"Your Word is a lamp to my feet, and light to my path." (Psalm 119:105)

Normally, I devote my monthly newsletter article to share with you some theological subject that may be on my mind. And, at times these subjects can be rather abstract; they can be challenging to describe and, in essence, hard to grab hold of. For example, talking about the hypostatic union of Jesus Christ - that of Jesus being both fully God and fully man all at one and the same time. Or, talking about the Trinity, a subject that can often be hard to comprehend. These are heavenly subjects that I try my best to explain.

Well, this month the subject I wish to share with you is far more down to earth. This month's subject is far more concrete. Actually, not concrete, but asphalt! I want to talk to you about our parking lot. And how you can help.

You may have noticed how the asphalt parking lot on the west and north sides of the church has been looking a little rough over the last few years. There are many cracks, with lots of weeds and grass growing up through those cracks, and even some spots where the whole surface has become completely disintegrated. At different times over the years we have treated those cracks and other areas to keep things from getting worse, but sealing is, really, nothing more than a band-aid.

At our last Session meeting we made the decision to hire a company to do a complete overhaul of the parking lot, which will include removing the old surface and reapplying a brand new surface. As you can imagine, this is an expensive undertaking. But, letting it go will only lead to the parking lot getting worse and worse until it gets to the point where there won't be any more parking lot, and all of our members and visitors will wind up parking on a dirt field. And, also, the longer we put it off, the more expensive the job will become.

The cost for redoing our parking lot will be \$116,000. Now, we are blessed that we have the reserves to pay for the work. But, paying for this much needed maintenance will put a severe dent in those reserves. So, we're asking for your help.

I know that all of you are very generous with your financial giving to New Covenant. You have greatly taken to heart the call from God found in His Word to "Do good and share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God," (Heb. 13:16) and that your giving comes from a heart that believes in and worships Jesus Christ who "gave Himself up for us as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God" (Eph. 5:2). We give in response to what He, first, gave for us. But, would you be willing to do a little bit more for your church?

Starting this month you will find envelopes in the pews and available on the tables in the narthex that will be labeled for this special "Parking Lot Project." You can put any additional gifts you wish in those envelopes and then put them in the offering plates during the collection. And, of course, you don't need to use an envelope at all, so long as you mark on the memo line of your check that it is for the parking lot project. If there are other ways you would like to contribute, you can also speak with a member of our Finance Committee (Phil Mathews, Dan Power or Kerry Robinson).

And, as we see included at the top of this article, just like the psalmist wrote of how God's Word is our lamp to (and under) our feet that gives us the support we need on which to stand in life, so, too, I ask that you will please pray about the asphalt that is, also, under your feet, and how you would want to take part in supporting this upcoming project.

Churches around the world owe a debt of gratitude to Lillenas Publishing Company. Lillenas has provided a vast amount of music for churches including hymns and songbooks. Haldor Lillenas was born in Norway in 1885. His family immigrated to the United States when he was a child. In 1906, Lillenas' mother passed away, and soon after her death, he became a Christian and devoted his life to Christian service. Lillenas wrote many songs during his life, and in 1924 he organized his own publishing company in Indiana in addition to preaching. Today Lillenas Publishing Company is one of the largest church music publishers in the world.

In 1917, Mr. and Mrs. Lillenas built their first home in Olivet, Illinois. When it was completed they had scarcely any money left to furnish it. He found a "little wheezy organ" at a neighbor's home that he was able to purchase for \$5.00. It was on that organ he wrote a number of his songs, including the "Wonderful Grace of Jesus." Then he sold that soon-to-be-famous hymn for \$5.00 – just enough to pay for the organ on which it was composed. "Wonderful Grace of Jesus" was copyrighted in 1918, but was not published until 1922, when it appeared in the Tabernacle Choir Book.

"Wonderful Grace of Jesus" is hymn number 198 in our Red Hymnal.

The New Jerusalem / Children of Hope—School in Haiti



They are still on (summer) break. Some of the families live up in the mountains and are very poor. In summer's past, **VOLVICK** has purchased groceries and delivered to these families. My most recent information is that the gangs have moved into the area closer to the school and are VERY active. Haiti continues to be a VERY DANGEROUS place.

Pray for the teachers, school staff and students **when** they are able to return to their classrooms and school begins again. Because of the danger, it is not sure when the schools with begin this

school year. Pray for VOLVICK (principal of the school), as he continues to live and work in Port au Prince to support and help with some of the financial needs of the school and its families. VOLVICK was able to spend some time in the Verrettes area in April and May, he was able to deliver some food to the families and talk with people there. Both the elementary school, out in the countryside, and secondary in town have a principal at the school. Pray for VOLVICK'S day-to-day safety in Port au Prince, as everywhere there is very dangerous. Gangs are still very active and seem to be growing in size. PRAY for the safety of all of the people living in this country. I believe New Covenant is the only church helping to support the school, so let's keep VOLVICK, the students and teachers in our prayers during this very difficult and dangerous time.
