

TRI Applicability Quick Checklist

Use this quick checklist to help determine whether your facility may need to submit a Toxic Release Inventory (TRI) Form R report.

Answering “Yes” to several of these questions may indicate your facility should conduct a TRI applicability review.

1. Does your facility operate in a covered industry such as manufacturing, metal fabrication, chemical production, hazardous waste treatment, or petroleum bulk storage?

2. Does your facility have 10 or more full-time equivalent employees?
