#### **100% ENGAGEMENT**

#### **Bold Spiritual Growth Through Generosity**

At Corinth, we're praying for 100% engagement from everyone who calls this church home. We're inviting our entire church family to go on a journey of the heart—trusting that in God's eyes, generosity is never just a financial transaction; it's a step of faith and a mark of transformation.

Immeasurably More is about growing our trust in God, aligning our hearts with His mission, and discovering the joy that comes from surrendering everything to Him. As we each take a step of courageous obedience, we believe God will do far more than we could ever imagine—both in us and through us.







## OUR SECONDARY GOAL

### \$8 MILLION OVER TWO YEARS

#### More Ministry. More Impact.

We're trusting God to do immeasurably more through the ministry of Corinth Christian Church as we continue to invest in what He's already using to change lives week after week.

Over the next two years, \$4 million will go toward our ongoing ministry budget. This investment fuels everything from Sunday worship to kids and student ministries, groups, outreach, care, and the unseen systems that make life change happen every single week.

We believe the local church should be the greatest source of hope in the community where God has placed it. Walton County should be better because God's people–changed by Jesus–are living out the gospel in tangible ways.

## OUR SECONDARY GOAL

### \$8 MILLION OVER TWO YEARS

#### **More Space. More Stories.**

We've used every inch of our current auditorium to help people find hope in Jesus—and yet there are still so many more He wants to reach. Four services and tight transitions have pushed this space to its limits, and we believe it's time to take a bold step of faith toward what's next.

This \$4 million investment will serve as a significant down payment toward a \$14 million expansion—one that will create a new auditorium, expand our early childhood spaces, and allow our teens to use the current auditorium as their own. It will also include a new "backyard" green space, improved parking, and a DOT-approved acceleration/ deceleration lane to make access safer and smoother for everyone.\*

This project is about creating space for God to move—space for more people to bump into Jesus, discover hope, and take their next step in faith.

\* The total projected construction cost is \$14 million, \$4 million of which is expected to be funded through gifts from the Immeasurably More initiative, \$2 million of which is expected to be funded from current cash reserves, and the remainder of which is expected to be funded through financing efforts.







#### **ONE FUND EXPLANATION**

#### What Is a One Fund?

If you've ever been part of a church campaign, you may remember being asked to give a second gift "above and beyond" your regular offering—often to something called a Building Fund.

While that approach can work, it can also be confusing—especially for those new to generosity or still learning what consistent giving looks like. It can even make it difficult to celebrate the full impact of what God is doing through our church family.


#### That's why Immeasurably More is a One Fund initiative.

For the next two years, every dollar given to Corinth Christian Church will go toward one unified mission. There won't be separate "general" or "building" funds—just one fund supporting everything God is doing in us and through us.

#### This One Fund will fuel everything God is doing through Corinth:

- Ongoing Ministry: From kids and students to outreach, care, and worship
- Future Expansion: Building a new auditorium, creating new spaces for ministry, and making room for more people to find hope in Jesus

Instead of separating "normal giving" from "campaign giving," Immeasurably More invites us to see all generosity as part of one mission—to trust God together for more than we could ever imagine.

2. Solomon says, "Honor the Lord with your wealth" What's the difference between honoring God with our resources and just obeying a financial rule? How does that shift your view of giving?
3. "God multiplies what we surrender." How have you seen that in what others have invested in you? How have you seen it in what you've surrendered?
4. Firstfruits, not leftovers. Why do you think God asks for the first and best rather than the rest? What does giving first reveal about your priorities or trust? When has there been a time that you gave first even when it seemed to be impossible?

3. Adam said, "When the priests obeyed, the miracle didn't just bless them — it blessed everyone behind them." Tell about some obedience that has paved the way for your blessing. What do you think will be happening 25 years from now at Corinth?
4. What is a "personal Jordan River" for you? Something that naturally stands in the way of living out the generous faith you want to? How can we pray for each other to step ou in faith and boldness?

#### **Discussion Questions:**

- 1. What jumped out to you from the video with the Boivin Family? The impact of one simple invite can change the direction of someone's entire future for God's glory! Who might be one person you need to invite to experience immeasurably more?
- 2. What do you think most people mean when they say they want to make an "impact"? How is the biblical picture of impact (Acts 4:32–35) different from how culture defines it?
- 3. The message contrasted the man in Luke 12 (who built bigger barns) with Barnabas (who built the Kingdom). What helps anchor your giving, serving, and obedience in eternity rather than comfort? How might living that way change the kind of "impact" you're remembered for?

#### **WEEK 4: SMALL GROUP DISCUSSION**

READ: Ephesians 3:14-21; Philippians 4:14-19

When you think about people who "planted shade trees" in your life or faith journey, who comes to mind — and how has their generosity impacted you?
Paul trusted that "God will meet all your needs according to His riches." What does it loo like to believe that promise — especially when giving feels risky or costly? Tell a story about you or someone that has demonstrated this really well.
Paul said generosity "shares in my troubles." How does giving — of time, money, or encouragement — make you feel connected to what God is doing in someone else's life How have you felt supported when someone else shared in your troubles?
We're all "sitting in the shade" of someone else's sacrifice. What kind of shade tree do you want to plant for the next generation?
