Arising from the Minutes of the last meeting:

Repairs to stiles, gates, etc: repairs to the fence post off Musgrave Lane and to the footbridge leading to the football pitch were complete, and tree works around the changing rooms had been done. Cllrs Brocklehurst & Birkbeck had also swapped the tennis court net for the winter. The removal of several planters which have collapsed remained to be done

Pump Track: Cllr Brocklehurst reported that the outcome of the Council's bid to the 0-19 Fund was still awaited, as was confirmation of funding from the Appleby & Brough PAG. However, it was expected that confirmation would be given soon, allowing work to commence.

Brough Parish Plan: Priorities for the forthcoming, 2026/27, financial year would remain similar to the current year:

 A major push on improving the environment and appearance

- of Brough, including tree works and general tidiness
- A continued effort to secure improved broadband services in Market Brough, following the successful implementation of improvements in Church Brough
- Seeking improved local facilities and services, including improvements to Brough public conveniences
- Supporting local events

Last Minute Harvest

(by Mary Wilson)

The forecasters said it was going to freeze shortly, which for me is panic stations. A bit early and I have already lost my outside courgettes, with that one overnight slight frost we had in September, so all my outside pots are now safely in my poly-greenhouses with help from my daughters and wheelbarrows. Didn't quite go as far as covering my outside tap. That is a job I can do at the last minute.

I have also picked a large quantity of herbs which die back in winter and made muslin bags in which I put Rosemary, Thyme, Marjoram, Parsley and a tiny bit of Basil (as it didn't do very well this year) in the middle of the squares and tied thick cotton around each one pulling in the sides leaving a longish end (to tie to the pan handle to keep from losing it in the stew etc.) before putting in the freezer for winter use. I also put other herbs on baking trays to dry before putting into jars also for winter use or if I am in a rush or weather bad to collect fresh ones.

I have been foraging mainly for mushrooms which I slice and partly cook in oil or butter or a combination of both and lay on trays to freeze before bagging which keeps the pieces separate so you can grab a handful when you need them. Earlier in the season I collected elderberries to add to my other soft fruits for smoothies, pies etc. again putting on trays, after removing the little stems with a fork, to freeze separately before putting in bags.

I have made some spiced crab apples this year with tiny red ones to have with cooked cold meats over Christmas. I haven't tried them yet as they need eight weeks to mature. I have also made some green tomato jam. Not sure about it but will wait a couple of weeks and then try it with crusty bread and cheese.

One last shout out. It is time to start collecting leaves to make leaf mould.

This year we've also extended our horizons and are taking over Kirkby Stephen auction


mart cafe serving burgers, cakes, teas + coffees etc!

In June 2025, Rodger ("Jock") Cairns was awarded the MBE in the King's Birthday Honours List for his outstanding service to rural transport and the communities of the Western Dales. The honour was a fitting recognition of a man whose vision and determination transformed local travel across one of England's most beautiful but isolated areas.

The story of Western
Dales Bus begins in the early
2010s, when commercial bus
services in the upper Eden
Valley and the western Yorkshire Dales were being withdrawn. For many residents,
especially older people and
those without cars, this meant
losing vital links to shops,
medical care, and social con-

tact. Jock, a retired teacher living in Dent, saw both the problem and the opportunity. Believing that local people could run their own solution, he brought together a small band of volunteers to form what would become Western Dales Bus.

From the outset, the organisation was guided by simple principles: provide reliable, affordable transport; operate as a not-for-profit community venture; and reinvest every penny back into the service. In 2011, with a single secondhand minibus and a handful of willing drivers, the first route began running between Sedbergh, Dent, and Kendal. It soon became clear that the buses were about more than just transport — they were social lifelines, helping people stay connected in a scattered rural area.

Under Jock's practical leadership and gentle encouragement, the network expanded steadily. Routes were added to Kirkby Lonsdale, Hawes, and Kirkby Stephen, linking these communities. More volunteers came forward, new vehicles were acquired — including the familiar WD1 and WD3 — and Western Dales Bus developed a reputation for reliability, friendliness, and genuine community service.

Though Jock has now stepped back from daily operations, his influence is felt in every journey made. His MBE recognises not only his personal dedication but also the spirit of cooperation he inspired — proving that, with enough determination and goodwill, even the most remote communities can keep themselves moving.

Penrith and Brough Transport and hostelries in the year of The Great Exhibition - 1851

How folks moved about and stopped in the mid-19th century

It is fair to say that The Great Exhibition of 1851 would not have interested very many people in Brough, as it was in faraway London, which was still a very hard place to reach. Transport then was still mostly by stagecoaches, private horses or horsedrawn carriages, and very expensive, though it was possible to do some regular local commuting. The other option, depending on your destination, was via the emerging rail network. The nearest railway was the Lancaster and Carlisle twenty miles to the west, opened in 1846, and with a station at Penrith. The only coach serving Brough was the Royal Mail, which ran from the White Swan Inn (Brough's main inn), to Penrith via Appleby, daily at 1.00pm except Sundays. It ran to an exact timetable and waited for nobody.

Carriers might let you ride as a passenger, if there was room. They were slow but far cheaper. None ran on Thursdays or Sundays.

For Appleby, you could go on Monday and Saturday (choice of two carriers)

Barney (Barnard Castle) - four going

Kirkby Stephen - three

Penrith - one going Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday;

Kendal - one going

Bishop Auckland, Durham, Newcastle - one going on Monday and Saturday.

South Stainmore also had its own carriers, from the Ship Inn to Kirkby Stephen on Mondays, to Barney on Wednesdays and Appleby on Saturdays (Messrs Thompson, Holliday and Hilton).

As for local stopping points and hospitatility, 1851 was a world of difference. Brough had in it nine inns, and Brough Sowerby, one (the Black Bull, now the redundant Belah Bridge, about which, see elsewhere in this edition). Others included: North Stainmore, two, and one beerhouse; South Stainmore, three.

The Brough Postmaster was Mr Thomas Lancaster, at his house in Market Brough. Letters arrive 11.27am and depart at 1.18pm. The Registrar for Kirkby Stephen District lived at Brough, Mr George Bailey. He was also Lord Thanet's Bailiff for the Manor of Brough.
