Lions Saving Sight [aka Florida Lions Foundation for the Blind] sponsored breakfast Saturday morning. The General Session followed which was opened by CC Jimmy Gregory. DG Maggiy Williams led the Pledge to the Flag after which CC Jimmy introduced the Council of Governors. DG Linda Gregory then led an invocation.



Reports were then given. Lions Saving Sight President PDG Bobby Wright reenforced the objective: Restoring Vision, Saving Sight." Next Lion Joel Levenston spoke for Beauty of Sight and the new building into which the organization has recently moved and its commitment to Education. He also covered Mental Health and Well Being and the development of the serum eyedrops.





GLT PDG Vivian Henegar thanked those who conducted class sessions for the conference, spoke about the Regional Lions Leadership Institute coming up in March, and advertised the Certified Guiding Lions class which would be taught that afternoon. GMT CCE Elbio Gimenez spoke about membership and new clubs. GAT/GET PDG Steven Van Varick addressed the need to work together to build our organization.





Lion Pat Stamm of Oviedo Winter Springs Lions Club asked that her new member, Nancy Bentley, be inducted by PID Kembra Smith who was more than happy to do so.





PDG Vivian Henegar spoke again but this time it was for Diabetes Awareness. There is a continuing need for screeners and that afternoon there would be an opportunity for screeners to be recertified. An astonishing 39% referral rate exposes the need for more testing.

PID Neil Spencer read the list of those who have completed the paperwork to advance in leadership. Lion Alexis Daou 35-N reminded Lions about the upcoming Hunger Initiative January 3-11, 2026. DG Suzi Rodgers 35-L offered thanks and appreciation to Johnson and Johnson for their support and to the volunteers who assisted with the vision testing at Jaguar Stadium.

As President of Project Right to Sight PDG Steven Van Varick said that over the year 36,000 pairs of used eyeglasses have been distributed. He reported that 26 skids of material had been sent to Respecs.

SVDG Drew Ogden gave a report concerning the website update.





PID Robert Littlefield again thanked the many volunteers for their help during the recent LICON. He was immensely proud and grateful for the Lions of MD 35.

CC Jimmy Gregory asked for suggestions for sessions at the MD Convention in May and then introduced the speaker, PID Kenbra Smith.



Many changes are occurring to improve how cases are handled. We now have a full-time director of operations, **Lion Judy Seltzer.** Lion Judy brings years of nursing experience to our organization, making sure that Clients receive the care that they need.

Our foundation no longer requires co-pay from clubs submitting an application and applications may also be directed submitted from doctor's offices. Full instructions on how to submit an application are on our website https://www.lionssavingsight.org/.

The foundation needs your support. District 35-O submits many surgeries to the Foundation and has a district fundraising goal of \$50,000.00 during the Lions year. Every dollar goes toward giving the hope of sight to someone who needs it.

LIONS OF DISTRICT 35 0 HEARING PROGRAM, INC

The Florida Hearing and Speech Foundation has begun screening adults for hearing and referring them to neighboring Hearing Centers. Led by Lions Dennis Dulniak, Toni Gitles, and Adam Parrish of the Oviedo-Winter Springs Lions Club, in conjunction with the Orlando Chapter of Hearts for the Homeless (H4H) and the Omega Leo Club at UC, well over a hundred adults were screened at the Orlando Christian Service Center. H4H President Alyssa Boy and Medical Informations Officer Andrew Casanova have been instrumental in expanding their health screenings to include hearing tests. This expansion led to a partnership with the Sertoma Speech and Hearing Foundation, which provided hearing aids to needy homeless adults.

D35-O Hearing now has five MA1 Audiometers available for Lions Clubs to use at health fairs, clinics, and in conjunction with diabetes and vision screenings. Lions Dennis Dulniak and Toni Gitles have been training Lions at the recent MD 35 Conference and the Piggotte Community Center for the South Daytona and Daytona-Halifax Lions Clubs. 

CLUB NEWS—Port Orange Volusia Lions Club



Lions vs. Elks - NO, not a football game nor an animal fight in the zoo! It was the Lions and the Elks teaming up to provide a free HEALTH EVENT at the Port Orange Elks Club. Port Orange Elks provided their facility for dozens of health care agencies and vendors to share the opportunities with the public. Port Orange – Volusia Lions provided free Blood Sugar and Vision Screening. The Lions screenings are provided to the community FREE of charge. 35% of those having the blood screening were encouraged to follow-up as their screening indicated their insulin was outside the recommended levels provided by the American Diabetes Association.

Vision screening yielded persons that had an issue identified by the Welch-Allyn Spot Vision Screener, a portable refractor. When the Refractors reads:" FULL EXAMINATION RECOMMENDED", Lions then refer the individual for an eye exam. It provides a 97% accuracy for determining abnormalities of the eye and eye nerve. It does NOT require drops nor touching. Pre-school children are especially important to screen as the refractor can identify issues in time to have them corrected before the eyes fully develop. Purchase of this device was facilitated by Sheriff Mike Chitwood, Publix Charities, Big John's Appliances, and 3 anonymous donations.

The Port Orange – Volusia Lions Club is recruiting new members to re-organize the Port Orange Club to be able to provide services to more people in need and to be able to screen at more public events, churches, DAY CARE FAILITIIES, and organized groups wishing to have the screening.

Again, we wish to thank the Port Orange Elks #2723 for joining forces with the Port Orange-Volusia Lions Club and other health care agencies to provide our community.

(A PROGRAM FOR SENIOR CLASS HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS IN LIONS DISTRICT 35-0)

DEAR APPLICANT: This Scholarship was created by the Lions Clubs of District 15-0 to establish a suitable Memorial to commemorate the untimely death of Paivi Harittu, from Paimio, Finland.
