Staff present: Jesse Blackburn, Village Administrator, and Kevin Nickel, Fiscal Officer. Allen County Representatives present Brad Niemeyer, Sanitary Engineer, Ronald Meyer, Assistant Sanitary Engineer and William Horvath, Operations Manager.

The Fiscal Officer presented a billing spreadsheet detailing a method of charging the Allen County Sanitary system to accept sewerage into the Bluffton Village system. The formula is based on the Ottawa water contract billing.

There was discussion with the Allen County representatives regarding what properties could be included in a drafted contract to be negotiated with Bluffton to treat sewage received from the Allen County Sanitary Sewer District operations in Eastern Richland Township. The Allen County representatives are going to present the framework of the plan to the Allen County Commissioners. If the Commissioners agree with the framework discussed there will be future meetings negotiations.

RESOLUTION NO. 14-2025

A RESOLUTION OF NECESSITY FOR THE WEST ELM STREET IMPROVIEMENTS PHASE II PROJECT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS: The Council finds that there is necessity to perform a public improvement project to qualifying sidewalk, ADA curb ramps, curbs and private driveway approaches on West Elm Street between the intersections of N. Spring Street and N. Lawn Avenue in the Village of Bluffton, Ohio, and;

WHEREAS; An emergency exists in the daily operation of the Village whereby failure to act will be detrimental to the public health, welfare and safety of the inhabitants thereof and in order to proceed with this project in an expeditious manner.

IT IS THEREFORE RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BLUFFTON, OHIO (the requisite number voting in the affirmative) THAT:

§ 1. Determination to improve:

It is hereby determined to be necessary to improve the qualifying sidewalk, ADA curb ramps, curbs and private driveway approaches on that part of W. Elm St. in accordance with the plans and specifications referred to in § 2.

§ 2. Approval of plans and specifications:

The specifications of construction for areas of affected sidewalk, ADA curb ramps, curb and driveway approaches along with the estimate of cost for the improvement, prepared by Village Administration and placed on file in the office of the Clerk of this Council, are approved.

§ 3. Levy of assessment:

The cost of the improvement shall be paid as follows:

- a. The Village of Bluffton will pay the costs for:
 - 100% of removal costs for all sidewalk and curb
 - 100% of ADA curb installation
 - 50% of curb installation
- b. The remaining costs, being 100% of sidewalk installation, 50% of curb installation and 100% of private drive approach, will be assessed on all lots and lands bounding and abutting on the W. Elm St. Improvements Phase II project. These lots and lands are determined to be specially benefited by the improvement. The assessments shall be levied by the foot frontage of the property bounding and abutting upon the improvement to that part of W. Elm St., or the square footage of driveway approach replaced and shall be paid, when levied, in annual installments,

with interest on unpaid installments at the rate of 2% payable with the property taxes of said parcel for not more than 5 years. Provided that the owner of any property assessed may, at their option, pay the assessment in cash within thirty days after passage of the ordinance levying the assessments.

§ 4. Estimated assessments:

The Village Administrator is directed to prepare an estimated assessment of the cost of the improvement, based on the estimate of cost filed in the office of the Clerk of this Council in accordance with the method of assessment set forth in this resolution, and showing the amount of the assessment against each lot and parcel of land to be assessed. The estimated assessment shall be filed in the office of the Clerk and kept available for public inspection.

§ 5. Notice to property owner:

Upon the filing of the estimated assessment, the Clerk of this Council is directed to cause notice of the passage of this resolution and of the filing of the estimated assessment to be served on the owners of all lots and lands to be assessed, as provided by law.

§ 6: Sunshine Law provisions:

That it is found and determined that all formal actions of the Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were made in open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in accordance with all legal requirements of the Open Meetings Law including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.



S.R. 103 Roundabout - Updates from Preconstruction Meeting

The construction on the roundabout is planned to begin in December of 2025, but will not require the closing of S.R. 103 and the detour of traffic until March 1st of 2026.

The December – March construction will include the installation of storm sewer facilities that are primarily out of the roadway. The contractor (Hohenbrink Excavating) did mention that flagging operations will be necessary for short times during this portion when the storm line will need to cross S.R. 103 and that these times would be arranged to avoid peak travel times.

At least 30 days' notice will be provided before the Road Closure and Detour Route are enacted. The Road Closure and Detour Route are projected to be in effect from March 1st through June.



Zoning Department - RE: awning construction at 132 N. Main St.

The Sr. Citizens Association has submitted an Application for a Zoning & Building Permit to construct an awning along the back of their building at 132 N. Main St. This awning will extend into the public parking lot to the same extent as the accessible, ADA compliant entrance that was allowed through Village Council's granting of a revocable license. The Zoning Department recommends that the Village Council take action to allow the construction of this awning.

Community

Complete Streets foster vibrant public spaces and a stronger sense of community and social connection. A Complete Streets approach also increases opportunities for participation by community members in the transportation planning process.

Complete Streets and active transportation are linked to greater social interaction with neighbors, lower depression rates, increased independence for children, older adults, and people with disabilities.

Economy

Complete Streets not only reduce crashes and costs associated with deaths and injuries, but also boost employment levels, property values, investment from the private sector, and net new businesses.

Complete Streets can provide a 10:1 return on investment (according to Researchers at the University of Arizona)

Environment

Wakking, biking, rolling, and riding public transit are better for the environment than driving. They create fewer emissions and poliution and can also help other areas, such as stormwater management. Transportation is the top contributor to greenhouse gas emissions in the U.S., with 28% of total emissions. Half of all daily trips are less than three miles, and over a quarter of trips are less than one mile.

Health

Complete Streets encourage daily physical activity and recreation, improving both physical and mental health.

People in walkable neighborhoods are 1.5 times more ilkely to engage in adequate levels of physical activity, and 0.76 times less likely to have obesity.

Safety

Designed for all users, Complete Streets slow traffic, prevent crashes, and reduce severe injuries and deaths.

70% of Complete Streets projects resulted in reductions in crashes according to our study.





GRANTING A LIMITED, PERSONAL AND REVOCABLE LICENSE TO THE SENIOR CITIZENS ASSOCIATION OF BLUFFTON, OH FOR THE INSTALLATION OF AN ACCESSIBLE ENTRANCE TO THE REAR OF THE BUILDING THAT IS COMPLIANT WITH THE AMERICAN WITH DISABILITIES ACT (ADA)

This license is granted to the Senior Citizens Association of Bluffton, Inc. by the Village of Bluffton, Ohio for the purposes set forth herein.

The Senior Citizen's Association has a building at 132 North Main Street in Bluffton, Ohio and there is a need to provide an accessible, ADA compliant entrance to the rear of the building. This project would extend the entrance, consisting of a concrete pad with steps and electric lift, beyond the property line encroaching approximately 2 feet into the public parking lot area, and;

The Village of Bluffton, Ohio is willing to grant a license for said steps.

Therefore it is AGREED as follows:

That the Village of Bluffton, Ohio hereby grants Senior Citizen's Association a limited, personal and revocable license to build and install an accessible, ADA compliant entrance on the public parking lot of the Village in accordance with the plan drawings attached hereto.

That this license allows construction of steps and an electric lift; however that at any time, the Village shall have the right to revoke the license in whole or in part at any time.

Senior Citizen's Association, Inc shall assume any and all liability whatsoever related to the said entrance and will hold the Village of Bluffton harmless.


