**I know it is always a mistake to compare oneself to another. Jesus is our example and our standard of behavior. We must emulate him and grow in our faith. Having said that, as I remember Gene Rohrer and Jack Thompson, I feel lacking. Those fellas were giants in the faith and a blessing to St. Matthews Community Church.**

**There have been others. People I never met; they passed before I came to St. Matthews four and a half years ago. I have repeatedly heard the names of Mary Catherine Riddle and Dale Barkey spoken in almost a hushed reverence. They did their jobs, they honored God, and they left us a legacy.**

**I have been a member of several organizations where individuals, due to their exceptional performance, set a high bar, a standard of excellence. It is up to those who follow them to maintain and even raise that bar. In the case of the saints mentioned, we need not follow them; we need to follow whom they followed. We need to be open and responsive to the promptings of the Holy Spirit. We serve an awesome God.**

### *Worship Committee Notes*

Happy New Year 2026 to all my St. Matthew's Community Church family! I hope your Christmas and New Year celebrations have been filled with abundant blessings, love, comfort, and the joy that passes all understanding.

Plans for worship at St. Matthew's have been in process. At the moment, we are still in the liturgical calendar season of Christmastide. A big visual clue to this season is the continuation of the celebratory white paraments on the altar. January 4 is the second Sunday of Christmastide and the Sunday before Epiphany. Epiphany always falls on January 6. It marks the first day after the twelve days of Christmastide and commemorates the arrival of the Wisemen who came to worship Baby Jesus. It also begins the season of Epiphany. On January 4 we will have Pre-Service singing. Since January 4 is the first Sunday of 2026, during worship service we will have a recognition of the saints who attended St. Matthew's and who have died and gone on to glory in the past year. We will also celebrate Holy Communion during our morning worship.

The Baptism of Our Lord will be recognized on Sunday, January 11, and we will be remembering our own individual baptisms as well. This is a Sunday when we also celebrate with the presence of white paraments on the altar. This is also the first Sunday in the season of Epiphany. Epiphany's liturgical color is green, but since The Baptism of Our Lord is a more important and celebratory event, the white parament is used instead of the green. Atoned 4 will provide music for the service.

Our parament color will be changed to green on January 18, the second Sunday of Epiphany, indicating we continue in the season of Epiphany. The green paraments will remain on the altar and podiums until the season of Lent begins on Wednesday, February 18. There will be Pre-service singing January 18.

January 25 is the fourth and last Sunday of the month. The choir usually sings on the fourth Sunday of each month but takes the month of January off each year, so there will be no choir performance. However, choir practice will begin again on Tuesday evening, February 3 at 6:30.

I love the Advent and Christmas seasons we observe each year! Many thanks to everyone who has worked to make this time especially meaningful and beautiful for us all!
