Cooler temperatures are upon us and with that brings my favorite seasons of Florida... Fall, Winter and Spring. It is time to get outside and really enjoy the many parks

and outdoor spaces of Wekiva. From the playgrounds and ball fields to the tennis and pickleball courts to the miles of walking paths, I hope everyone takes the opportunity to get outside and enjoy the beautiful weather in the coming months.

You may have noticed the construction of the improved crosswalk on Hunt Club Blvd between Wekiva Hills Park and Wekiva Lake Park, just south of the HOA Office/Community Center and Beaufort Drive. The HOA has been working with Seminole County in the recent months to get flashing yellow lights known as 'Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons (RRFB)' installed to improve the safety for pedestrians crossing Hunt Club Blvd. Studies have shown that RRFBs can result in motorist yielding rates as high at 98% at marked

crosswalks and reduce pedestrian crashes up to 47%. The electrical infrastructure to support the RRFBs should be completed in the coming weeks and final completion of the RRFBs by November, fingers crossed. I highly encourage everyone to use the improved crosswalk when crossing Hunt Club Blvd and for motorists to be on the look out for the flashing yellow lights.

Wekiwa Springs State Park is a great place to cool off in the 72-degree water during the 'dog days' of summer indeed but as the cooler temperatures set in, don't forget about the many miles of hiking trails the park offers as well. My wife and I hike and trail run there pretty much every weekend and always see deer, rabbits, turkeys, fox squirrels, gopher tortoises and if we are lucky, a bear. It is a great place to visit Mother Nature and immerse yourself in her splendor.

I will leave you with this quote from Mary Davis, "To walk in nature is to witness a thousand miracles."

Did you know that everyone who buys a home in Wekiva should be aware of the Covenants and Restrictions for our homeowner's association? The Covenants, defined as an agreement, and the Restrictions, defined as an official rule that limits what you can do, are in place to protect you, the homeowner, and the investment you have made in your property. Every owner who purchases a home in our community automatically must abide by these.

Our newsletter is one of the main ways we communicate to our owners and residents important information regarding our community. Our website, wekiva.net, is another important source of current information about our community. Finally, our office staff is available most days of the week to help with any questions.

ACC

Always remember to submit an ACC Form for approval for anything you plan to do to the exterior of your home. If in doubt, call the office for guidance. Our rules change over time and every homeowner needs to follow the current rules.

VIOLATIONS

The process we use to monitor compliance of the Covenants is it to inspect all the homes within Wekiva on a regular basis. We inspect for the condition of lawns, beds, shrubs, bike paths, fences, screen enclosures, homes and other structures. We also inspect for storage of items, prohibited vehicles, trash cans, and other violations.

Only a very small number of homes end up fined or in legal action. The majority of homeowners contact the office staff and together they are able to come up with a resolution to resolve any issues in a reasonable timeframe.

Thank you for working with all staff members to help keep Wekiva a safe and beautiful place to live. We enjoy speaking with homeowners and guiding them with any questions they may have about our community.

HALLOWEEN SAFETY/ NIGHT WALKING

- Cross the street at corners, using traffic signals and crosswalks. Look left, right and left again when crossing and keep looking as you cross.
- Put electronic devices (cell phones) down, keep heads up and walk, don't run, across the street.
- Teach children to make eye contact with drivers before crossing in front of them.
- Always walk on sidewalks or paths. If there are no sidewalks, walk facing traffic as far to the left as possible. Children should walk on direct routes with the fewest street crossings.

SECURITY & SAFETY



HALLOWEEN SAFETY/ NIGHT WALKING CONTINUED

- Watch for cars that are turning or backing up. Teach children to never dart out into the street or cross between parked cars.
- Join kids under age 12 for trick-or-treating. If kids are mature enough to be out without supervision, tell them to stick to familiar areas that are well lit and trick-or-treat in groups.

There is danger in the dark - the biggest being vehicles that don't expect you or can't see you. Drivers cannot easily see you through fogged windows and poor weather, and their night vision dims as they age. Wearing dark clothes, you are as invisible as a ninja during your early morning or evening walks in the winter darkness. We need to walk defensively and take pains to be visible and use sidewalks when available.

Reflections on reflectivity: Wearing reflective clothing is a good defense against invisibility, but you need to be sure that the reflective areas are large enough and are exposed from every angle. Do oncoming cars see you, but not those at side streets? Will that little reflective logo on your shirt be enough - especially if you hide it under a jacket?

Reflective Shoes: Most running shoes now have reflective stripes and many even have "360 degree reflective" features, some even sport reflective soles! If you're walking shoes don't have such features, consider a pair of reflective shoelaces or put some reflective tape on your shoes.

Reflective Clothing: Your best for finding reflective clothing is in a running store or a bicycling shop, or the running and bicycling sections of large sporting goods stores.

Reflective Outerwear: In winter, wearing an extra vest or a reflective jacket can also help keep you warm.

Reflective Vests, Wristbands and Hats: Other items to consider are reflective velcro wristbands to wear on wrists and ankles, a reflective sweatband and a reflective cycling hat. Also, now available are inexpensive L.E.D. vests, wristbands and hats.

Help improve the quality of our waterways. Follow these simple rules:

FERTILIZE WISE: Fertilizer containing nitrogen or phosphorus cannot be applied between

June 1st though September 30th (use iron and other micronutrients, "summer blends").

KNOW SLOW: During the non-restricted season only use 50% or more slow release nitrogen.

PHOSPHORUS-FREE: Fertilizers containing phosphorus cannot be applied, so look for the "0" in the middle (15-**0**-15).

BUFFER ZONE: No fertilizer may be applied within 15' of any waterbody or wetland.
