GINY OM WINS LOCAL COMPETITION IN LIONS INTERNATIONAL PEACE POSTER CONTEST

Ponce Inlet, 4 June 25 — Giny Om, a fifth-grade student at R. J. Longstreet Elementary, has taken the first step to becoming an internationally recognized artist by winning a local competition sponsored by the Ponce Inlet Lions Club.

Om's poster will be among more than 450,000 entries submitted worldwide in the annual Lions International Peace Poster Contest. Lions Clubs International is sponsoring the program to emphasize the importance of world peace to young people everywhere.

"My art is about a world that people make a better place by working together. You can see people in it exploring other planets, hanging on and not giving up, being courageous, reaching out to help, calling out for others to join in, and holding on to others so they do not fall away," the eleven-year-old from Daytona Beach said. The poster was selected by the members of the Ponce Inlet Lions Club for its originality, artistic merit and portrayal of the contest theme, "Together As One." The judging was held on May 7, 2025, at the Ponce Inlet Community Center.

The Ponce Inlet Lions Club President Nancy Epps said she was impressed by the expression and creativity of the students at R. J. Longstreet Elementary. "It is obvious that these young people have strong ideas about what peace means to them. I'm so proud that we were able to provide them with the opportunity to share their visions."

"Om's poster will advance through the district, multiple district and international levels of competition if she is to be declared the international grand prize winner," Epps said.

One international grand prize winner and 23 merit award winners will be selected. The grand prize includes a cash award of US\$5,000, plus a trip for the winner and a family member to a special award ceremony. The 23 merit award winners will each receive a certificate and a cash award of US\$500.

"Our club is cheering for Giny as her poster advances in the competition, and we hope that her vision will ultimately be shared with others around the world," Epps said.

Locally, Om and the runners-up, Riley Lindsey and Meredith Cartaya-Duenas, were honored for their participation by the Ponce Inlet Lions Club and Mayor Lois Paritsky of Ponce Inlet on June 4, 2025, at the Ponce Inlet Community Center. The students' families joined them for the evening including dinner and cash prizes from the Ponce inlet Lions.

CLUB NEWS—Mouth Dora Lions Club






