- Lift Others
- Expand Reach
- Increase Exposure

Raising Standards

We're not staying where we are; we're going higher.



Lifting Others Great leaders elevate those around them.

Expanding Reach To elevate is to extend beyond our current impact.

1. Limited Mindset

- Small Thinking
- Fearful of change
- Normalized Average
- Victim Mindset



2. Unresolved Issues

- Emotional wounds, disappointments and trauma can anchor people to pass seasons.
- Guilt, shame and unforgiveness can disqualify you from rising.
- •Healing and elevation work hand in hand.

3. Environments

Being surrounded by people who don't believe, dream or grow can limit your elevation

4. Resisting the Process God elevates through pruning, refining and stretching.

The Woman at the Well

The woman at the well is one of the most powerful biblical accounts of transformation, revelation and elevation.



Jesus

- > Crosses boundaries
- > Confronts
- Lifts the woman's life to a new level



Elevation Ingredients:

- 1. Candidate
- 2. Conversation
- 3. Confront



Elevation

Is not accidental, or coincidental its intentional!



1. Candidate

A person that is suitable for a position.

The Woman She's a Samaritan

- (Outsider to the Jews)
- >She's a Woman
- >(Men didn't engage women alone in culture)
- Shame
- > (she comes to the well at noon to avoid others).



2. Conversation

Is a form of communication that involves both listening and speaking, allowing for mutual exchange.

The Conversation

The conversation is the gateway to the woman's transformation and elevation.



Shifting Conversation

- ✓ Physical water to spiritual water
- ✓ She is thinking temporal. He is thinking eternal
- ✓ Jesus shifted her desire



3. Confronting Face up and deal with a problem or a situation.



Jesus said to her, "Go, call your husband, and come here."



The woman answered and said, "I have no husband." Jesus said to her, "You have well said, I have no husband;



For you have had five husbands, and the one who you now have is not your husband; in that you spoke truly."



Confronts Her:

- Jesus confronts her past
- Jesus confronts her present
- Jesus confronts her pain
- Elevation requires all the above
