenges that I encountered when I came to St. Thomas More. We were close to being financially insolvent upon my arrival and building up our bank account and reserves was a first priority. I realized that building up trust between pastor and parishioner was going to be essential as well since that trust had eroded with the former pastor.

Yes, we went through some difficult times and we went through some disappointing times. But we got through them and we grew closer together because of them. We did it. It took time but we made St. Thomas More ROCK!

Thank you to all who accepted me and my ministry. Your support meant so much to me and I hope that I was able to provide what you needed. I will never forget you. And now, like Friedrich in the *Sound of Music*, "I leave and heave a sigh and say goodbye."

Gospel Reflection

13th Sunday in Ordinary Time Matthew 10:37-42



I still remember the first homily I ever preached as a new deacon. It was at the seminary, and the Gospel was this one: **“Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me.”** (Matthew 10:37-38) Standing before more than 200 classmates and professors, I stumbled awkwardly through my words and realized how strange — almost insane — this teaching sounded. If anyone else said it, we would call it narcissistic or cultish.

And that is the point. I felt the weight of those words in my own heart then, as I still do today. Am I willing to live as though Christ’s claim on my love is absolute? Are you?

Over the years, I’ve learned that the more I do, the more everything else makes sense. Family, friendships, vocation, even my very self: all of it falls into place when my love for Jesus comes first.

That is why he dares to speak this way. Our Lord is not a cult leader hungry for control. He is the Son of God, the source of life and love itself. To put him before everything else is not to lose, but to find...everything, and everyone, in him.

This week, name one thing or one person you are tempted to place before the Lord. Then consciously offer it back to him in prayer.

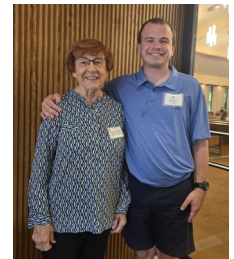

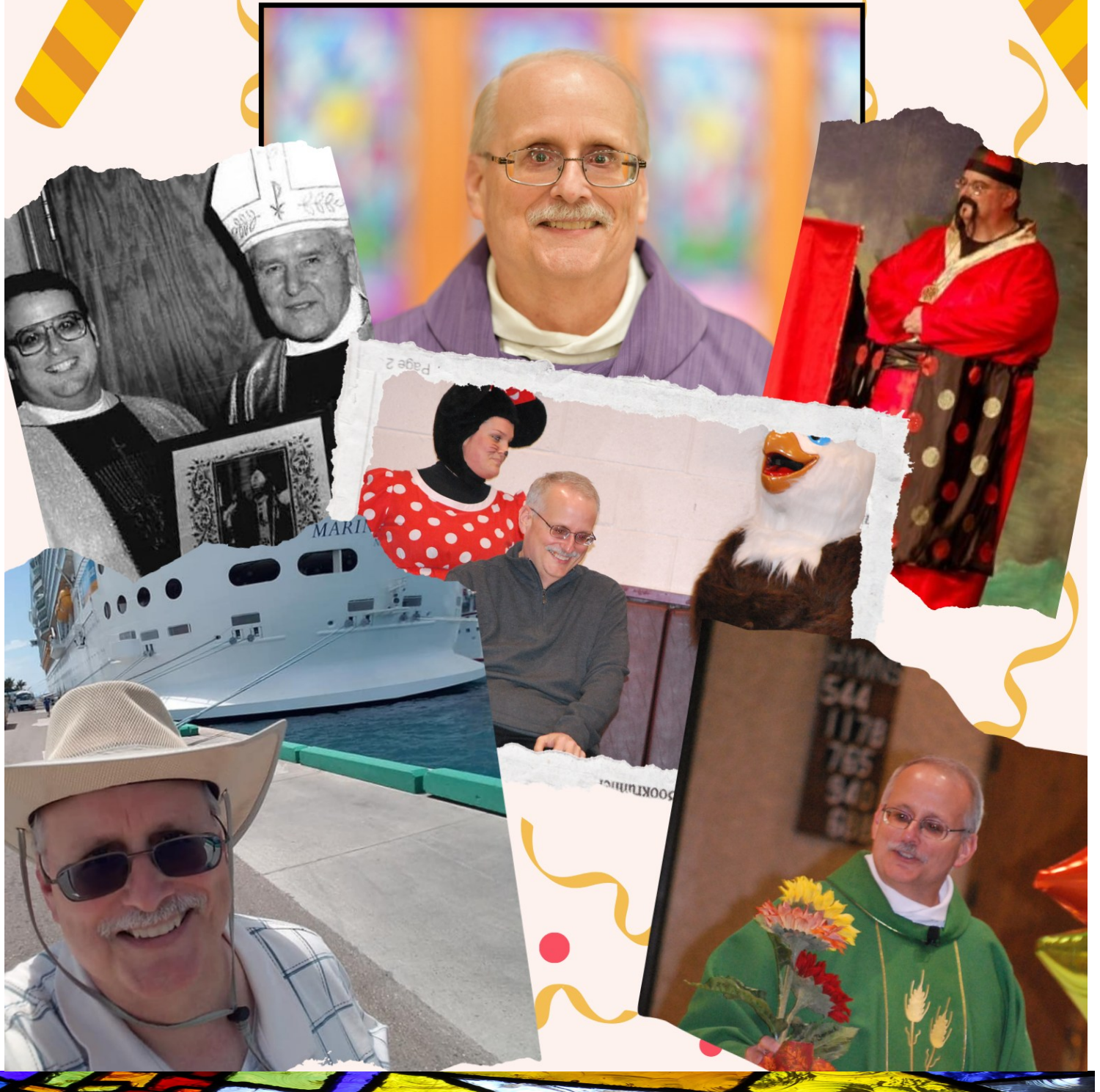

We're not checking off boxes

Years ago, when my sister was a member of Our Lady of Knock Parish, she'd often speak of a friend, who was Catholic, but regularly said something that bothered my sister. Her friend attended the weekend Mass on Saturdays, but that's not what irked my sister, of course. What she didn't appreciate was how her friend, on Saturdays, would say, "Well, I'm off to Mass, *to get it out of the way.*" My sister isn't a judgmental person, but she bristled whenever she heard that. To her, that sounded like her friend viewed Mass as an obligation that she needed to get over with, so she could have Sundays to herself. She felt her friend had a misunderstanding of Mass. She'd say, "We're not supposed to get Mass 'out of the way.' We're supposed to *want* to go and appreciate the *opportunity.*" I never *fully* agreed with my sister, but I could understand why she didn't think her friend's phrase was a good one.



I think it's a contradiction in terms to say that a person is "supposed to want." How's that possible? If a person is "supposed to" do something, it's an obligation. But, if someone does "want" to do something, it necessarily means that it isn't imposed, but, rather, happily chosen.

My favorite theologian, Paul Tillich, a professor and Lutheran minister, seemingly would formulate his own words. For example, he analyzed the nature of religious actions with such terms as "autonomous," "heteronomous," and "theonomous." Huh? Where'd he get that last one? Oh yeah, he made it up. Despite his tendency to write his own dictionary, Tillich always offered great insight. There are two kinds of action, said Tillich, that aren't really Christian: autonomous and heteronomous ones. An *autonomous* action is one that a person chooses based solely on his or her own inclinations, reasoning, or goals, taking nothing else into consideration. Conversely, a *heteronomous* action is one that a person chooses based solely on *outside* influences, such as rules imposed by God, social norms and expectations, or the threat of punishment. But, the *theonomous* action is the truly Christian kind. It's taken because one feels called to do it, by God's inspiration emanating from within. It is *freely chosen*, because one *wants* to do the will of the Father, just like Jesus Christ did.

Obligations can be good, but only when they are personal responses to God, calling to you, from within. Good obligations must be self-imposed. The Christian freely chooses to be obligated to God.

Therefore, let's attend Mass not because we want to "look good," are afraid of God's punishment, or seek a reward (blessing). Let's go to Mass *only* if we feel led and inspired by God to do so. God the Son, Jesus Christ, is *always* calling us to His table, to receive His Body and Blood. Come to Mass, only if you *want* to give thanks for this call and be one with God and God's people.
