## Regional Lions Leadership Institute

She immediately set minds at rest concerning her class on Public Speaking and the fact that each would give a speech prior to leaving on Sunday. Following her, PCC Greg Evans, another talented instructor, led a session on Fast and Effective Teams which of course dealt with how to build teams among other ideas. Lots of ideas were discussed and evaluated on this subject.

Lunch time was a trying situation as once again we were eating in the Gold Room for the same reason as above. However, sandwich materials were provided by the leaders and all had some lunch. After lunch, it was time for PDG Jacquie Tripp to take the podium, and once again we had a talented presenter. Lion Jacquie talked on Keeping Members Engaged with many ideas elicited from the participants. Another great class! We're on a roll! Next comes Lion Christine with Communicating in a Fast-Paced World. Who knew there were so many ways to communicate! After a short break, PCC Greg completed the class day with Meeting



in a Fast-Paced World. If you thought that a virtual meeting was your only choice, Lion Greg and these Lions can give you more ideas. Wow!



Finally, a meal in the cafeteria not provided by the Lions staff gave us a chance to relax a little and get ready for the campfire and s'mores. Lion Greg had gone the distance in provided the best of the best in marshmallow roasting appliances. I personally believe his distance was about two feet, as my stick could have roasted something much larger – maybe a two-pound marshmallow. Classes reconvened with Lion Christine presenting a class on Overcoming Resistance. Lion Christine has much experience in this area and gave many helpful hints to overcome resistance. Lion Jacquie then presented Goal Setting, one of her areas of experience. SMART goals were reviewed and practiced. But the day wasn't over yet. A decision was made that in order to give enough time for speeches on Sunday, Local Issues would be presented next. All three presenters worked on this class.

Before dinner in the cafeteria, all participants were shoed out of the Gold Room so the instructors could do a little decorating for the graduation ceremony at 6:30. The graduation ceremony was fun and all 25 participants graduated magna cum laude. Lots of pictures were taken of each graduate.

Sunday morning was time to pack up, have breakfast—thanks to the wonderful breakfast casseroles Lion Greg prepared and donuts, and get ready to give speeches. The group did an outstanding job with their speeches and some even gave us more information about happenings in their clubs! Afterwards, folders containing speech evaluations were handed out, final good byes were said, and it was over. Except for the instructors and director who still had a number of things to accomplish—which we did and then it was over.

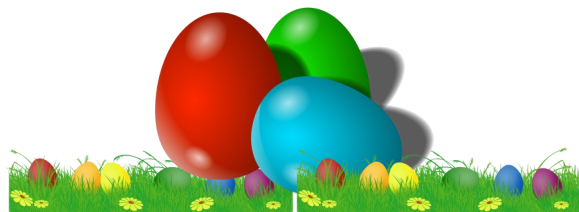


### CLUB NEWS—lake Sumter Lions Club
