WEEKLY TITHE BUDGET: After much work amongst the priests and Deacon (thanks Fr. Brox and Deacon Moss!), we have set our weekly needed amount for the (new) current fiscal year at \$14,500 (see above). This is less than a 1% increase from last year (\$14,400/week last year), but would also result in our highest tithing ever (\$10,000 higher than our record high in fiscal 2021-2022). After a \$30,000 decline in our Lourdes contribution this past year, we are increasing by \$8,500 (1.5% increase) to \$568,800. Our largest projected expenses after Lourdes: \$103,000 for clergy benefits (salary, health insurance, retirement/401k, cell phone, etc.) and \$75,000 for net diocesan administration, Southern Nebraska Register, Saint John Vianney (retirement expense for retired clergy). Other expenses (e.g., property insurance) continue to increase. A surprise non-parishioner estate gift covered our 2024-2025 tithing and operational income shortfall. Just last week, we received another non-parishioner estate gift to jump start this fiscal year. We hope to finalize church hall purchases by Dec 31, to move residual to operations and endowment. Annual "state of the parish" homily in late September.

KC ANNUAL CORN ON THE COB: There will be some corn available after Masses this weekend and likely LOTS more next weekend!

FRANCISCAN SISTERS' ANNUAL ENVELOPE/COLLECTION: Each year we have a collection to help with support of the Franciscan Sisters of the Sorrowful Mother (Sr. Ana Maria, Sr. Kathleen, and Sr. Cynthia). Our parish contributes \$700.00 per month (\$8,400 annually), towards their living expenses. Our Sisters help with the education of our children and adults and are a prayerful intercession for our parishes and school. In 2024-25, contributions totaled \$5,236 - shortfall covered by general parish funds. An envelope is included in your July packet or donate through Online Giving. A second collection will also be taken up by our ushers next weekend (Aug 1/2). Thank you.
