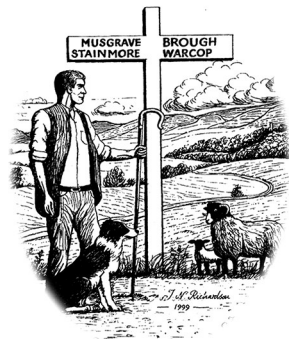


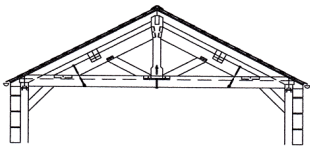

The Annual Brough Parish Meeting

The Annual General Meeting and the May Meeting were held on Thursday, 20 May 2021 at 7.00 pm in The School Room, The Methodist Church, High Street, Brough.



In attendance were; Cllr A McKenzie, Cllr P Jones, Cllr G Allison, Cllr A Brocklehurst, Cllr P Capstick, Cllr S Ellwood and Cllr A Henderson.

Cllr P Dew CCC and Cllr G Simpkins EDC were also in attendance.

There were no members of the public in attendance.

The Minutes of the Annual Parish Meeting of 16 May 2019 – received and agreed as a true and accurate record of the last Annual Parish Meeting.

Council's Report 2020/21 – prepared and taken as read by the Chair.

Plan of Action for 2021/22 – taken as read by the Chair

Financial Outlook for 2021/22. A tight and realistic budget has been agreed by Council. The Parish Precept has increased by 0.1% as a result of growth in the Council Tax Base. The Council's priority had been to minimise any additional financial pressure on local tax payers given the difficulties that many were experiencing as a result of COVID-19.

Cllr Brocklehurst was elected as Chair and Cllr McKenzie as Vice Chair.

Cllr McKenzie was thanked for her hard work as previous Chair,

The Council reviewed all the appropriate policies and amended or updated as necessary.

This was followed by the Monthly Meeting.

Defibrillator for Church Brough. Raven Graphics had produced signs for the kiosk which Cllr Brocklehurst would install. Training on the use of the equipment will be organised in due course. It was noted that the kiosk was also being used as a book exchange

The work at the tennis court should be undertaken next month.

Brough Surgery Opening Hours – the Clerk had previously circulated the response from the Upper Eden Medical Practice, which emphasised the efforts which have been, and continue to be, made by the Practice to deliver effective services. The Council noted the response, and after considerable further discussion again emphasised the need for additional hours at the Brough Medical Centre. This reflected the comments made by parishioners to Councillors on a regular basis.

Cllr Simpkins, Cllr Dew and the Clerk had attended the first **Community Liaison Group** meeting for the Appleby to Brough stage of the A66 Northern Trans-Pennine Project. The project represents an investment of £1bn and will dual the whole of the route between Penrith and Scotch Corner. Work will begin in 2024 and will be open for traffic by 2029. The detailed work programme has yet to be finalised. The next round of statutory consultation will take place later this Autumn and the Parish Council and all parishioners would be kept fully informed of developments.

Signage and Information Boards. With the help of Cllr Dew and Kellie

Bradburn-Sims, Community Development Officer, Cumbria County Council had earmarked £1,000 to help meet the costs of the project.

Information boards and a new map will be commissioned for the centre of Brough. Councillors also suggested that there should be improved signage for the public toilets and Jubilee Orchard. It was also agreed that there should be a map of the Parish and of interesting walks within it.

Ablaze 21. A donation of £300 has been given by the Parish Council to support this event for local young people.

Dog fouling and the need for extra litter and dog fouling bins was discussed and a request is to be made to EDC.

Junction of Main Street and Musgrave Lane. Cllr Henderson raised the need additional yellow lines to improve safety at the junction of Main Street and Musgrave Lane. It was agreed that visibility was often severely hampered by vehicles parked to the left when turning onto Main Street from Musgrave Lane. It was agreed that the situation would be kept under review, especially given that a Traffic Regulation Order was hopefully being progressed regarding traffic on Back Lane which, if implemented, would increase the volume of traffic turning onto Main Street from Musgrave Lane. Cllr Dew agreed to chase up the position regarding the TRO.

Dear Friends,

Events seemed to have moved on suddenly during May with the lifting of some of the Covid restrictions. It has seemed immediately noticeable with the number of cars and lorries, not to mention mobile homes, on the roads in the locality. More people are in the towns and villages, wandering around where there have been virtually deserted streets for so long. Life gradually returning to normal, and we give thanks for it, and look forward to further restrictions being lifted in June.

We are now delighted to have the Church doors open each day, though we are of course asking people to be socially responsible in completing tracking forms at the back of church, and two Services a month at the moment. We are booking Baptisms and welcoming reading Banns for Marriages.

If you look at the church calendar for May that was suddenly busy. We have celebrated the Ascension of Christ back to His Father in heaven, and Whit Sunday (Pentecost) follows on, as we remember the coming of the Holy Spirit on those fearful Disciples in the Upper Room.

For our Methodist brethren the Festival of John and Charles Wesley arrived on May 24th, and we have all benefitted from the many joys, from childhood to adulthood, of listening to and singing hymns written by the Wesleys. Maybe like me you have been lucky enough to visit some of the sites where they preached. Gwennap Pit was near where I lived in Cornwall, and filled on Whit Sunday by hundreds rejoicing in the coming of the Holy Spirit.

At the end of May we celebrate the Holy Trinity each year. Now there's a puzzle for theologians and for us....three persons in one. It is certainly one of our faith's glorious mysteries. Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. God the Father, or Mother, or both if you want, the love is the same; the Son who came to take human form, and loved us so much he was prepared to die for us; and the dancing Holy Spirit, the bringer of joy and hope in our lives. All are One.

It's difficult to explain, especially to children. A friend suggested to me that I used an egg as an easy way to demonstrate the principle. So off I went at an all age service with an egg broken into a bowl. Then a hard boiled egg cut in half... Father, Son and Holy Spirit. I thought I had done quite a good job at explaining that the Yolk, the white and the shell were three things, but made one egg. "now what is that like, well, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, three in one." I was fine until at the end of my Talk I asked my 6 year old helper what I had talked about - big mistake - "A HARD BOILED EGG!" I wonder how we would explain the Trinity, the three in One.

Does it mean the love of a parent, the care of a brother, and the protection of a friend? If you have never read THE SHACK, I recommend it to you as the most

interesting description of the Trinity. The dancing lights of the Spirit, the joy bringer, the warmth of the Mother in the kitchen and home, and the gentleness of the carpenter and friend.

As we move on into June we shall celebrate the Feast of Peter and Paul, a traditional Ordination time in the Church. We pray for them and ourselves, that we may all find in our lives the joy, love and friendship of the Trinity in the months ahead. And, most importantly of all, that we share those gifts with those around us.

St Michael's Church Brough Bells Update

The Covid-19 pandemic has set back the project to restore the bells by more than one year but in October 2020, before the second lockdown, a structural engineer was able to inspect the tower. Significant decay was noted in a timber set into the south wall below the bell chamber. The discovery prompted a closer examination of the beams supporting the floor on which the bell frame rested and it was discovered that there was decay, too, in the ends of the beams where they were let into the stonework of the tower.

The contractor, Matthew Higby, was contacted to make a further inspection of the tower but on this occasion had the assistance of experienced bell ringers. Bells one and two were rung full circle but bells three and four, because of their decayed state, could only be swung chimed to frame height. However, it was then possible to watch how the bell frame and floor reacted to the stresses of ringing. It was concluded that the bell frame was structurally sound but the floor on which it stood was flexing under the stresses created, allowing the bell frame to show significant movement.

It is proposed to replace the floor and decayed beams that support it with a new floor resting on a galvanised steel framework to which the bell frame can be securely anchored.

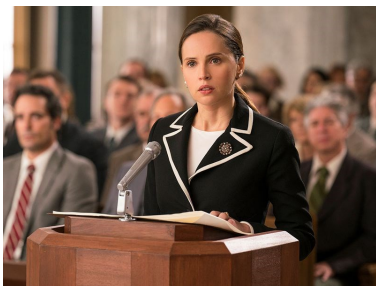
Matthew Higby & Co Ltd has provided a revised estimate for work together with the plans and these have been forwarded to the Diocesan Advisory Committee. The DAC will either append permission for the work to the existing faculty or issue a new faculty for the work.

When that faculty has been granted, the application will be made to the Heritage Lottery Fund for funding for the project.

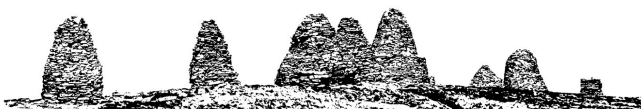

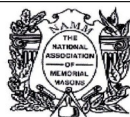

William Longuine, Bridge Inn, Thomas Porter, Pack Horse

Thomas Rudd, and Richard Dobson, Carriers to Appleby, Saturday 6.00am, back 8.00pm and to Stockton, Tuesday 9.00am back for 4.00pm (these could give lifts)

In Market Brough

7 inns of which the George Inn was also a Posting House (i.e. you could hire a private vehicle or horse here)

10 grocers and drapers, one of them also a chemist.

2 millers (Low Mill and High Mill) High Mill also sold meat

3 butchers, 5 carriers, 6 flour sellers

2 bakers, 2 brewers, 1 spirit merchant

1 candle seller, 1 dyer and fuller, 1 castrator

1 cabinet maker 1 Exciseman, 1 clogger

2 saddlers 5 milliners 5 stonemasons

3 surgeons 8 persons of private means

6 boot and shoe makers 6 tailors including William Wilkinson

2 corn dealers (i.e. oatmeal) 1 Bailiff of the Manor (Adam Devis)

6 Joiners/ wheelwrights/ timber merchants

1 Post Office, John Rumney, Postmaster:- letters arrive from South & are sent North at 2.00am, & arrive from North & are sent South at 11.15pm.

A postman on horseback sets off for Kirkby Stephen at 3.00am and returns at 2.00pm

1 C Nanson Slate Quarry, Intake

Stage Coaches (very dear)

The Royal Mail's Coach punctual to the minute calls at the George Inn southbound to London, 11.30pm and northbound to Glasgow, 2.00am.

The Lord Exmouth (Newcastle to Lancaster, thrice weekly

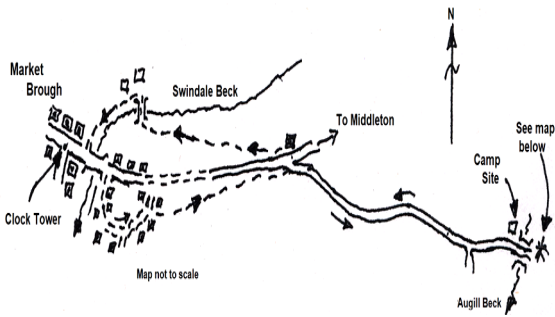

Walk of the Month – Augill Pasture

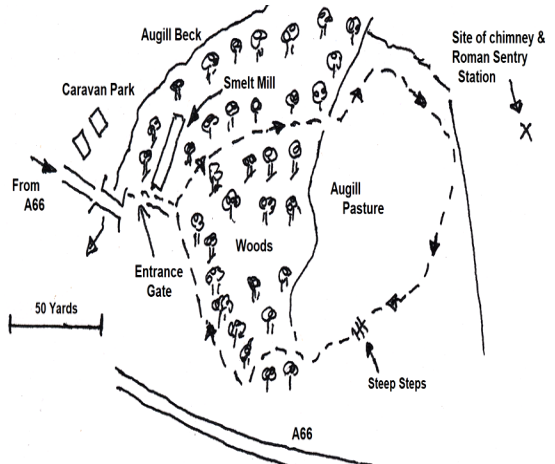


This 4-mile walk follows a quiet road for much of the route but is worth it to see the spring flowers in the Nature Reserve owned and run by the Cumbria Wildlife Trust. Traffic noise from the A66 is unfortunately annoying, but it is a pleasure to get away from on the return route to Brough.

From the clock tower in Market

Brough walk past the Fleece Inn and cross the bridge over Swindale Beck. Turn immediately right down Bayside and after 100yds turn left at a fork. At the top of a rise turn left down a lane and at the end turn left again.

Where this lane turns sharp left at the top turn right up two steps and follow the footpath sp. Lane head. Cross two stiles and then follow the hedge on the left. Just before the end of the field cross a stile on the left onto a road. Turn right and right again after 100 yds. to follow the old A66. After ½ mile turn left to Augill Park. Continue past the Caravan Park entrance and immediately after crossing a bridge turn left to a gate.



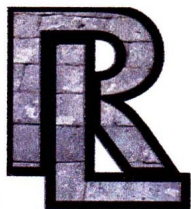
The old Smelt Mill is immediately in front. After

viewing the Mill go to the right to an information board. From here take the path up left through the wood. On leaving the wood follow the white topped posts up and left around the reserve. At the top of the hill the view over the wall includes the site of the Roman sentry station. Continue following the posts downhill, taking care at some steep steps.

Back at the road, return along the old A66. Fifty yards past the junction with the Middleton Road cross a stile on the right. Keep left by the hedge for 250 yds. to a stile in the wall. Continue by the hedge for a short way and then drop down across a track to a gate in a wall.

After passing the top of a landslip drop down to the tree-line. At a large oak tree drop down further to a grassy meadow and follow this to the end. Follow the path by a fence to a stile. Cross the bridge over Swindale Beck, turn left and follow the path by the Beck back into Market Brough and the start point.
