Construction: Spectrum will complete moving their wires by 8/18/23. Brightspeed will then complete moving their wires and finally AEP will then remove wooden poles. Construction of the County Line Pathway should begin in September.

The 103 Pathway construction is set to begin 8/14/13 from the east end.

Acknowledgement Signs: Jesse and Mitch have talked with Adam of Masterpiece Signs. There will be 2 signs. Placement of the County Line Road sign is possible across from Cherry Street by the apartments or on property in front of Bluffton Child Development.

Placement of the 103 sign is possible on the southside of 103 by the crossover of the pathway or on the north side of 103 by the crossover close to Wendy's. There was discussion about placing a bench and landscaping by each sign.

Construction: 103 Project: Bryan advised that work on the 103 project was progressing but is slightly behind schedule due to heavy rain. Bryan will facilitate coordination between the SR 103 Pathway Contractor and the County Line Pathway Contractor (Don Snyder) to assure that grade and infrastructure match up properly where the pathways meet.

<u>County Line Project</u>: One remaining support pole and some underground phone wires need to be managed by their companies; when that work is complete, the base/infrastructure subcontractor, Nate Frahm, will proceed with installation. Pathway work by Don Snyder and the paver will ensue. The seeding of the grass must take place by mid-October for germination to be guaranteed. If no seeding is done until spring erosion is a possibility. Final decision on seeding will be made in response the status of the construction in early October.

Contributions: We currently have \$71,174.74 pledged with only \$1,000 yet to be collected. An article in the ICON will let the public know that we are nearing our goal of \$90,000 in donations and will welcome all contributions to the cause.

Dedications: There will be separate pathway dedication programs depending on completion dates. However, it now seems likely both dedications will be in spring of 2024. The location of signs still needs further attention. The board presently feels the County Line Pathway sign should be placed near the path in front of the Child Development Center.

The strength of the BRWP continues to be collaboration with communities, various agencies, other non-profit groups, and citizens all working towards improved water quality.

The BRWP has accomplished a significant amount of work this year. Because of your support, we have been able to continue our education and outreach efforts. This year, we hosted Findlay's first ever Earth Week. During this event, over 93,000 pounds of litter were collected and over 1,500 tires were recycled, as our community learned about litter in the Great Lakes. We have successfully implemented over 3,000 acres of best management practices in Putnam and Allen County, which will prevent pollutants from reaching Lake Erie. Additionally, we secured over \$140,000 in grant funds which have facilitated our work with landowners within the Lower Riley Creek watershed in Putnam and Allen County. These grant funds will allow us to continue working with these landowners through 2023 to pursue water quality improvement efforts.

We have big plans for the upcoming year, none of which will be possible without continued support from our valued partners. Thank you for your continued support and collaboration. We look forward to continuing our service to the Village of Bluffton for many years to come!
