

A Word from your Pastor

If we only knew...

On the first Sunday worship service in October, as I watched the congregation come forward to take communion, it occurred to me how much I love those people. My next thought was I will have to bury some of them and some of them will bury me. It is not really a morbid thought, just a logical certainty. I had just officiated at three funerals in three weeks. All were gentlemen that I knew well. The last was Gene Rohrer, a close personal friend and mentor.

During that time, my fifty-year-old niece died suddenly and unexpectedly. She was a single mom and left an eleven-year-old daughter. My seventy-one-year-old sister will be raising the child. When I spoke with my sister, she was experiencing the most gut wrenching, soul sucking grief any person can imagine. I tried to offer consolations, but I failed. I failed as a brother and as a pastor. Her pain was too great. The magnitude of the heartbreak was too recent and too raw. Nothing I had to offer that would assuage her grief.

In the midst of all this, we learned of the murder of Charlie Kirk, a husband and father of two small children, who spoke openly and unashamedly about his love of Jesus Christ. He was one who saw the value in young people and faced much opposition to bring his message of hope to college campuses.

All of these things left me emotionally drained and empty for a few days. Initially I attempted to handle it myself with human logic. That resulted in frustration and depression. Eventually I turned to that sustaining power of the divine and the healing started. I had to get it together or I would be of no help to those in need. Christ followers are not immune to horrific traumas. How do atheists deal with such loss?

The death of a loved one always brings about a sense of loss and separation. It hurts...a lot. And we all die; it is part of the life deal. Time helps heal and eventually there is a new normal. Is there a way to lessen the sting? What if we only knew?

The Bible tells us it is right to grieve, but don't grieve as those who have no hope. It also says that no eye has seen, and no ear

has heard, and no mind can conceive of what the Lord has planned for those who love Him. So, what if we could catch a brief glimpse of our departed loved one in their new life, feeling the love and peace that are not available to us? Would seeing the departed living in forever joy that cannot be measured; would that mitigate our sadness, not to mention every human's fear of death? As much as I would be grieving my personal loss, I could never ask someone I treasured to leave such a wonderful life. If we only knew....

November is going to be a busy month for St. Matthew's Community Church in regard to worship. We will be celebrating Veterans' Day, Christ the King Sunday, Thanksgiving, will begin our observation of the Advent Season, and will also be decorating the church. Let me fill you in on the plans for all of this in addition to our usual worship activities.

November 2 is the first Sunday in November. By the way, remember we will "fall back" this day, so please set your clocks accordingly. There will be Pre-Service Singing, and we will also celebrate Holy Communion together after the sermon.

Before our worship service on November 9, we will have our annual Veterans' Day Recognition. Pictures of veterans both in our congregation and our close relatives will be presented on the overhead screen along with some basic information about when, where, and in which branch of the Armed Forces they served. We deeply appreciate their service to our country and to us. Atoned 4 will be providing and leading music this particular morning.

On the morning of November 16, we will observe Christ the King Sunday which is the end of the church year. It is a day of adoration, celebration, and declaration that Christ is the King of all creation and the Lord of our lives. Our choir will provide special music.

We will have Pre-Service Singing prior to worship on Thanksgiving Sunday, November 23.

The Whitley County Community Thanksgiving Service is planned for Tuesday evening, November 25 at the Church of the Nazarene in Columbia City. It is scheduled to begin at 7:00 p.m. St. Matthew's choir will be one of the groups performing during this evening of community worship. There will also be a special focus on our county's Energy Assistance Program. We will have the opportunity to help our friends and neighbors in Whitley County who may be struggling financially to keep their homes warm this winter. I hope you will plan to attend, join in community worship, support the Energy Assistance Program, and the efforts of our choir.

Micci Becker and Pam Groff will be in charge of decorating St. Matthew's sanctuary and church for the holiday season. Decorating is scheduled for Saturday, November 29 at 10:00 a.m. If you are willing and available to help, please let Micci know. We would be very appreciative of some additional helping hands. We hope to see you there!

The last Sunday of the month will be November 30. It will be the First Sunday in Advent, and also the first Sunday of the Christian calendar year. During the Advent season we will take a few minutes during each Sunday morning service for a short Advent meditation and to light each Advent wreath candle. The final Advent wreath candle to be lit will be the Christ Candle that will be lit at our Christmas Eve Service.

Did you know our worship services are now streaming live? Many thanks to everyone involved in making that happen!

Each Christmas season we offer the opportunity for people to order a poinsettia used to decorate the church. These poinsettias are purchased in honor or in memory of loved ones, or in celebration of a special event. Micci Becker is awaiting information from the florist regarding availability and purchase price for these flowers and will make the ordering information known to us as soon as possible. These poinsettias may be taken home after Christmas.

There will be a Christmas program during our Sunday morning worship service on December 14.

Our choir will be presenting special Christmas music on Sunday, December 21, and we will also be having our annual March to the Manger offering.

St. Matthew's Christmas Eve Candlelight Service will be on Wednesday, December 24 at 9:00 p.m. We are fortunate to enjoy the company of many

neighbors and friends who join us in celebrating the birth of Christ Jesus at this special worship service.

As the holidays come upon us, I encourage each of you to set aside time for worship and prayer during the busy days ahead. These holidays are holy days for those who believe in Christ Jesus. March to the Manger

St. Matthew's annual March to the Manger has been scheduled for Sunday, December 21. Some of you may not be familiar with this annual event. Each December there is an opportunity to give a special individual Christmas gift to Jesus. On the designated date at the worship service there is a wooden manger set up at the front of the sanctuary. We usually have people representing Baby Jesus, Mary, Joseph, angels, and shepherds near the manger. Towards the end of our service, we either sing Christmas carols or listen to Christmas music as the congregation members walk forward, much like walking up to communion, and place their gifts of money in the manger, then quietly return to their seats. Most people choose to have their gift sealed in an envelope before placing it in the manger. These gifts to Jesus are collected and later presented at the next Ad Board Meeting where a mission is selected and to whom these particular funds are donated. The missions selected may be international, within the United States, or local. Last year our donation was given to support Faith Academy, the local Christian school. March to the Manger is St. Matthew's special way of honoring our Lord as we recognize Jesus who is our Divine Gift. A Special Message from One of our Veterans

Home Coming, Veteran's Day 1969

On November 8th, 1969, I left Vietnam and landed the next day at Fort Lewis Washington where after 6 hours I was officially out of active duty, a civilian again. The next morning, I arrived in Fort Wayne where my mother and dad were waiting. That night my mother made a large supper for me. She thought the army had not fed me enough since I had lost 40 lbs. Later that evening my dad and I shared a couple of beers. It was the first cold beer I had had since before going to Vietnam. The next day, Veterans Day, my dad took me to a VFW post where people were buying me more beer than I could drink. Later we stopped by the American Legion close to where I grew up and again it was pretty overwhelming from where I had just come from a few days ago. The following week I pretty much stayed inebriated until on a Saturday my 8-year-old brother snuck upstairs where I was sleeping to show me a butterfly. That was a mistake, a turning point for me. I had brought the war home. I quit drinking, got a job, and when I was done with my day job I would work in my dad's shop at night. He was a mechanic and always had plenty of work. One night I worked till 3 am, got up at 6 for my day job. It was working, I was too tired to think about Vietnam. Then I started thinking about girls. A friend I knew before I went overseas had a girlfriend Rita, and she worked at Marsh Supermarket in Huntington. So I took a chance she might still be working there. One evening I went over, and she was working at one of the registers. I picked up a pack of gum. The rest is history. Rita and I saw each other several times the next few weeks and then Rita asked me to go to church with her. This seemed pretty scary to

me, you see I had never been to church. The pocket testament you see here was given to my dad by a catholic nun when he was boarding ship during WW2. When I was leaving for Vietnam, my dad gave me the testament. He said the nun had told him to keep it close to your heart. It has a very heavy steel back, gold plated with a picture of Jesus. I wrapped it in plastic and tape and carried it every day. Back to going to church with Rita. When I gave the testament back to dad when I got home, I told him someday I was going to find out who this fellow Jesus was. So, I told Rita I would go to church with her. Maybe I would see Jesus there? One thing I found out was those church goers were pretty nice people. I often think that first year home from Vietnam was one of the best. Unlike many veterans who struggled so much. For me, I started going to church, found this fellow Jesus and got baptized. Rita and I got engaged and a few months later were married, fifty-five years now. We had two children, and I was staying very busy, Vietnam was far away. I never told Rita much about it, but in 1983 she was about to find out what happened there. I am out of space, but in a future newsletter I will share how Jesus came to me one night in an unusual way and perhaps saved my life.

God bless all the veterans reading this and have a great Veterans Day!
