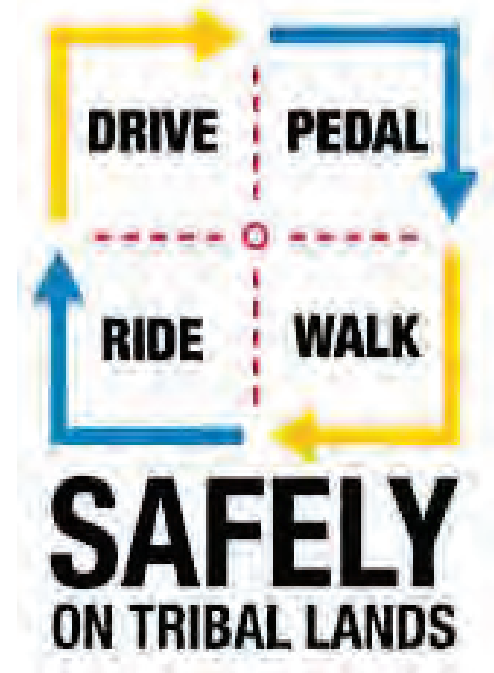

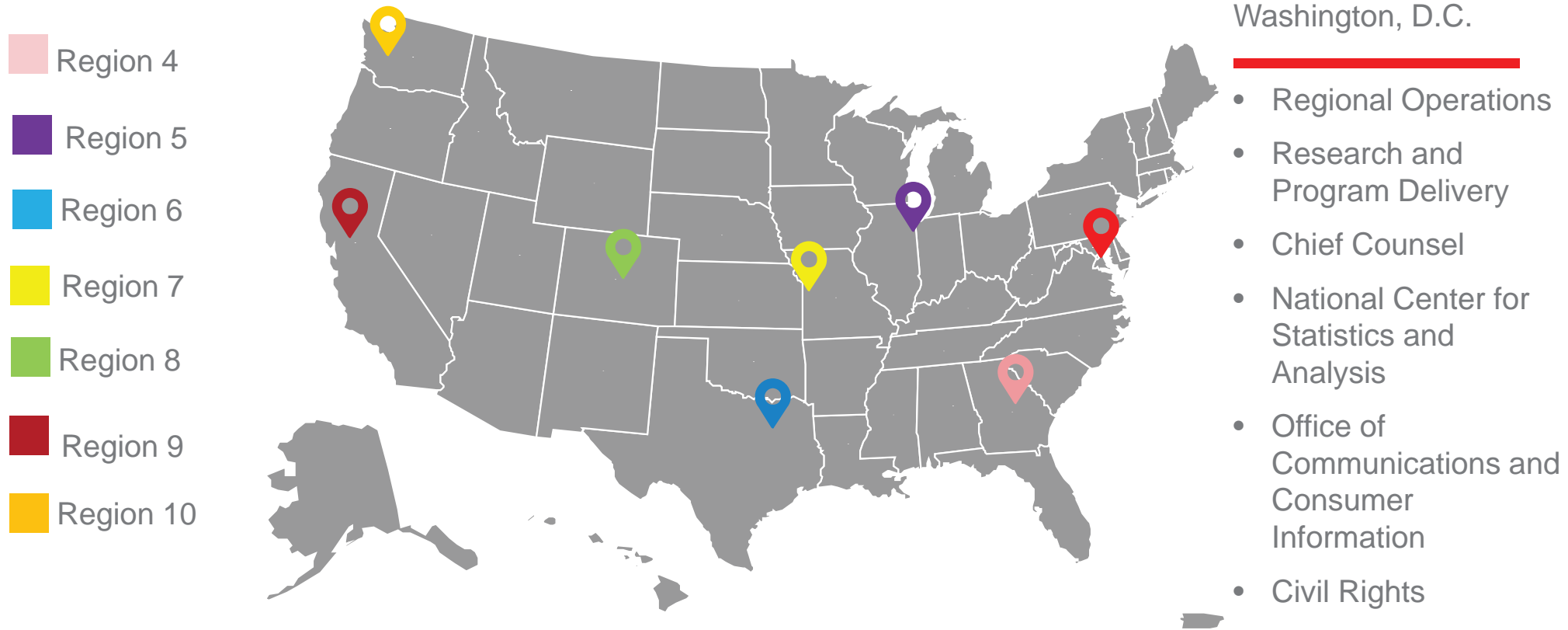

Motor Vehicle Crash Fatalities in the Four Corners Region (2013-2019)



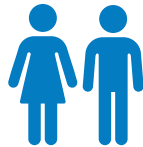
583 Total fatalities over a seven-year period



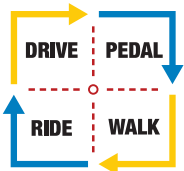
Average of **83** fatalities each year

Motor Vehicle Crash Fatalities in the Four Corners Region (2013-2019)



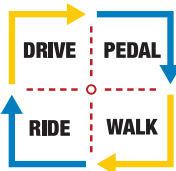
43% involved an intoxicated driver (BAC .08+)



36% involved speeding



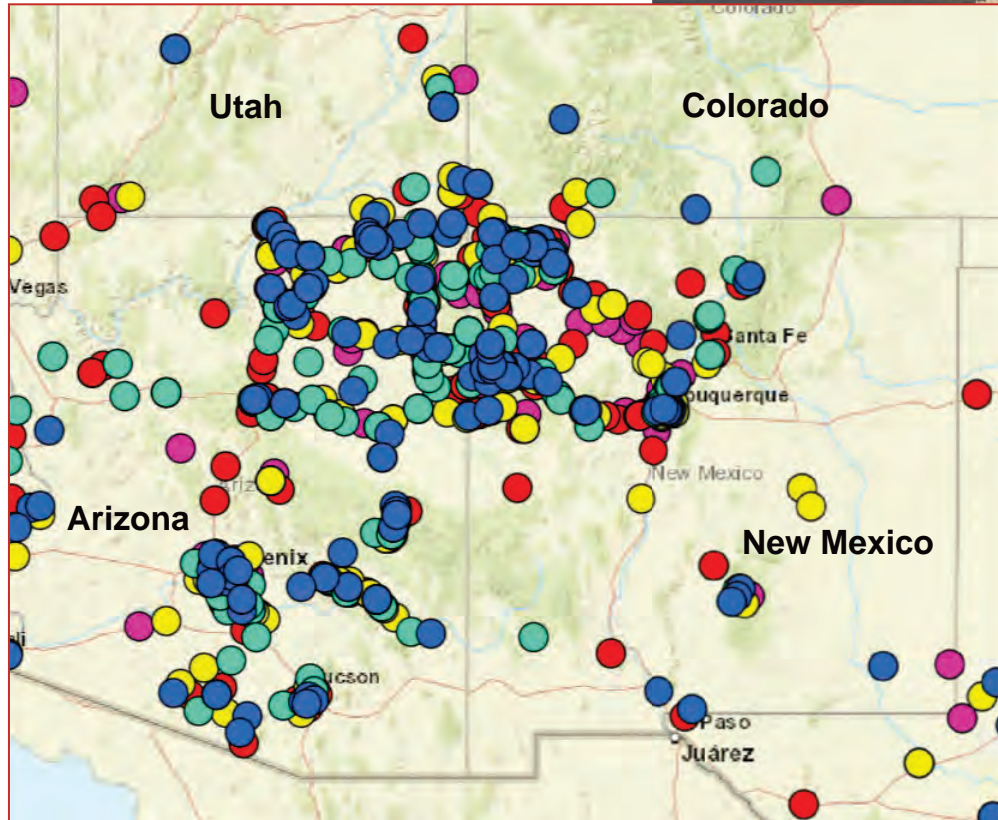
18% (104) of fatalities were pedestrians/bicyclists



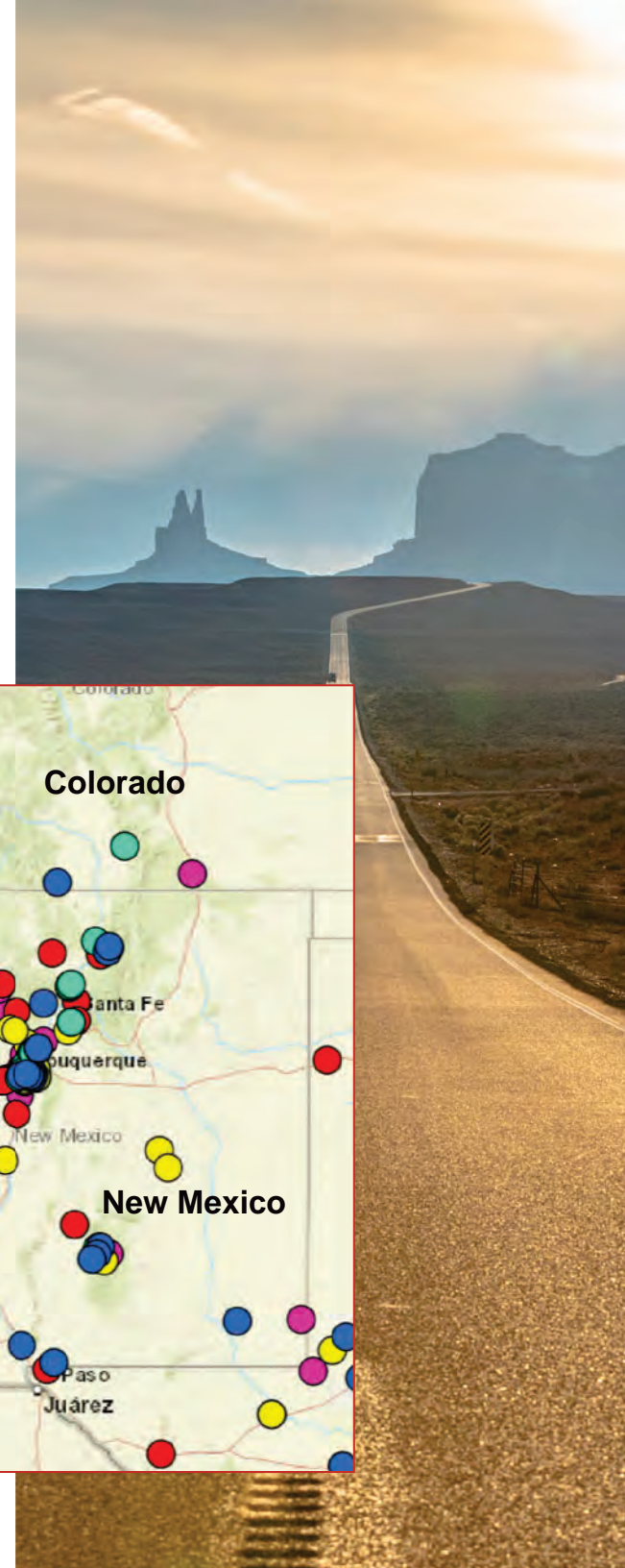
