

Classroom Supply List:

Below is a list of what your child will need while at school.

Please make sure all items are labeled with your child's name. (Seriously on this one, even down to individual socks often children will pull them off and we don't know who they belong to.)

• A printed photo (4x6) of your family that will stay at school

• Indoor shoes (that will remain at school for the duration of the year) easy shoes that your child can put on independently, velcro or slip-on, but *no clog-style crocks please*, For early walkers, you cannot go wrong with any of the SeeKaiRun brand. We love the "native style shoes," when your child begins toileting because you can just wash them off in the sink. However, we have found that the Knock-offs (found at Old Navy and Target) allow for more independence in putting them on than the actual brand-name, which has a more narrow opening for the foot.

- 2 packages of diaper wipes labeled
- diaper cream labeled (if applicable)
- 1 pack of 24 diapers (if applicable)
- 6 pairs of underwear if you child is toileting, or training underwear
- At least 3 changes of clothes (shirt, pants and socks) Season-appropriate
- 4 reusable Wet bags similar to this style: Amazon Wet Bags
- Sun hat

Winter/Wet Gear - Not needed by the first week of school- but will remain at school for the duration of the year.

•Oaki Trail Suit* - I STRONGLY recommended for the significant puddle play and snow stomping my class engages in. The Oaki can function as both a rain suit and snowsuit so you only have to purchase one thing. *Please make sure to follow this link, DO NOT BUY the actual Oaki snowsuit (it is hard for toddlers to function in.)* The Okai comes tested in a variety of forest-School environments and we have found these are the ideal toddler suit for wet/winter weather. •Fleece layer children can wear under the Oaki to insulate for winter (an option) Buntings are a good option for younger children.

Full-Day Supplies:

Though this is not required, *it would be so appreciated* if you could send your child's lunch in a bento container rather than single-use plastic or multiple containers. Having done lunch with children for many years we have found that Bentgo and Lunchbots are some of the best bento systems that are easy for young children to open and prevent the use of single-use plastic. Below are two options for containers. We opt for bento boxes that have an insert that can be removed - Or one that has a removable lid as open lunch boxes with lids take up significant space on the tables. These containers are durable, easy to open and you can add dip containers as well. These will last for years to come.

- Nap blankets and sheets are provided at school. This goes home on Fridays to be laundered and needs to be returned on Mondays.
- Utensils, Plates and cups are provided at school
