

Classroom Supply List:

Below is a list of what your child will need while at school:

Please make sure all items are labeled with your child's name. (Seriously on this one, even down to individual socks often children will pull them off and we don't know who they belong to.)

- A printed photo (4x6) of your family that will stay at school
- **Indoor shoes** (that will remain at school for the duration of the year) easy shoes that your child can put on INDEPENDENTLY (velcro or slip-on)
- 2 packages of diaper wipes labeled
- diaper cream labeled (if applicable)
- 1 pack of 24 diapers (if applicable)
- 6 pairs of underwear/training underwear if your child is toileting
- At least 3 changes of clothes (shirt, pants and socks) Season appropriate and

movement appropriate: please NO dresses or onesies

- 4 reusable Wet bags similar to this design style: <u>Amazon Wet Bags</u>
- Sun hat
- Water bottle: this will remain at school (they will be sent home on Fridays to be cleaned and should return on Mondays)
- Backpack that your child can independently carry.

<u>Winter/Wet Gear</u> - Not needed by the first week of school- <u>but will remain at school for the duration</u> of the year.

•We have a class set of Oaki Rain suits but do not provide snow suits. When winter comes, we will ask families to provide a snow suit for their child.

- Rain Boots Any brand will do!
- **Snow Boots**, for early walkers, we highly recommend this style boot:

• Water-proof Mittens- We are out in all weather, and these mittens are one of our favorites for children this age as they are easy to put on, stay on well, and can tolerate the abuse we

Full-Day Supplies:

Though this is not required, *it would be so appreciated* if you could send your child's lunch in a bento container rather than single use plastic or multiple containers. Having done lunch with children for many years we have found that Bentgo and Lunchbots are some of the best bento systems that are easy for young children to open and prevent the use of single-use plastic. Below are two options for containers. These containers are durable, easy to open and you can add dip containers as well. These will last for years to come.

- Nap blankets and sheets are provided at school. This goes home on Fridays to be laundered and needs to be returned on Mondays.
- Utensils and cups are provided at school

DAILY

- □ Appropriate gear for the weather

WEEKLY(goes home on Fridays to be cleaned, returned on Mondays)

- □ Nap sheet and blanket, if FULL DAY
- □ Water Bottle
- $\hfill\square$ Any clothing that was sent home soiled: replenish items
- □ Any wet bags that were sent home; replenish items

ITEMS THAT STAY AT SCHOOL

- □ Indoor shoes
- □ 3 pairs of pants
- □ 3 shirts (short or long sleeved depending on season)
- \Box 6 pairs of underwear
- □ Pack of diapers/pull-ups depending on child's need
- □ Pack of wipes
- □ Diaper cream if appropriate
- □ Sunscreen
- □ Wet bags
- Any medication required to be administered at school (this must be registered with the main office)
