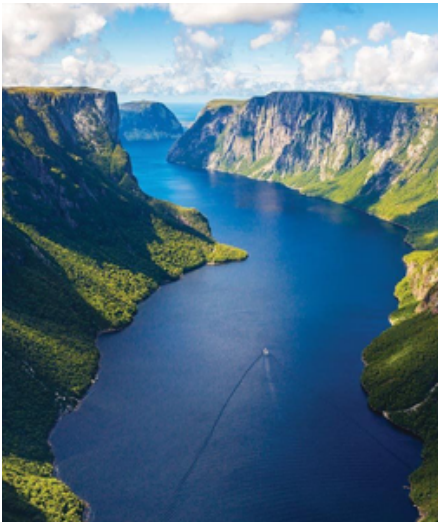

Day-to-Day Itinerary - Coach/Fly Tour (June)

Day 1: Arrive in Deer Lake, Gros Morne National Park: Tablelands

Fly into Deer Lake, located on the west coast of the province, where you'll meet your tour director and begin your Newfoundland adventure. Upon arrival, enjoy a complimentary boxed lunch as you journey into the breathtaking landscapes of Gros Morne National Park, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Discover the extraordinary geology of the Tablelands during a guided tour that brings this unique terrain to life. Later, check in to your hotel and freshen up for an included group dinner followed by lively local musical entertainment, a perfect introduction to Newfoundland's warm hospitality and vibrant culture.

Day 2: Gros Morne National Park: Western Brook Pond Cruise or Bonne Bay Cruise

After breakfast, choose between two unforgettable adventures in Gros Morne National Park. Option one is a lively, narrated boat cruise through the scenic waters of Bonne Bay*, where you'll learn about the area's rich natural and cultural history. Alternatively, take a leisurely 45-minute walk across the coastal plain to the dock for a cruise through the dramatic, landlocked fjord of Western Brook Pond, renowned for its towering cliffs and pristine beauty. After returning to shore, sit down to an included dinner and enjoy an evening of local entertainment.

Stay: Shallow Bay Motel, Cow Head, NL (1 night)

Day 3: The Great Northern Peninsula, Port au Choix National Historic Site

Enjoy a relaxed start to the day as you journey along Newfoundland's Great Northern Peninsula, the province's longest and one of its most scenic. Travel the rugged coastline with photo stops along the way, including the striking rock formations known as The Arches, a natural wonder carved by wind and sea. In the afternoon, visit the historic octagonal Point Riche Lighthouse before exploring the Port au Choix National Historic Site. This remarkable archaeological site sheds light on the lives of various Indigenous groups who once thrived here, showcasing original artifacts and a life-sized recreation of a traditional Dorset dwelling. Gain a deeper appreciation for the region's cultural heritage during an interactive seal skin demonstration highlighting the historical importance of seals in daily life.

Stay: Plum Point Motel, Plum Point (2 nights)

Day 4: Grenfell House, L'Anse aux Meadows

Travel to the northern tip of the Great Northern Peninsula and visit St. Anthony, home to the Sir Wilfred Grenfell Medical Interpretation Centre. Learn about Dr. Grenfell's lasting impact on the region through his work in healthcare and education. Then, explore L'Anse aux Meadows, the only authenticated Viking site in North America. This UNESCO World Heritage Site features reconstructed Norse buildings and a museum that brings Leif Eriksson's historic landing to life.

Day 5: Gander, Come from Away Hero Meet & Greet

Enjoy a relaxing travel day as we travel through the heart of this breathtaking province. After stopping for lunch, continue to Gander, a city made famous for its warm hospitality during the tragic 9/11 crisis. Did you know this town of less than 12,000 people took in almost 6,000 guests while all the planes were grounded? Get a first-hand account of the event from one of the local heroes and character inspiration for the play Come from Away!

Day 6: Prime Berth Fishery & Shed Party

Today's travels take you to Twillingate to visit Prime Berth Twillingate Fishery & Heritage Centre, a private interpretative fishing centre and craft studio created by David Boyd as a tribute to his family's generations of fishermen. Tour through seven different buildings, including a 100+ year old fish store and net loft, touch two different Sei whale skeletons, learn how to split cod, and more! Then, grab your ugly

stick and master this iconic Newfoundland instrument during a shed party. This long-standing tradition will have you dancing, singing, and laughing. On your way to Clarenville, stop at the Gander Airport, then travel through picturesque villages to arrive in Clarenville.

Day 7: Bonavista Lighthouse, John C. Crosbie Interpretation Centre and Memorial

Enjoy a scenic day trip to the vibrant town of Bonavista, where you'll visit the iconic [Cape Bonavista Lighthouse](#) and take in sweeping coastal views along picturesque walking trails. Stop at Dungeon Provincial Park to witness the dramatic sea-carved landscape, an impressive result of ancient sedimentary rock shaped by centuries of relentless North Atlantic waves. Explore the [John C. Crosbie Interpretation Centre and Memorial](#) to learn about the lives of Newfoundland's historic sealing communities. Before returning to the hotel, enjoy Trinity, a beautiful, quintessential Newfoundland town, with historic sites, colourful buildings with white picket fences, artisan shops, and stunning coastal views. This evening, enjoy dinner on your own in Clarenville, with a variety of local dining options to choose from.

Day 8: Cape Spear & St. John's Guided Tour

After breakfast, begin your day at Cape Spear, the easternmost point in North America. Take in sweeping ocean views and explore the historic [Cape Spear Lighthouse](#), the oldest surviving lighthouse in Newfoundland. From there, continue along the scenic Avalon Peninsula to the province's lively capital, St. John's. Following lunch, enjoy a guided city tour of [St. John's](#), one of the oldest settlements in North America. Discover its rich history, admire the iconic jellybean row houses, and visit the bustling harbour that has long been the heart of the city. After checking in to your centrally located hotel, the evening is yours to explore at your own pace. Consider visiting [George Street](#), the city's famed entertainment district, known for its lively pubs, restaurants, and live music.

Day 9: Whale-Watching Tour, Choice of Museum

Today, take a memorable cruise out of Bay Bulls en route to Witless Bay Ecological Reserve. This protected area is home to over 500,000 Atlantic Puffins and the largest humpback whale population in North America. Keep your eyes open for a friendly whale wave! In the afternoon, choose between [The Rooms](#), a museum devoted to the colourful history and creative spirit of the Indigenous people of Newfoundland or [Johnson Geo Centre](#), a museum dedicated to the Earth's story. Afterwards, meet back up with the group and enjoy a farewell dinner.

After breakfast, it's time to say goodbye to your new favourite destination. Arrive at the airport for an afternoon flight and enjoy the journey home.

This is a fast-paced tour, designed to showcase the best of Newfoundland in a short timespan.

This itinerary features several boat cruises. While most guests won't need any medication, those prone to motion sickness may want to bring along remedies just in case.

The weather in Newfoundland varies from day to day and can be cool and windy, even in the summer.

Tablelands Trail Hike

This is a moderate walk on a gentle trail with a packed but uneven surface. The walking distance 1-3km does not provide a place to rest, and there is some standing while listening to the local guide, as the unique geology of this area is explained.

Western Brook Pond Boat Tour

The walk to the Western Brook Pond Boat Tour is along a moderate 3 km trail (approx. 45 min walk each way) that leads from the parking lot down to the dock.
