We have one interested individual so far and this training is the most involved of these three ministries. Dads with sons who are (or soon will be) altar servers are the most ideal candidates, to be assisting at the altar with their sons!; (3) Lector/Reader are adult male or female who proclaim Scripture and Petitions at Holy Mass. Like acolytes, we are in greatest need for Sat evening Mass. I think we have had one or two individuals express some level of interest in this ministry.
