Enrolment, Payment and Policies

Enrolment

All NLSD dance class registrations and payments are made through the Jackrabbit Parent Portal. To access the Jackrabbit Parent Portal visit the NLSD website and choose the 'Announcements' tab to find the link. If you cannot access the Parent Portal, please contact info@nlsdyukon.com.

Payment

As a non-profit organization, we rely on timely payments from families to continue providing high-quality dance programming and meaningful opportunities for all our students. Your support helps us keep our programs accessible and enriching for the entire community.

Please note:

In order to be considered enrolled, your account must be paid in full or you must have made arrangements for a payment plan with our office prior to September 1st.

Full year dance classes account payments paid through Jack Rabbit are due September 1, 2025.

Full Term 1 (September-December) account payments are due September 1, 2025. Full Term 2 (January – May) account payments are due January 1, 2026.

Policy Agreements in Jackrabbit

As part of the process to enroll in dance classes at NLSD, parents/guardians must agree to the policies on their Parent Portal Account, with the exception of the photo consent policy. Please log into the Parent Portal to agree to these policies.

ALL ACCOUNTS MUST BE PAID IN FULL BY MAY 1, 2026. Any outstanding accounts will not be able to register for the 2026-2027 dance season until paid in full.

Performance Opportunities

NLSD does several major productions and smaller events throughout the year. Details and registration on these performance opportunities will be announced in emails, newsletters and on our website.

The Nutcracker

Auditions for roles in the Nutcracker are open to NLSD dancers who are taking ballet or primary and first steps ballet/tap classes.

Auditions are held in September.

Rehearsals are held on Saturdays and Sundays between 10 am and 6:30 pm. All choreography is taught during weekend rehearsals; therefore, attendance is mandatory. Additional fees apply.

Matinee performances on school days may be required.

Dancers are required to attend all rehearsals and performances.

Year-End Shows

The year-end shows feature Jazz, Contemporary, Acro, Commercial, Tap, Primary, First Steps, and Broadway classes. The shows also feature all Novice, elementary, intermediate, Senior, Intensive ballet. The number and style of shows will vary from year to year to keep it fun and interesting and to showcase our dancers' talent! Here's some more info:

- Generally, all non-intensive pieces for the year-end shows are taught during regularly scheduled classes.
- Dancers may be required to attend additional rehearsals, usually on weekends, in April
 or May leading up to the performance.
- A matinee performance during school hours will likely be required.
- All intensive dancers must attend an audition and additional rehearsals similar to Nutcracker. Audition requirements change from season to season.



Class Uniform

Proper attire and grooming are considered to be an essential part of dance training and helps the dancer feel correctly prepared for their class.

We wear a uniform at NLSD for a few reasons:

- Uniforms encourage discipline and preparedness in students.
- Consistent attire enhances equality and unity in the group.
- Instructors can better see the students' form and technique without any wardrobe interference.

Students who are inappropriately dressed may not be permitted to participate in class.

Where two options are given, students must choose either Option A or B in their entirety for all styles. Previously, Option A was previously known as the girl uniform, while Option B was for boys.

Class Uniform: Primary and First Steps

Hair must be secured back off the face and neck, in a very tidy ballet bun if long enough.

Option A

- Pink ballet slippers with elastics across the top of the foot
- Solid color bodysuit (no graphics, or patterns)
- ballet skirt mid thigh/just above the knee length
- · Pink or skin toned ballet tights

Option B

- Black ballet shoes with elastics across the top of the foot
- Solid colored fitted t-shirt (with no pattern or graphics)
- · Black or white socks
- Black shorts or leggings

*First Steps TAP STUDENTS WILL ALSO NEED TAP SHOES



Class Uniform: Ballet

Ballet

Hair must be secured back off the face and neck, and in a bun if long enough.

Option A

- Skin color or pink ballet slippers with elastics across the top of the foot
- Solid dark toned bodysuit (no graphics, or patterns)
- Skin toned or pink convertible ballet tights (no shine)

Option B

- Black ballet shoes with elastics across the top of the foot
- White fitted t-shirt (with no patterns or graphics)
- Black or white socks
- Black shorts or leggings (dance belts maybe require for older dancers)

Intensive Ballet

All dancers will need character shoes. Please do not purchase these shoes until your instructor confirms with the class.

- Intensive 1 & 2: Canvas character shoes, low heel
- Intensive 3 & 4: Canvas character shoes. Cuban heel

Weekend Rehearsals (Nutcracker, etc.)

During weekend rehearsals, dancers must follow the uniform requirements above. However, dancers may add a wrap shirt or wear a more brightly colored bodysuit. Dancers are encouraged to bring warm clothing such as sweatpants and hoodies to layer over their dance clothing during breaks.

Class Uniform: Jazz, Broadway, Contemporary, Acro, Street Styles

Jazz/Broadway

- Hair secured off the face and neck (ponytail or bun)
- Black jazz shoes (not jazz runners)
- Solid color leotard or fitted t-shirt that doesn't flip up when going upside- down
- Solid color jazz pants, leggings or shorts

Contemporary/Acro

Hair secured off the face and neck (no bun for Acro!)



^{**}Dancers on pointe should bring their pointe shoes to all ballet classes

- Bare feet or thin socks
- · Solid color leotard or fitted t-shirt that doesn't flip up when going upside- down
- Solid color jazz pants, leggings or shorts

Tap

- Hair secured off the face and neck (ponytail or bun)
- Black tap shoes
- Solid color leotard or fitted t-shirt
- · Solid color jazz pants, leggings or shorts

Street Styles

- · Hair secured off the face
- · Looser fitting comfortable clothes
- Clean indoor runners

Jewelry

Only small stud earrings are allowed in class. Other jewelry and valuables should be left at home where they are safe!



What to Bring in Your Dance Bag

Having a designated dance bag will help dancers be prepared. Here is a list of ideas of what should be in your dancers' bag.

- Hair Kit: elastics, hair pins, bobby pins, hair net, brush, comb, etc.
- Safety pins of various sizes
- Pointe Shoe Kit: scissors, needle and thread, tape, spacers, ouch pouches, lamb's wool, second skin, etc.
- Clear nail polish (for runs in tights and ribbons)
- Body deodorant
- · All dance shoes
- · Extra change of dance clothing
- Warm up clothing
- Note book and pen
- Small first aid kit: ice pack, Band-Aids, hand sanitizer, etc.
- Water bottle
- Healthy snacks



Day to Day Procedures

Pick Up and Drop Off

NLSD opens at 3:30 pm on weekdays and 8:45 am on Saturdays. Students are encouraged to arrive 15 minutes before class starts in order to be properly prepared.

Parents are responsible for picking up their dancer(s) at the end of their dance classes and rehearsals. NLSD instructors do not supervise children outside of their class/rehearsal time.

Attendance

Students are encouraged to attend classes regularly so they do not fall behind as it can be discouraging for everyone. If your dancer is going to be absent, please notify us by logging into your Jackrabbit Portal and selecting "Submit an Absence".

Class Placement

We offer dance training that encourages both recreational and intensive program students to meet their needs and strive towards personal artistic goals.

Our school operates on a cohort system in which groups of individuals progress together - similar to grades in public school. Occasionally, we may need to reassess a dancer's placement levels to ensure the appropriate level. This process is initiated by our instructional staff and artistic directors. Decisions are based on a mix of criteria including attendance, participation, classroom preparedness, age, skill development and years of training completed. This system helps ensure that dancers are in classes that suit their technical and performance abilities.

Jennifer Kosmenko-Eastland

Artistic director & Instructor of Ballet

Jen began her dance training in her birthplace of Whitehorse, continuing her studies at Simon Fraser University's School for the Contemporary Arts. She holds a BFA in dance and a Certificate in Liberal Arts. Jen worked and collaborated with various independent choreographers and companies in Vancouver for many years, including performances at 12 Minutes Max, Press Play, Press Play 2, and a variety of works by choreographers such as Monica Strelke, Susan Miller, and Trevor Klushin.
