A Special Message from One of our Veterans

Part 2 from Carl Chalk – Mr Bojangles

While in Vietnam we got fogged in bad and couldn't get extracted out for 4 days. We had very little food, a few cans of fruit cocktail and a candy bar or two. When the fog did lift, we got back to our artillery battery and something that resembled a hot meal. That evening the five of us who had been out were drinking a few warm beers when one of the guys who had been a part-time musician found an old guitar someone in the battery had and started playing this song Mr. Bojangles. Don't know how many times I heard this song that night but when I went to sleep that night I thought to myself, I hope I never hear it again.

After I got home from Vietnam, I managed to shake off that time over there, it was just a bump in the road. I was just raising a family, life was good, but that was about to change. While in a fox hole on our perimeter one night over there a snake crawled in. We had been briefed that there were 60 poisonous snakes in Vietnam. I knew I might die there that night in a hole halfway around the world. Would my mom and dad ever know what happened? If I was going to die it wasn't going to be in that d—m fox hole, and out I went. I made it no bite!

Fast forward to July 1983 in the middle of the night I wake up, I'm back in that d—m fox hole with the snake again only this time I can't get out. I am literally frozen from fear. I am awake but I can't even blink or move my little finger for nearly an hour and then I finally was able to get up, but something was different with me. I started having more nightmares and flashbacks of Vietnam. It was getting really bad, and I finally went to the VA for help, but back then that was a lot of pills, that made things worse. I began to think some pretty dark things. One night after supper I went upstairs, what next, I got on my knees and begged Jesus to take this away. Rita was cleaning up after supper. She was listening to the radio, and I heard a song I had not heard since Vietnam, Mr. Bojangles! My first thought was you were there that night in Vietnam. A few weeks later on my way to work I pulled into a driveway to turn around and go back home, it was a bad day. Just then Mr. Bojangles came on the radio. It was a tough day at work, but I made it. Following this Jesus sent an angel to help me. Her name was Mary Ellen, the wife of minister who helped people with trauma.

A year later my family and I prepared to go to Virginia on vacation to visit my sister. On the way I wanted to visit the new Vietnam Wall. We stayed the first night just outside of D.C. In the morning, we would visit the wall. I didn't sleep much that night and at 3 am I got up and went to an all-night restaurant next to the hotel. I knew the Wall would be the most difficult thing I had done since Vietnam. I began praying to Jesus to help me through the day. When I got up to leave, I heard Mr. Bojangles playing on the radio one of the cooks was listening to in the back. That was the last time I ever heard it on the radio. I guess Jesus thought I could do the rest on my own. I had surely been blessed that year. I learned then as a young church goer He is with us all the time.

How time has flown! I hope everyone had a wonderful Thanksgiving Day! We suddenly are preparing for the holidays. The pianos have been tuned, the decorations are on display, and poinsettias have been ordered! The color of our paraments on the altar have been changed to either purple or dark blue to indicate the observation of Advent. The Advent season began on November 30, so we have already observed the first Sunday of Advent. December 7 will be The Second Sunday in Advent. We will have pre-service singing and will light the Advent Candle of Peace. After the sermon we will celebrate Holy Communion together.

December 14 will be The Third Sunday in Advent, on which we will light the Advent Candle of Joy. There will be a Christmas Pageant following the sermon, so our worship time will be a bit longer than usual, and the order of worship will be a little different. I would like to thank Carmen Bross for writing and directing this presentation and also express my appreciation for everyone involved in it. I'm really looking forward to it!

The next Worship Committee Meeting will be held at 5:30 p.m. on Monday, December 15.

December 21 will be the Fourth Sunday in Advent when we will light the Advent Candle of Love. The choir will be singing during this worship service, and they will present the cantata, "He is Born!" after the sermon. This will be followed by our annual "March to the Manger".

The Christmas Eve Service will take place on Wednesday, December 24 at 9:00 P.M. The paraments will be changed to the celebratory color white, which will indicate the observation of Christmastide, the traditional twelve days of Christmas. We will be lighting the final Advent Candle, The Christ Candle, and will also celebrate with Holy Communion by candlelight. We often have the honor of hosting several friends and neighbors as they join us in worshipping God and His greatest gift to humankind. It is a special joy for me each year as I hear Pastor Doug deliver the Christmas message.

December 28 will be the first Sunday of Christmastide and the last Sunday of 2025. We plan on having a Christmas Sing-along that morning. Please select your favorite Christmas hymn from our red hymnal. We need both the title and hymn number. We ask that on December 21 you write your selection on a piece of paper that will be provided and place it in the offering plates located in the hall by the church office. On December 28 we will select song requests for our Sing-along. We will select 5 songs and will sing the first verse of each one.

March to the Manger

St. Matthew's annual March to the Manger has been scheduled for Sunday, December 21. Some of you may not be familiar with this annual event. Each December there is an opportunity to give a special individual Christmas gift to Jesus. On the designated date at the worship service there is a wooden manger set up at the front of the sanctuary. We usually have people representing Baby Jesus, Mary, Joseph, angels, and shepherds near the manger. Towards the end of our service, we either sing Christmas carols or listen to Christmas music as the congregation members walk forward, much like walking up to communion, and place their gifts of money in the manger, then quietly return to their seats. Most people choose to have their gift sealed in an envelope before placing it in the manger. These gifts to Jesus are collected and later presented at the next Ad Board Meeting where a mission is selected and to whom these particular funds are donated. The missions selected may be international, within the United States, or local. Last year our donation was given to support Faith Academy, the local Christian school. March to the Manger is St. Matthew's special way of honoring our Lord as we recognize Jesus who is our Divine Gift. 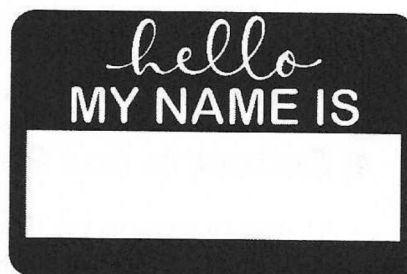

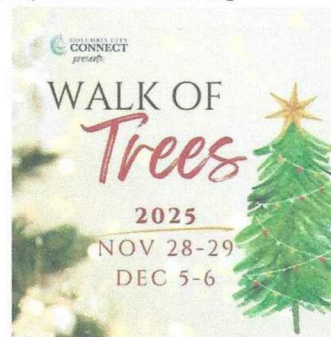
