

A Word from your Pastor

My sense is that we church going, Bible thumping Christians do not take the power of prayer seriously. I include myself. We rarely spend planned purposeful periods of time in prayer. What is prayer? It is communication with your Father in heaven. What makes an ordinary obscure person a powerful weapon in the hands of God? Prayer.

Why don't we pray in faith, in obedience, in expectation, in power and in persistence? Do we not believe God will hear? We are just talking to the wall. Maybe because we don't feel like that educated, eloquent, holy person who has His ear.

I want to quote some theologians on the subject of prayer.

J.G. Ryle wrote "Prayer is the simplest of acts. It is simply speaking to God. It needs either learning nor wisdom nor book knowledge to begin it. It needs nothing but will. The weakest infant can cry when he is hungry. The poorest beggar can hold out his hands for alms and does not wait to find words. The more ignored man will find something to say to God, if he only has a mind."

Andrew Murray wrote, "The powers of the eternal world have been placed at prayer's disposal. It is the very essence of true religion, the channel of blessing, the secret of power and life."

Charles Spurgeon wrote "Prayers are the believers' weapons of war. When the battle is too hard for us, we call in our great ally who, as it were lies in ambush until faith gives the signal by crying out "Arise Lord."

Dr. Paul E. Billheimer "Prayer is not begging God to do something which He is loath to do. It is not overcoming reluctance in God. It is implementing enforcing Christ's victory over Satan. It is implementing upon earth heaven's decisions concerning the affairs of men. Calvary legally destroyed Satan and concealed all his claims. God place the enforcement of Calvary's victory in the hands of the church."

So we need to ask, believe, receive. Faith and prayer are inseparable. Prayer is the slender nerve which unleashes the muscles of an omnipotent God. One more story about Knee-mail...

A clergyman from New York, during a call on President Lincoln at the Whitehouse said, "I have not come to ask any favors of you, Mr. President. I have only come to say that the loyal people of the North are sustaining you and will continue to do so. We are giving you all that we have, the lives of our sons as well as our confidence and our prayers. You must know that no boy's father or mother ever kneels in prayer these days without asking God to give you strength and wisdom."

His eyes brimming with tears, Mr. Lincoln replied, "But for those prayers, I should have faltered and perhaps failed long ago. Tell every father and mother you know to keep on praying, and I will keep on fighting, for I know God is on our side."

As the clergyman started to leave the room, Lincoln held him by the hands and said, "I suppose I may consider this a sort of a pastoral call." "Yes", replied the clergyman. "Out in our country, "replied Lincoln, "when a parson makes a pastoral call, it is always the custom for the folks to ask him to lead in prayer, and I should like to ask you to pray with me today. Pray that I may have strength and wisdom."

The two men knelt side by side, and the clergyman offered the most fervent plea to Almighty God that ever fell from his lips. As they arose, the president clasped the visitor's hand and remarked in a satisfied way, "I feel better".




