For over a century, the Excelsior has defied time and tide. Built in 1921 as a working Lowestoft fishing smack, she has weathered wars, changes of nation, and obsolescence—only to return home, restored not just in timber and rigging, but in spirit.

Today, The Excelsior Trust is proud to carry that spirit forward—not merely as caretakers of a historic vessel, but as stewards of opportunity, resilience, and renewal.

Since 1982, over 11,000 young people and adults have stepped aboard Excelsior and stepped off changed—more confident, more connected, and more inspired. That is the power of heritage when it is not locked behind glass, but alive in your hands.



A CENTURY OF PURPOSE



A BOAT BUILT TO WORK THE SEA BECAME A VESSEL TO SHAPE LIVES

Excelsior LT472 was launched from Lowestoft in 1921, a proud product of the region's storied boatbuilding heritage.

Designed for hard work, she is a sailing smack—part of the backbone of East Anglia's fishing economy. For over a decade, she trawled the southern North Sea, a workhorse of wind, wood, and will.

But her life, like the tides, would change course. As the Great Depression swept across Europe, Excelsior was sold to Norwegian owners. Her masts came down, her sails were replaced by a motor, and she became a coastal cargo vessel—transporting goods along the rugged Scandinavian coastlines. Renamed Svinør, she even survived a near-miss bombing during World War II, beaching to save lives and remain afloat.

Our flagship youth development programme, targeting young people aged 16–25. Thinking about "A Life Offshore". Combines personal growth, skills training, and sea-based challenges.

EXPERIENCE VOYAGES

2–5 day immersive sailing experiences focused on seamanship, teamwork, and personal development — perfect for schools, youth groups, and charities.

DAY SAILS

Short coastal trips (typically 1 day) ideal for individuals, small groups, schools, businesses, and community partners wanting a taste of traditional sailing.

For young people, stepping aboard Excelsior is often their first encounter with independence, teamwork, responsibility — and possibility.
