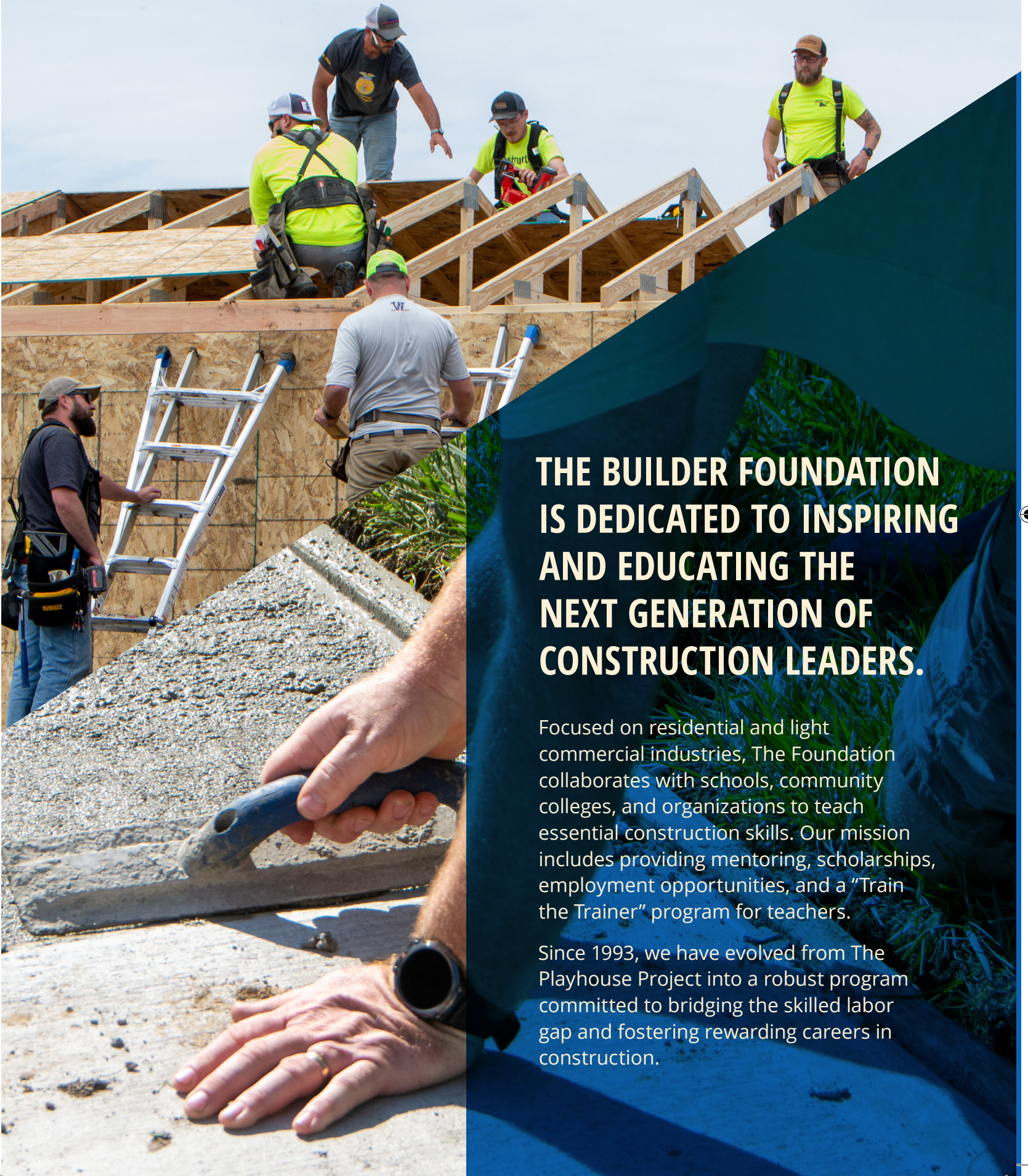

Programs People Can Support

BUILDERS OF THE FUTURE

A hands-on program where students gain real-world construction experience by building sheds, dog houses, and even full homes under professional supervision. This initiative combines technical training with practical application to prepare students for careers in the trades.

- Provides students with real-life, project-based learning opportunities.
- Builds confidence and technical skills that translate to the workforce.
- Encourages teamwork, problem-solving, and pride in craftsmanship.

TRAIN THE TRAINER

A professional development program designed to equip Industrial Technology teachers with advanced construction knowledge and hands-on skills. In partnership with Metro Community College and Northeast Community College, this initiative strengthens the foundation of construction education.

- Offers hands-on training to keep teachers up to date with industry practices.
- Builds confidence and expertise to better mentor students in the classroom.
- Improves the quality of construction education across the region.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarship opportunities for both students and teachers that remove financial barriers and foster growth in construction-related fields. These scholarships help close the skilled labor gap by empowering future leaders and educators alike.

- The Brian Carder Scholarship supports students pursuing construction-related programs.
- The WSC Teacher Scholarship provides funding for Skilled and Technical Science teachers to expand their skills.
- Encourages professional growth while strengthening the next generation of the construction workforce.

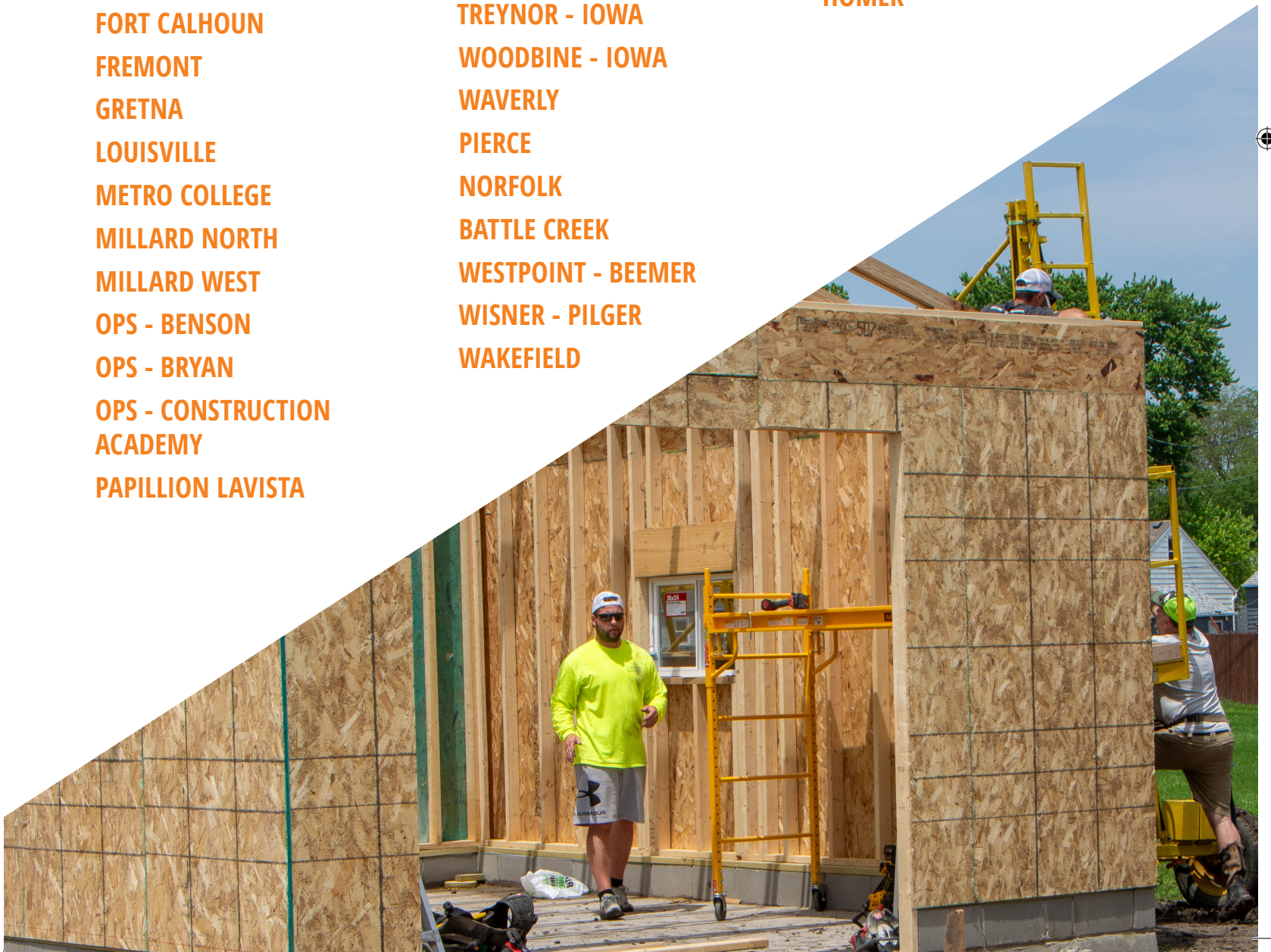

4. SPREAD THE WORD

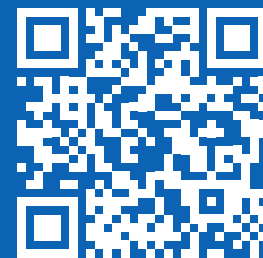
Help raise awareness via social media, community groups, or word-of-mouth. Referrals to schools, donors, or volunteers amplify impact.
